Safety Stressed For Coming Winter Driving

"Rain, sleet, snow—SLOW!!!"

In these words Mr. R. B. Roasper of Houston, Chief Safety Engineer, Humble Oil & Refining Co. and President, Texas Safety Association, Inc., today warned drivers that winter weather calls for a slow down. Mr. Roasper spoke on behalf of the winter driving hazards program which is being sponsored this month by the Texas Safety Association, The Texas Department of Public Safety, and the National Safety Council.

"Often drivers are not aware of the degree to which winter weather complicates the traffic picture, so they do not make the necessary adjustments in their driving habits," Mr. Roasper said. "This greatly complicates the traffic picture."

Mr. Roasper believes that if drivers would learn how winter driving differs from other driving and would then take the precautions necessary to guard against the special hazards it presents, the winter traffic accident toll could be cut a great deal.

1. Accept your responsibility to do all in your power to drive without accident. Don't blame the weatherman for an accident. Be prepared to meet the situation.

2. Get the "feel" of the road. Try brakes occasionally while driving slowly and away from traffic. Find out just how slippery the road is and adjust your speed to road and weather conditions. Remember you can't stop on an icy dime.

3. Keep the windshield clear of snow and ice, fog and frost. Be sure headlights, windshield wiper blades and defrosters are in top condition. You have to see danger to avoid it.

4. Use tire chains and good tires. Don't rely on worn-smooth tires. Use tire chains on snow and ice. They cut stopping distances in half, give four to seven times more starting and climbing traction ability. But even with the help of chains, slower than normal speeds are a "must" on snow and ice.

5. Pump your brakes to slow down or stop. Jamming them on can lock the wheels and throw you into a dangerous skid. A little sliding can carry you a long way.

6. Follow at a safe distance. Keep well back of the vehicle ahead — give yourself room to stop. Remember, without tire chains, it takes 3 to 12 times as far to stop on snow and ice as on dry concrete.
