## City Council Meets in Special Session, Take Up Urgent Matters

The Baird City Council met in special session at 7 p.m., Tuesday, April 15, 1980. After the call to order the mayor suggested that the meeting be moved to the Community Center due to the large crowd of approximately fifty people.

After the meeting reconvened, Mrs. Kenneth McPherson presented a grievance to the council alleging indignant treatment by the City Secretary. No action was taken by the council.

Robert Martin was elected Mayor pro-tem for the term of one year.

The March bills were presented to be approved for payment. Due to the current financial status the council approved transfer of \$10,000 from the tax fund to the general fund and payment of \$26,000 in bills to be selected by the mayor and city Secretary. The current financial status as briefed to the council indicated \$16,213 in the bank with \$7,000 additional income anticipated. The bills presented totaled \$45,862 and an additional \$5,000 payroll expense. The mayor stated the city was in dire financial straights.

Robert Martin presented a motion to

change the permanent meeting time of the council to the 2nd and 4th Monday at 7 p.m. The motion was unanimously approved.

The council passed a resolution designating Spring Cleanup Days from April 21 thru April 30, 1980.

The council voted to allow the mayor to solicit proposals for purchase of the power plant and electric distribution system.

A decision was held regarding correction of power line discrepancies to clear up a dispute with Continental Telephone Company. The City estimated the total cost for the work would be twenty to twenty five thousand dollars and the work could be deferred until 1981. They agreed to meet with the City attorney to finalize a pole contact agreement.

At the request of the City Secretary, A. E. Dyer, Jr., the council conducted a straw poll on his requested termination of employment. The council voted 4 to 1 in favor of termination. Formal action by the council will be considered at the next regular meeting of the council.

## Commissioners Offered Hospital Plans by Dallas Group

Representatives of a hospital management firm in Dallas met Monday with the Callahan County Commissioners to discuss managing the county hospital.

Dr. Laurence Gayao presently leases the Callahan General Hospital and has the option to extend his lease another five years beginning May 15. Gayao says he will probably continue to lease the hospital. He plans to submit a letter to the County Commissioners stating that he wants to continue operating the hospital another five years.

Originally, the terms of the lease were that Gayao would pay the county \$500 a month. However, county commissioners later agreed to drop the \$500 a month payment and no payments were ever paid to the county.

Representatives of the American Medical Management Corporation of Dallas told commissioners Monday morning that under their management, the hospital would produce revenue for the county.

Doug Kesner, vice president of the corporation said the county would have two alternatives if it signed an agreement. The county could lease the hospital to AMMC for a certain amount each month. The corporation would then be allowed to keep all profits. Or, the county

could sign a management contract with the corporation in which the county would pay AMMC a management fee and the county would keep the profits produced by the hospital.

Kesnes said if they take over management of the hospital, a new administrator would be brought in and many improvements made to the hospital.

Kesnes also said they would try to improve the hospital so the physicians would use it rather than take their patients into Abilene.

The first improvement would be the addition of a respiratory therapy department.

Kesner also thinks they can pay more money to the county and have a higher grade of service. He pointed out that the doctors and nurses currently working at the hospital would be retained, but that the corporation could help recruit new ones.

Kesner added, after his presentation to the commissioners, that if they took over the management of the hospital, they would definitely try to buy the Golden Holiday Care Center in Baird. He said they had been contacted by the owner, Executive Medical Managers of Indiana, about buying the nursing home.

## Baird Papers Donated to Southwest Collection at Tech

It's a late-Twenties setting in oil-producing Callahan County. Mrs. Everett Hughes, wife of the sheriff, hears a commotion upstairs in the Callahan County jail. She grabs a gun and hurries upstairs to find that four prisoners have overpowered Deputy Sheriff W. A. Peterson.

"With gun in hand," Mrs. Hughes informs the prisoners she will fire on them unless they return to their cells. There is no further argument. Mrs. Hughes prevents a jailbreak without major incident.

That account, printed in the August 12, 1927, edition of the "Baird Star", is among more than 92 years of Callahan County history which will be preserved for future generations thanks to Callahan County Publisher Clifton Burfield and the facilities of the Southwest Collection at Texas Tech University in Lubbock.

Burfield donated old copies of Callahan County newspapers to the Southwest Collection in December. University employees have inventoried the papers and are now microfilming them.

The Southwest Collection is a regional archival repository dedicated to preserving the rich heritage of West Texas and the American Southwest. Over the last several years, Tech archivists have developed a formal program for microfilming old newspapers from small towns west of Ft. Worth and north of San Antonio.

The old newsprint, which contains information of value to historians and casual researchers alike, turns brittle with time and decays. Through microfilming, the newspaper will live after the newsprint is gone.

The microfilmed Baird newspapers will join the more than 400 on file at the South-

west Collection, which also houses photographs, periodicals, business and personal papers from across West Texas.

The earliest Baird paper donated to Texas Tech dates back to December 1887 when W.E. Gilliland began publishing the "Baird Weekly Star." Gilliland, who sported a large moustache and "the ability to differ in opinion without being disagreeable," purchased the older "Callahan County Clarendon" in November 1887 from Howard Allen.

Those early editions show Baird to be a bustling community with active business establishments and a host of entertainments available to its new citizenry.

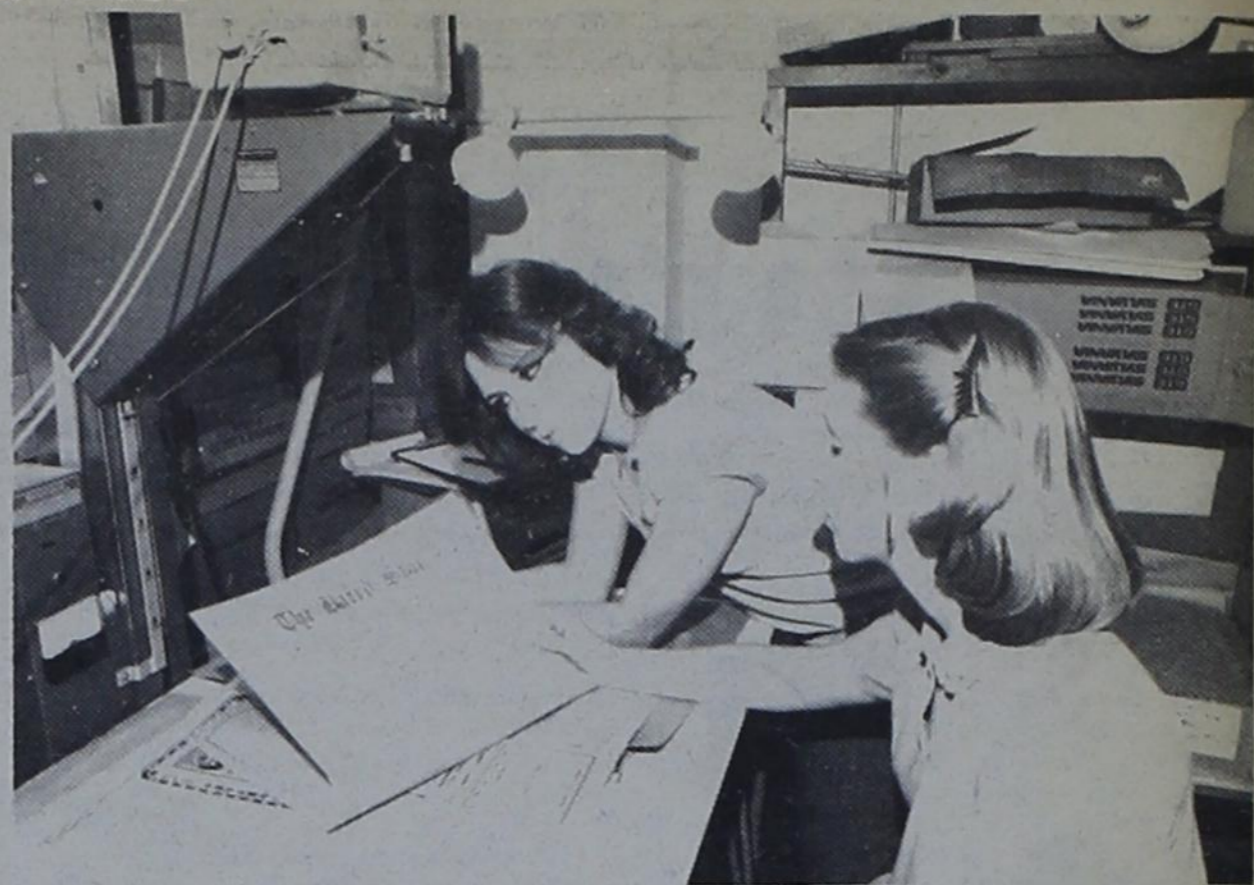
The December 22, 1887, edition of the "Star" shows rainfall patterns over the previous six years including the disastrous drought in 1885-86. That second year, Baird received nine inches of rain.

The return of rain brought more than prosperity, however. Citizens were invited to the Sigal Building where Justin Cook recently opened his saloon, stocked with '81 whiskey, "best in the world or for medicinal purposes."

Four decades later, the paper invited the citizenry to a celebration in honor of the paving of Market Street, which completed the last segment of paved roads between Abilene and Dallas.

In 1929 as the Great Depression eased into the county, the "Star" reported that Callahan County ranked fourth in Texas in the number of oil-producing wells after Wichita, Archer and Brown Counties.

Other papers which Burfield donated to the Southwest Collection include editions of the "Clyde News", the "Clyde Enterprise" and the "Mitchell County News."



### Faulkenberry Rites Held Wednesday

William Walter Faulkenberry, 94, of Clyde died at 10:40 p.m. Monday at Leisure Lodge. Graveside services were at 2 p.m. Wednesday in Bee Branch Cemetery north of Caddo.

The Rev. R.D. Williams of Rising Star, officiated.

Born Aug. 25, 1885, in Georgia, he moved to Texas in 1900 and settled in Johnson County. He moved to Fisher County in 1914. He worked for the Kempto and Santa Fe railroads at McCaulley. He retired in 1939

and was caretaker for Boy Scout Camp Tonkawa. He later worked for Taylor County as maintenance supervisor of the county courthouse. He moved to Rising Star in 1951. He married Addie Barnes Feb. 7, 1909, in Cleburne. He was a 50-year member of Masonic Lodge in Rising Star.

His wife preceded him in death, May 3, 1975.

Survivors include one daughter, Mrs. L.T. Harris of Clyde; three grandchildren; seven great-grandchildren and five great-great-grandchildren.

His parents, five brothers and two sisters preceded him in death.

## Six Baird Track Girls Continue to Regional

Charlotte Perryman contributed 28 individual points to spark the Baird Bearette track team to one of their strongest showings since the early 1970's.

With Perryman leading the way, the Bearettes qualified a total of six girls to next week's regional meet at Odessa. Perryman's accomplishments read like the Guinness Book of Records: 1st in the shot put (32' 9 1/2"), 1st in the 100 meter hurdles, (15.7 sec.) and 3rd in the discus, (90' 5").

Teresa Rhynes turned in a brilliant performance in the discus. Going into the meet Rhynes was ranked in 4th place. But, with what is becoming the trademark desire, she placed 2nd with a career best throw of 93' to advance to regional.

For the first time since 1972, Baird also qualified its 800 meter relay team. The

relay team members are, Perryman, Marty Brumbaugh, Carla Rodriguez and Jamie Pate. Although not running their best time of the season, their 1,54 was good enough for second place.

One of the highlights of the meet was the performance of freshman hurdler, Lisa Perryman. Going into the meet, Perryman's best time in the 100 meter hurdles was 19.9 seconds. Taking a full 2 seconds off her best time she qualified for the finals, and placed 5th overall with a very good 17.9.

Other good performances were turned in by Rodriguez with a 4th place finish in the 200 meter dash and a 6th place finish in the 100 meter dash. Pate placed 4th in the 800 meter run despite running into a 30 mph wind with a time of 2.44.

**Baird Judging Team Places 5th Taxpayers May Request Extension**

The Baird FFA Livestock Judging team competed in Area competition in Stephenville Saturday. The team, consisting of Barry Williams, Davy Vestal and Devin Welch, placed 5th out of about 80 teams.

They will be advancing to State competition at Texas A&M University on April 26. The area contest was made more difficult due to the foul weather, but we are hoping for better conditions at State.

Taxpayers who need more time to complete their Federal income tax returns may request an automatic 2-month extension of time to file by filing a Form 4868 with the Internal Revenue Service.

Taxpayers who receive the extension must use the Form 1040 and must compute their own tax. The IRS said that the extension applies only to the time for filing the return and not to payment of the tax. Any tax due must be paid at

the time the Form 4868 is filed. Later, when the actual return is filed, the amount of tax previously paid with the Form 4868 should be entered on the appropriate line of Form 1040. If the amount of tax paid

with the Form 4868 does not cover the taxpayer's total liability, the taxpayer is required to pay interest on the remaining tax due. In addition, if the unpaid tax is over 10 percent of the total tax bill, the law provides for levy of additional penalties on the taxpayer, the IRS said.

## Free Immunization Clinic at Baird Jr. High May 7

K,indergarten pre-registration will be held May 7, from 8 a.m. to 12 noon, in the Jr. High library.

There will be a free immunization clinic from 9 a.m. until 12 noon on May 7, also.

Parents need to bring their children's birth certificates and immunization records.

Immunization requirements for students entering school for the first time are as follows:

**Polio-** At least three doses of oral polio vaccine are required, provided at least one dose has been received on or after the fourth birthday.

**Tetanus-Diphtheria-** At least three

doses of DPT and/or TD vaccines are required, provided at least one dose has been received on or after the fourth birthday.

**Measles-** Measles vaccine is required on or after the first birthday. A history of measles illness may be accepted in lieu of vaccine if it has been validated in writing by a physician.

**Mumps-** Mumps vaccine is required. A history of mumps illness will be accepted in lieu of mumps vaccine if it has been validated in writing by a physician.

**Rubella-** One dose of rubella vaccine is required.

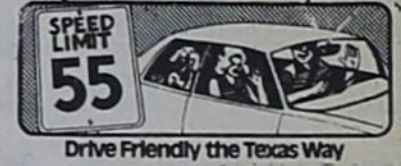

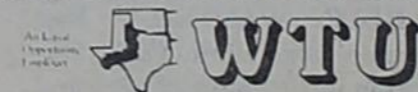
