Austin. — A hearing on proposed court redistricting for the High Plains is set for Wednesday April 15, at 7:30 p. m. in a House judiciary subcommittee.

Rep. Hulon Brown of Midland subcommittee chairman said creation of these districts proposed by the State Bar Association would be discussed.

The 6th district court for Hale Bailey, Castro, Lamb and Farmer Counties, the 11th district court for Briscoe, Crosby, Dickens, Floyd, Motley and Swisher Counties.

That is the makeup of courts included in HB 565 by Rep. Joe Kilgore, of McAllen, who embodies the Bar Assn's recommendations. Many of the courts are unchanged, but a number are revised in accordance with population and court business.

After study in Europe and a Paris debut she was immediately engaged for concerts throughout the continent and the British Isles. She has appeared as soloist with many of America's leading symphony orchestras and has played in every state in the union. Her concert tours have carried her to Cuba, Mexico, Central and South America and Hawaii, and since the end of the war she has resumed her annual summer tours of Europe. She has given seven invitation concerts in the White House.

The Floydada Community Concert Association is an experiment in bringing the world's great music to this plains-cap rock area. It is the only organization of its kind between Plainview and Vernon and is supported by the combined efforts of members living in Lockney.
