



## Congressional re-districting is likely

For the second time in less than a decade, Floyd County may wind up in a new congressional district.

As a result of the 1980 census results. it seems possible, if not likely, that Floyd County will move from the 17th congressional district of Charles Stenholm (D-Stamford) to the 19th congressional district of Kent Hance of Lubbock.

However, it is possible Floyd County could join the 13th congressional district of Jack Hightower which now stretches from Amarillo to Wichita Falls.

According to preliminary census fig-

-Stenholm's 17th district had 503,563 people. That's 20,597 short of the so-called ideal congressional district. -Hance's 19th district had 541,883 people, 17,673 more than the ideal

--Hightower's 13th district had 504,266 people, 19,894 short of the ideal

One solution could be to move the 13th district south into the 17th and the 17th south into the 21st district which, preliminary census figures show, has a population of 677,041, which is 152,881 people over the ideal size.

The Texas Legislature has begun holding hearings in Austin on re-districting. The Texas Constitution requires that re-districting be completed in the first regular session after the decennial census. However, the re-districting cannot be

completed until the census figures are final and President Reagan has until April 1 to report the final census totals to Congress. Stenholm aide, Dale King, says he

expects to see the 17th district extended

to the south to take in all of Coleman

and Comance Counties which are now partially in the 17th. He says the lines may also be redrawn to include part or all of Brown and Runnels Counties in

When the boundaries of the 13th and 19th districts are redrawn, King says, it seems likely Floyd County will be included in Hance's 19th district because Floyd County has more identification with Lubbock than it does with Amarillo in Hightower's district.

Floyd County was in the 19th district until the 1972 redistricting when it was moved to the 17th.

Lockney Mayor Claude Brown says he agrees with King's assssment that Floyd County more appropriately belongs in Hance's 19th district than Hightower's 13th.

"That's more where we belong." Brown says of the 19th. "We have more identification with Lubbock than we do

with Amarillo. If we change, that's (the 19th district) more where we belong."

There could be changes in the county's representation in the state legislature.

Because the number of senatorial districts will remain unchanged at 31, the South Plain-Panhandle districts will apparently have to be expanded significantly, to take into consideration the state's 27 percent, or three million, increase in population over the last decade, much of it in West Texas.

Because of the increase in state population, the ideal size for a state senatorial district has increased from 361.247 to 458.980.

Floyd County is in the 30th state senatorial district represented by Democrat Ray Farabee of Wichita Falls.

According to the preliminary census results, district 30 is now 84,000 short of the ideal population. The district's total

population, according to those preliminary figures, rose by only 4,778 people. a change of just 1.3, percent over the last census.

Farabee's district is immediately west of the 22nd senatorial district which is now more than 42,000 over the ideal population.

To even out the population in the districts, Farabee's district could be extended into the 22nd district, the 31st district, now represented by Bill Sarapalius of Hereford, could be extended South into the 30th and possibly the 28th districts. Sen. E.L. Short's 28th district could be expanded south into Snelson's district or east into Farabee's.

It seems likely, at this time, that Floyd County will remain in the state legislative district of Rep. Foster Whaley (D-Pampa), although a determination will have to await completion of the final census report.

Wednesday, March 11, at the American Legion Post, 111 Ash, in Plainview In June of last year, voters in Floyd. Hale, Castro and Lamb Counties approved the controversial weather modification program by a vote of 2,260-

1.873, a 387 vote margin. However, the program carried only one of five precincts in Floyd County, the Sandhill area. It was defeated in Hale County but carried by large margins in both Lamb and Castro

Counties. Last week the water commission approved a weather modification license for the Plainview-based Plains Water Improvement Association. That group wants to conduct hail suppression activities over the High Plains.

The license issued to the Plains Association does not authorize any specific project. A permit will be required for any actual hail suppression work. That permit will be the topic of next month's public hearing.

Association president Royce Carthel says it is up to the group now to prove its activities will not negatively affect

the project area or any areas adjacent to

The Association last Spring proposed conducting its hail reduction-rain enhancement activities over portions of the four counties. But the water commission, if it approves the permit, could modify the project area to reflect the program's strongest support as indicated by the election results.

To accurately reflect the results of that election, the water commission could redraw the project area borders to run from Plainview to the west, leaving out western Floyd County and eastern Hale County.

According to the hail suppression election law, the opposing precincts along the outside border of the project can be excluded from the permit area.

However, the law indicates that opposing precincts located completely in the target area are to be left in the permit area.

The Association operated its hail suppression program from 1970 through 1977. But in 1978, Citizens for Natural Weather, which opposes the suppression program, were successful in a series of elections throughout the area in voting down the Associations request

for an operating permit that year. The Association was not eligible to apply for another permit for two years.







## Area men tops in soybean production

For the fifth time in as many years, a Hale County farmer has been recognized as the top soybean producer in the state in the annual yield contest sponsored by the Texas Soybean Association, in cooperation with Texas Agricultural Extension Service and Elanco Products Co.

Donald Lee Terrell of 210 Yucca Terrace, Plainview, was named the state soybean yield champion on Friday at the 14th annual meeting of the Texas Soybean Association in Plainview. For his winning yield of 72.8 bushels per acre he received the state champion's plaque and a trip for two to Acapulco.

Last year the state soybean yield crown went to Joe Schwartz of Hale Center, for producing 72.9 bushels per acre. The 1978-crop crown went to Dale Arthur, Petersburg, for producing 71.6 bushels per acre, with Bill John Hegi of Petersburg for 77.4 bushels and the 1976 crop award to Neal Burnett of Plainview with 72.3

bushels per acre. Two area men also took second and third place in the state contest, Mike Carthel of Lockney, who farms north of Akin, produced 62.7 bushels per acre and L.B. "Bert" Elam, from Lockney but who's soybean test plot was in eastern Hale County with 60.3 bushels per acre.

BOTH CARTHEL and Elam received special plaques along with amounts of either Treflan or Surflan by virtue of also placing second and third, respectively, in the contest for irrigated soybean production areas. Terrell captured the top spot among irrigated producers.

During the two-day convention, held Thursday and Friday at the Hale Coounty Agriculture Center, LaMarr Ramsey of Plainview was re-elected to his second one-year term as president of the Texas Soybean Association. Also re-elected were Roy Seaberg, first vice president, of Dayton; Tom Henderson, second vice president, of El Campo, and Robert Ledbetter, third vice president, of Paris. Terrell was elected as secretary-treasurer, replacing Bill SoRelle of Plainview, who did not run for re-election.

A farmer since 1955, Terrell currently produces cotton, wheat, corn, soybeans, potatoes and onions and approximately 2,300 acres west and northwest of Plainview. All of the cropland is irrigated.

The winning 72.8 bushel production was from an eight-acre measured

contest plot, planted in Ring Around Mitchell variety on May 26. It was watered six times, planted double row on 40-inch beds with nine seeds per foot. Treflan was used for weed control and the crop was harvested

FOR THE 1980 crop year, Terrell raised some 420 acres of soybeans with an overall yield of 52 to 53 bushels. Some 100 acres of soybeans were produced on the same farm as the yield test with an overall yield for that farm of 62 bushels per acre. In last year's contest, Terrell produced 61.61 bushels per acre.

Carthel captured second place with Ring Around 450 variety while Elam

took third with Mitchell variety. Top producer in the Coast Prairie area was Reynolds Farm of Wharton in Wharton County with a yield of 55.6 bushels from the Hutton variety. Abney and Sons Farm of Nome in

#### Hay test is helpful

Hay is now being fed in many areas of the state, vet most producers don't know the quality of hay they have. Since much of the 1980 hay crop was of low quality due to dry conditions, producers should consider having their hay tested

for protein content. A hay test to determine the protein content is helpful in several respects points out Don Dorsett, forage specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M University System. Protein content relates to production practices which influence quality, such as maturity and fertilization, and also provides a guide as to feeding such hay according to its nutritional value.

Different classes or types of beef cattle have different nutritional requirements, emphasizes Dorsett. Animal nutritionists say that beef cattle cannot meet their requirements for protein when hay is 7 percent crude protein or below. Yet a recent summary of hay test conducted for producers by the Forage Testing Service at Texas A&M University revealed that 32 percent of the Coastal bermudagrass hay tested 7 percent or below. The summary also indicated that more than 69 percent of such hay as Bahiagrass, sudan, sorghum, bluestems ans Johnsongrass tested 7 percent crude protein or below.



Jerry Perry Cotton will do a tight-rope

act in 1981 according to U. S. Department of Agriculture figures which estimate that 1980-81 world cotton demand will outstrip production by about a million bales. The USDA's probability people identify last season's drought as the reason for the projected tight supply/demand balancing act. Post-drought production was nearly 25 percent below that of the previous 1979-80 season. Increased foreign production which has been pushed up to 52.5 million bales, will do little, if anything, to offset the U.S. decrease. That decrease, over 11 million bales, is reflected in all cotton producing regions of the U.S. World carry-over stocks are placed at 2.8 million for the same period due to the reduced harvest.



Floyd County

Jefferson County captured second at 47.4 bushels with Coker 338 variety while Mike N. Burnside of Bay City in Matagorda County came in third with 46.7 bushels, also from Coker 338.

Glen Nichols of Clarksville in Red River County was the top producer in the Northeast Texas region with 43.3 bushels per acre.

Terrell was the only producer initiated into the Texas 70 Bushel Club for 1980. Carthel and Elam were both initiated into the Texas 60 Bushel Club, along with High Plains grower Emmet Pittman of Kress in Swisher County. Pittman's Mitchell soybeans

yielded 60.2 bushels per acre. The annual contest is designed to recognize producers in each of the major soybean growing areas of the state - irrigated areas (High Plains and Southwest Texas), Northeast Texas and Coast Prairie. Its purpose is to stimulate soybean production by providing useful cultural information to increase cooperation within the

industry to improve production efficiency.

CONTEST WINNERS were announced by Dr. Arlen Klosterboer of Beaumont, extension area agronomist.

This year's convention attracted about 100 soybean producers from throughout Texas. It is traditionally hosted annually, in rotation, by producers in each of the three major Texas production areas.

Prior to the awards presentation, Denny Blankenship, director of market development of the American Soybean Association in St. Louis, Mo., explained that during the next 10 years, soybean demand is expected to reach 3 billion bushels, or 50 percent more than the present crop. Currently, U.S. soybean exports account for about \$10 billion, with only \$16 million spent in export marketing development through producer checkoffs and USDA funding.





County Extension Agent HEARING DEVICE HELPS

TV VIEWERS Television's value to the hearing impaired has been enhanced by the use of a special decoder that displays otherwise invisible captions on selected TV programs. The decoders allow users to see the captions without irritating other viewers who don't want words flashing across their TV screens.

The decoders which are sold at cost (about \$250) by a national department store use a small portion of the standard TV signal to transmit the captions.

Currently there are more than 24,000 decoders in use. Two of the three major networks offer 5 hours apiece of captioned programming each week. The Public Broadcasting Service will have raised its captioned programming to 111/2 hours each week by mid Septem-

The captioning and encoding is done by the National Captioning Institute (NCI). NCI is a non-profit organization funded last year with money from the federal government. NCI plans to become self supporting through the fees it charges for captioning and encoding TV programs and commercials by 1982 when the federal grant money runs out. However, before the networks and advertisers will expand their number of such programs they want to know that the hearing-impaired comits support by using more
