## Times Survey Reveals—

### Rangerites Favor RJC Tax Increase

Many Ranger citizens appear to favor the proposed increase in the tax for Ranger Junior College which will be voted on next Tuesday, June 23, according to results of a current poll of opinion being conducted by The Ranger Daily Times.

Dr. P. M. Kuykendall, prominent physician and civic leader, said that he favors voting the 30-cent tax increase because "it's absolutely essential to the welfare of the college."

Dr. W. P. Watkins, president of the City Board of Education, says he favors the tax increase, because "it's necessary for the survival of the college."

Another prominent citizen, Price Crawley, civic and religious leader and former mayor, also listed among scores of Rangerites who heartily endorse the proposal which will be voted on at City Hall next Tuesday.

Comments of other citizens regarding this important issue in the coming June 23 election will appear in The Times tomorrow.

TRADITION HAS LOST OUT IN "MOTOR CITY" where the "Black Maria" is now surging red and red fireplugs are turning yellow.

The first to go was black paint for police department wagons. Department officials explained the wagons now are used more ambulances than to haul offenders off to jail.

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### She's Trapper's Wife and Bored With Fine Furs

SOUTHBURG, Conn. — Nate Evarts heaps mink at his wife's feet. He is a part-time trapper.

But though she can take her pick, Mrs. Evarts prefers her 15-year-old coat made of less expensive fur. She bought it in New York.

"I don't care too much for mink, or any fur for that matter," Mrs. Evarts says, "I guess I see to much of it."

Each winter for the past 40 years, Evarts has been making the rounds of traps he sets within a 40-mile radius of his farm. If it's not mink, it's muskrat, raccoon or otter.

He recently came home with a white mink, the first he's ever caught. All of the furs he gets are sold to a company. The money he gets fills in the winter gap when farming doesn't pay off.

**Two-footed Thieves**  
Evarts is 69 and has been trapping since he was nine.

His biggest trouble along the trapping line comes from animals that think they're smarter than any human. They steal the bait, but manage to keep clear of the trap's steel jaws.

"I don't mind if an animal has been smarter than I am," Evarts says. "But I do get dogged and annoyed when that 'animal' happens to be two-footed. Those thieves aren't looking for bait. They want the mink."

Evarts said he's still about nine years old when it comes to trapping.

"I'll bet there are a lot of big city executives who'd like to be roaming the woods like I do. Can't grow old that way," he added.

### 'Cotton Picker' Is Big Success; Simple Design

Development of a low cost cotton harvester designed to bring mechanical harvesting within reach of thousands of cotton growers who now pick by hand is announced by Dearborn Motors, Birmingham, Michigan.

Simple in design and operation, the new Dearborn Cotton Harvester uses rotating nylon brushes to remove the cotton and the cotton burr from the stalk. The cotton and burr are then drawn to a bypass fan and delivered either to a trailing wagon or into a special Dearborn Cotton Basket mounted on the tractor.

The machine harvests up to 1-1.4 acres per hour, or, in average yields, approximately one bale of cotton every 75 minutes.

Extensive field tests have shown the new harvester can save cotton growers from \$25 to \$45 per bale over hand picking costs, depending on field conditions. At the current price of cotton, this means the harvester can pay for itself in harvesting 27 to 48 bales.

"We believe that the Dearborn Cotton Harvester will provide cotton growers with the long sought answer to problems of high cost hand picking and the increasing scarcity of labor," said G. D. Andrews, Dearborn Motors' Vice-President in Charge of Sales.

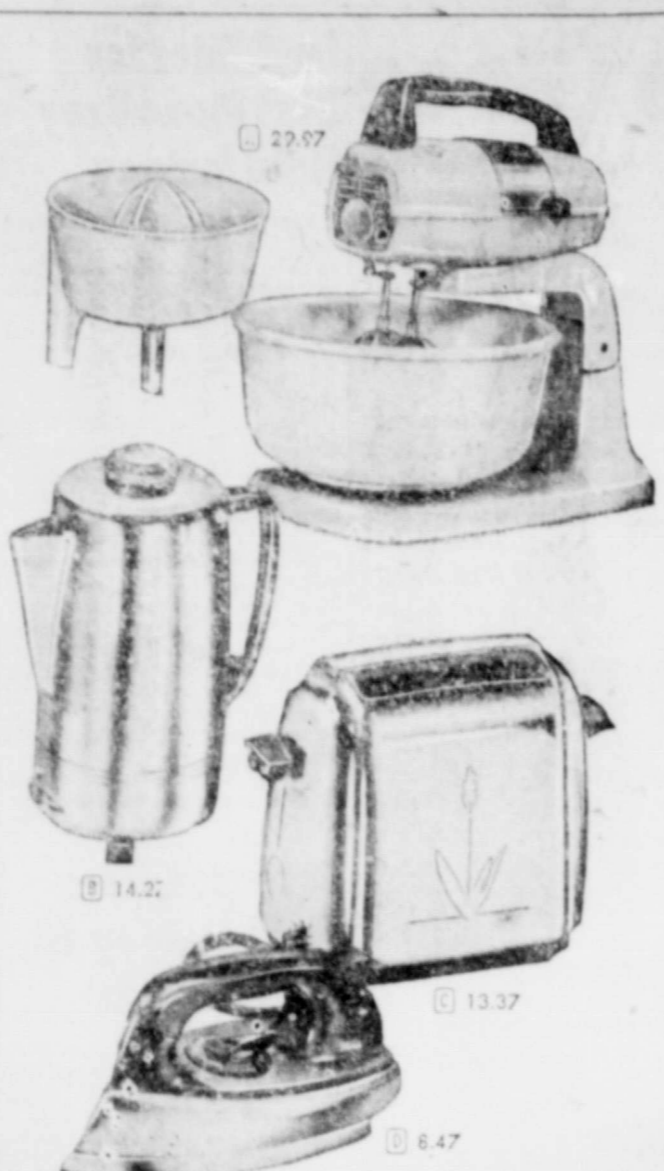
Just as grain fields are combined when the entire field is ripe, and hay is harvested when the entire crop is at its peak, the Dearborn Cotton Harvester is used only when all bolls have opened. In areas where labor is plentiful, growers may prefer to make the first picking by hand, then follow up with the cotton harvester after all bolls have opened.

## YOUR MONEY AND MINE MUST BE GUARDED IF BUDGET IS BALANCED WITHOUT NEW TAX

When Uncle Sam's money—and therefore, yours and mine—almost anything goes. That concept of government spending, rapidly fading now under a growing nationwide clamor for economy, is what accounted for such things as: A hospital that spent Government funds at the rate of \$90,000, a bed in a construction program. A Korean railroad that charged the United States \$1,000,000 a day for hauling Army supplies. An ordinance system broken up into 95 districts, all of which operate as a law to themselves and bid against each other on the open market. These shocking examples of extravagance were disclosed for the first time recently by Chairman John W. Taber (R-N.Y.) of the House Appropriations Committee. He cited them in a talk to the Government Economy Committee of the Chamber of Commerce of the United States as the kind of tangible proof being turned up by his investigators to show that the federal budget can be cut and the way paved for a reduction in personal income taxes. Taber estimated savings of \$7 to \$8 billion can be made in the \$78.6 billion budget of the last administration while an additional \$2 to \$3 billion can be picked up in refunds through liquidation of government loan agencies such as the Reconstruction Finance Corporation. The chairman foresaw a balanced budget in the fiscal year beginning July 1. He said this would clear the way for enactment of the Reed Bill which would eliminate the 11 percent Korean increases in personal income tax rates as of June 30.

## Gun Away.

Hyman tells about vermin shooting which is permitted to varying degrees in most counties and emphasizes the need for cracking down as follows: "One of the greatest game destroying predators, the wild house cat, can be found in a part of Texas, usually in large numbers.

"For many reasons, the wild house cat has become a real threat to our game birds. Young quail, being much easier to catch than mice and rats, have made the call of the wild sound, like sweet music to the thousand thousands of farm cats which have descended the barns for the meadows.

"Another reason cats have become so numerous in the field is that many city dwellers, when they find Tabby with a litter of kittens, take the unwanted new additions to the household out to the country and turn them loose in some farmer's field to fend for themselves.

"It is they do very well! The farmer could tell you, in a few short and possibly unprintable words, the effect they have on quail population and frequently his young chicks."

Hyman points out that Texans pursuing vermin hunting had better check the local game warden to determine which predators are most prevalent in different areas.

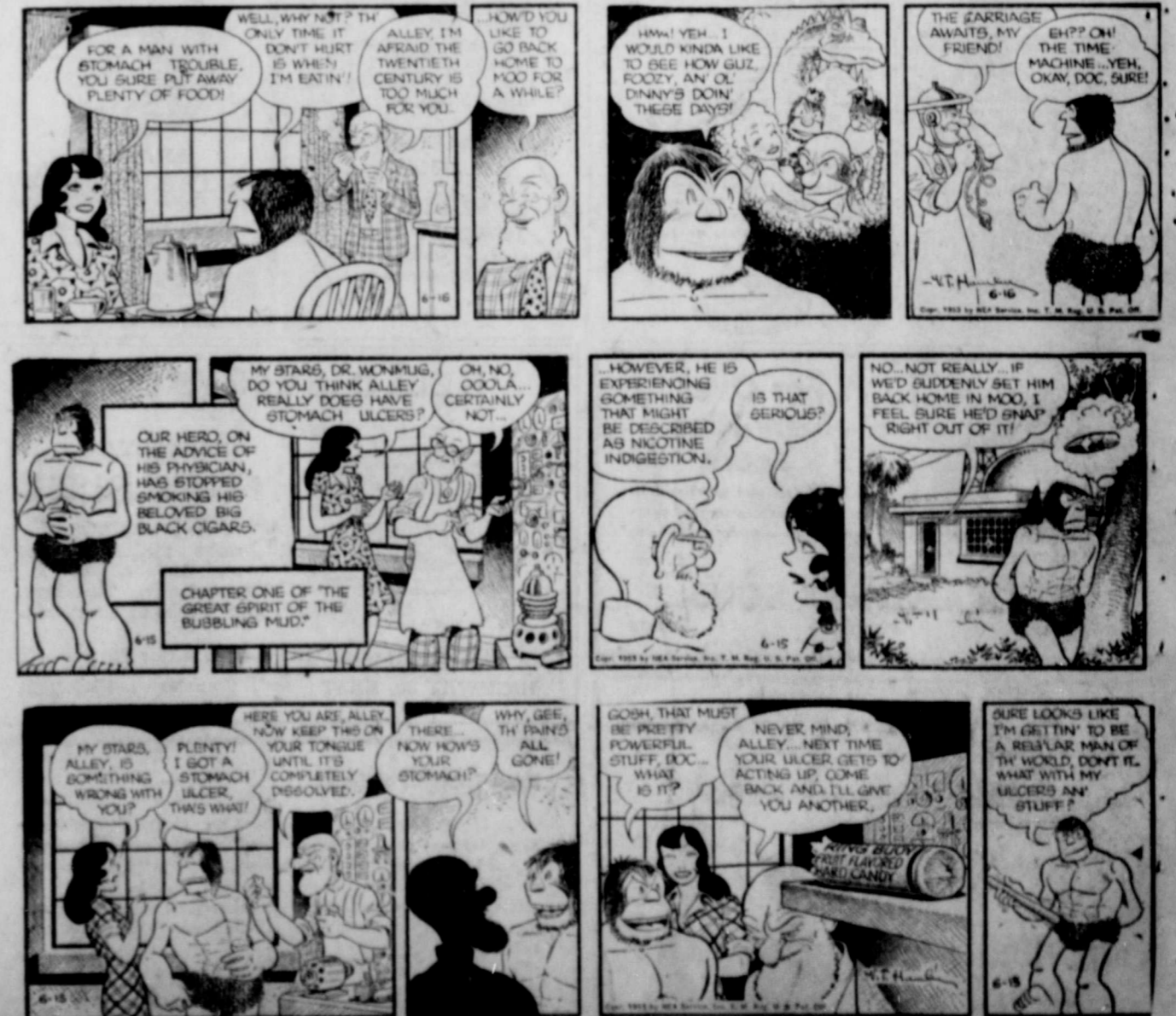

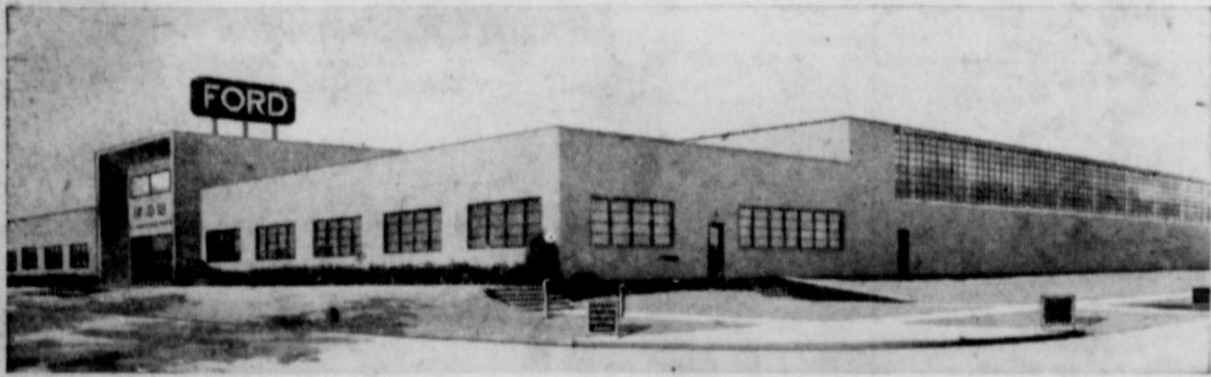

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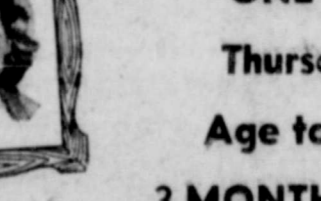
