First Baptist Bible School Has Good Start

The first morning of the VBS got off to a good start with 135 present and a fine group of boys and girls. Workers, helpers, and teachers were in their places and the program moved smoothly. There are five departments with complete facilities presenting a schedule of Bible study, missions, Bible stories, memory work, hand craft, refreshments, and character stories. The superintendents are: Intermediates, Miss June Ann Morton, Juniors, Mrs. Earle Pittman, Primary, Mrs. A. Britt; Beginner, Mrs. O. C. Warden; and Nursery, Mrs. V. A. Galloway.

At 8:30 each morning the children and faculty march into the main auditorium and there have a joint worship service. Pledges and salutes to the Christian, and American flags and to the Holy Bible. Scripture repeated in unison, song service and a character story fitting for the occasion.

At 9:05 each department meets for their programs until 11:30. During this time various types of study, planning, work, and recreation follows. Refreshments are served at the mid-session. Many churches in the area are not having schools and these children, many of them have enrolled and all are welcome whose church is not participating in a VBS. This will be a two week school with a commencement program on Friday night, June 12th. The buildings are air conditioned, and germicidal lamps are used in three departments. Parents are invited to visit the VBS that has reached the standard for the past three years.

feet from the north and 612 feet from the east lines of the southeast line of Section 50, Block 3, H&TC Survey. Permit calls for 3,600 feet.

The No. 1 Bacon was drilled some two years ago and completed in the Ellenberger lime at about 3,750 feet. It still produces a small amount of oil. The new project would not test the Ellenberger.

Two miles southwest of Cisco, Connally-Jackson, Abilene, were busy in deepening their No. 1

Walker Estate. The wildcat test was drilled to 3,900 feet several months ago and abandoned after failing to find Lake sand oil. The company moved in last week to deepen the hole to 4,100 feet. The test is a mile southwest of production.

Two miles southeast of Cisco, the McClung and West No. 1 E. N. Strickland ran pipe and cemented Friday afternoon after coring five feet of oil sand from 1,165 to 1,170 feet. Plans call for completion efforts from open hole on top of the shallow sand.
