The slightly dazed composer—a red and music—is Artie Glenn, 23-year-old Convoir upholsterer.



"But pretty soon I was humming the melody of 'Crying in the Chapel'... then the words came to me. It was an inspirational thing."
Glenn wrote down the words and music, and tossed the song into a dresser drawer. It stayed there two years.

Then a scout for a New York publisher came to Fort Worth, looking for new folk songs. Jerry Crockett, former KCUL disc jockey, told him he knew a fellow at Convoir who wrote songs—Artie Glenn.

Glenn gave the song scout "Crying in the Chapel" and three other tunes. The scout's publishing firm sent all four back as unsuitable.

Later, the song scout told Jack Comer at Knoxville, Tenn., about "Crying in the Chapel." Comer was starting a new record company, Valley Records. He contacted Glenn in Fort Worth.

Result: Valley Records brought out "Crying in the Chapel," as sung by Darryl Glenn, the composer's 17-year-old son. The record has since sold 200,000 copies (very big for any disc), and has put Valley Records on the map.

All this in three months.
Says humble Artie Glenn: "I get letters from all over the country, from people who tell me 'Crying in the Chapel' changed the course of their lives... turned despair into new hope. It's a wonderful thing."

Enterprising Thief Gets, Lose Ax
DETROIT — Zera Munerlyn thought he saw opportunity beck-

oning him when he opened an open manhole.
He borrowed an ax from a junkyard and jammed it into the manhole where he hooked off a 15-foot length of heavy cable.

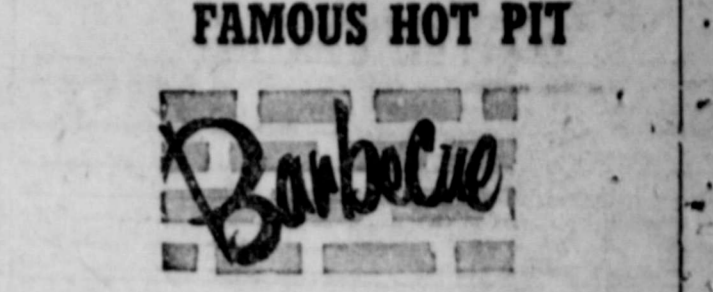

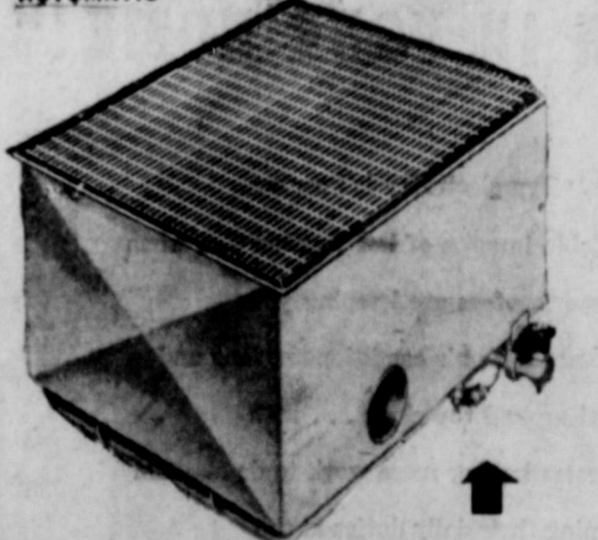
