Stephenville Blue Jays Are Defending Champions Of Legion's Six-Team League

The Ranger Eagles, local youth nine and American Legion diamond crew managed by J. A. Estes, open their official 1953 AL league play next Tuesday night on home soil when they meet Breckenridge in their opener.

The American Legion league is composed of six teams — Cisco, Breckenridge, Stephenville, Mineral Wells, Goldthwaite and Ranger.

The six nines will play a double round of contests on a home-and-home basis, and the 1953 district flag will go to the team with the top victory record. In event of a tie, there'll be a play-off game to determine the district's entry into the state American Legion tournament.

The Stephenville Blue Jays, '52 titlists, are defending champions. The Jays went through their district campaign last year undefeated in the state Legion diamond play-offs, they knocked off Waco in the bi-district heats, but in the next bracket they were eliminated by Longview, runner-up to Austin which won the 1952 state championship. The Austin youth nine, after sacking the Texas flag, went on to win runner-up honors in the national American Legion boys' baseball playoff.

In their second conference battle — on Friday night, June 12 — the Eagles play Goldthwaite at Goldthwaite.

WITH THE KOREAN BASE SECTION — Pvt. Orbery Walker, whose wife, Anna, lives in Odenton, Md., was recently assigned to the 89th Ordnance Company in Korea.

His unit is part of the Korean Base Section which furnishes supplies, transportation, communications and services to UN fighting forces. The base section includes most of the major military installations in the southern portion of the Korean peninsula.

Formerly, the Red Cross could send death messages to servicemen via these rapid facilities only if leave for the serviceman, which the family had requested, was denied.

Private Walker, a former employee of the Smith Drilling Co. of Evans, Texas, entered the Army 28 months ago and arrived in Korea on March 14.

His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Ira Walker, live on Route 2, Carbon, Texas.

The American Red Cross has been authorized by the Department of the Army and Air Force, to relay through their rapid communications, death messages involving immediate families of overseas servicemen of these two branches, effective June 1, Rev. Otto Marshall, Home Service Chairman, Eastland County Chapter, announced today.

U. N. Losses In Korea War Total 400,000

A truce in Korea would halt hostilities that in nearly three years have cost the United Nations 406,542 casualties and the Communists an estimated 1,597,000.

Latest official figures as of the end of May placed American losses at 24,119 dead, 190,645 wounded, and 11,345 missing and captured for a total of 136,129.
