

(The best remedy we have ever used is to first clean up the infected quarters and burn all the trash; then sprinkle thoroughly, the entire fowl house, wetting every square inch, with sulphuric acid, 1th, water 20 gallons. A week later repeat the sprinkling. If the mites are "all over the place," as sometime occurs, the treatment must be equally extensive. The fowls themselves, may be sprinkled after going to roost, with benefit. This work can best be done with a common watering sprinkler,-Farm &


