

WHILE the Spaniards have been dilly-dallying and refusing to sign contracts, prices have advanced to cut down the amount of goods they can buy for their money. If they had closed the deal when the first \$5 million for cotton was made available, they could have had 23,000 bales. At today's prices, they will get about 18,000.

Not one application for U. S. technical assistance has been made by the Spaniards. The apparent reason is that they are unwilling to accept American supervision such as all the Marshall Plan countries have agreed to take and have profited by.




