Receipts of cattle continue very light, and prices to advance. The increase in prices the Eminence. was very general and was distributed to all classes, with the light butcher weights of either sex showing a trifle the most strength. The top this week and for the season was scored today by Charles Butler, of Frankford, Kansas who market ed 18 head of steers that weighed 1329 pounds each at 7.15 per hundred. The top for butcher heifers this week was 6.60 with several bunches bringing from 6.00 to 6.50. Native butcher steers are selling from 5.50 for common to 7.13 for fancy grades. Native cows 3.50 to 6.00, mative heifers 4.00 to 6.00, bulls 3.50 to

The market for stock and feeding cattle shows but little life, the demand is confined very largely, to heavy feeders that are selling steady, while the common grades are slow sale at weak to lower prices.

The southern receipts were very light this week, with apparently no end to the demand; in fact the light weight medium flesh cattle that are produced by the southern feeders are just the class of cattle Hat the butcher is calling for at this season. The top for the week was 6.50 and this bunch were only moderately finished. The prices range from 5.40 for plain butcher steers to 6.50 for fair butcher grades, cow and heifers

3.75 to 6.00, bulls 3.50 to 5.00. Another good week in the hog yards, with net gain in prices of 25 to 40 cents per hundred top Friday was 7.25, with prices ranging 6.75 for plain light weights to 7.25, for choice bunches.

Sheep values are keeping pace with cattle and hog prices. In fact the oldest of our salesmen do not recall a time when the three principal species of slaughtering animals were selling at practically the same price The top this week on cattle was 7.15, top on hogs 7.25, and top for fed lambs 7.00. Western fed lambs are bringing from 6.40 to 6.80, Western wethers 5.40 to 5.90, yearlings 6.00 to 6.30, ewes 4.80 to 5.30, stockers and feed ers 3.00 to 5.50. Texas clipped sheep are in light supply; the few that were received brought from 4.50 to 5.25, while Texas clipped lambs were ready sale at 9.00 to 6.20.

Burying the Bead. "Dust thou art and to dust thou shalt return." When Joseph had taken the body of Jesus, he "wrapped\_it in a clean linen cloth and laid it in his own new tomb." He did not dress it in a street costume, gloved and decorated, as if for a ball foom, as undertakers are doing in this day. He did not put on it a backless coat, a ruffied shirt front, and a frilled collar. He simply wrapped it in a clean linen cloth a winding sheetis a sleep-a long sleep of the body, which returns to dust. The spirit takes its flight, but the body returns to dust, and is not profited by wasteful extravagance in its burial. The expenditure of large sums of money, a custom introduced and maintained by undertakers, does not have any effect upon the corpse. It does not indicate any more love for the departed It is simply a species of vanity, to impress the living, by a display of fine silver handled casket, a fine hearse, a grave lined with cloth, and an elaborately caparisoned span of horses at the head of a fashionable cortege. And the custom of erecting expensive monuments, introduced and exploited by proprietors of marble-yards, does the dead body no good. Some people have an idea that the more money you spend at a funeral, the more you loved, the deceased. This idea was evidently worked up by the undertakers and artizans whose services are utilized in the preparation for funerals. The deepest love is not the most demonstrative: useless wastefulness upon the grave of the dead is not always an evidence of extreme love of the departed. But it is as dead as if it died a thoudust only. The king with his rags are all dust, side by side, and God alone can affect them. over the grave can preserve the body or coax back the spirit. As well seek to allure a lion back to its iron cage. It has joined that bourne from which no traveler returns." It is basking in an eternal light. Like the stars which adorn the sky, it is eternal-in eternityand knows no death-and has no desire to consort with mortality and disolution any more Its friends are now everlasting and ever-loving, unalloyed with vanity, formalism and assumed piety. It is in an everlasting halo of glory, as compared with this life, and will not break the beauty and loveliness of its environments by a visit to graveyards and white sepulchres, charnel-houses and tombstones, though ornamented with the richest flowers of earth, enriched by the tears of widows and and orphans, or saluted by the greans of myriads of mourners, not to speak of the pharisaica condolence from those who at tend all the funerels of the rick that "thrift may follow fawning."
