A cistern holds only a limited supply of water. A broken cistern will hold no water. This is a striking illustration of all human ways that have supplanted the way of the Lord. The ways of men are wholly inadequate to save the soul. There is no substitute for anything that God has made. This is true in both the natural and spiritual worlds. Nothing can take the place of sunshine, of water, of food. And there is no substitute for the bread

In no respect is God's way comparable to a cistem. His way is like a fountain - the source of supply is invisible and the quantity is unlimited. The sin of human pride causes men to forsake God, the fountain of living water. Man glories in his own wisdom. He wants to think for himself and have a sense of independence.

The ways of men that will not hold water are innumerable. And they keep on hewing out new cisterns. It does not take a very close observer to see that they are all cracked. Here are some of the popular cracked cisterns: salvation by faith only, salvation by grace only, nothing in a name, one church is as good as an other, can be saved out of the church as well as in it nonessential commandments, baptism is sprinkling pouring, or immersion, conscience is a safe guide in
