



Deep Water Found In Hereford Area

complete, new irrigation water table located below the "Red Beds", was announced here this week with completion of a 1,077. foot deep test well on the Phillip Miller place, 18 miles north and six miles west of Hereford.

The discovery not only created a new potential irrigation area of approximately 40 sections in the vicinity of the test but, at the same time, established a new irrigation table which definitely exists below the shallow-water table now being used in the territory surrounding Hereford. Possibility of such a table has long been a point of controversy and was recently indicated in deep wells on the Walter Russell and Curtis Traweek places east of Hereford.

The current test was made outside of the irrigation belt. however, findings showed every indication that irrigation will be practical in the new area.

The deep test well was drilled by a group of 10 men, all owning land and interested in the possibilities of irrigation. The group at the rate of approximately 25 cents per acre and contracted with Reddel and Suggs for the

Add sifted dry ingredients alternately with sour milk, stirring just until smooth after each addition. Pour into well-greased oblong pan (12 x 7 x 2 inches) or 2 8-inch square pans. Bake in moderate oven (375° F.) about 25 minutes When cool, spread with your favorite chocolate butter-cream or fudge frosting and cut into 2-inch squares. Makes about 18 squares.

Note: For thick cake-like squares, bake in 8-inch square cake pan in moderate oven (350° F.) about 45 minutes.




