BOARD OF TRADE.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS.

ART. 1- The name and style of this association shall be the Canyon City Board of Tradeits object the advancement of the business interests of Canyon City

ART. 2- 1. The officers, of this board of trade shall consist of a president and tirst and second vice presidents, a secretary and a treasurer, who shall after the first organization, be elected by ballot semi-annually on the first Mondays in January and July.

2. Said officers, including those elected at the time of the adoption of this constitution, shall hold their offices until their successors shall have been elected and qualified; their powers and duties shall e similar to those of like officers in like bodies; all shall serve without compensation except the secretary who shall be paid the sum of two dollars per month.

ART. 3- There shall be elect ed at the same time the other officers are elected, the following committees, to consist of three members each, towit: (1) on finance, (2) reception, (3) public improvements, public enterprise and sanitation, and (4) immigration, who shall perform such duties as may be assigned to them by the board of trade.

ART. 4- 1 Any citizen of Canvon City or Randall county may become a member of this board of trade by consent of a majori ty of the members present at any regular meeting succeeding the one at which his name is proposed; such election to be by



SCHOOL NOTES.

As county superintendent we visited three schools last week, Connely school, taught by Miss Kerr of McKinhey; Gilleland, taught by Miss Ruth Ester, and Rowan, taught by Prof. and Mrs. Rogers.

At Conneily we found the school house freshly painted inside and out and fairly well furnished. At Gilleland we find rather a poor house and is poorly furnished, but, their funds have been limited heretofore. Since the Commissioner's Court has enlarged the district they will be enabled another year to improve their school building. Rawan school has a commodious and comfortable building, but is still deficient in furniture and apparatus. This is a splendid school, having already enrolled over 50 pupils. There is a marked improvement this year not only in the condition of the school buildings but also in the attendance and the interest on the part of both pupil and pation.

But after having visited several schools in the county we desire to make the following suggestions as general and not personal: We find a lack of system and thoroughness in the work and some teachers who have, good literary qualifications seem to be wanting in methods and management. We think it a mistake to allow pupils to be continually moving about the room during school hours. Pupils should not be allow d to disturb a recitation by asking for help on a lesson. It is much better to have them note the word or example, and await the close of the recitation when the teacher can pass to their desk and direct the pupil how to overcome his difficulty or reprove him for asking for help when he could have found a way out of the difficulty without help. Pupils should be taught to think, to be self-reliant and systematic.

Here is the name of a little boy who was prompt to answer a question submitted to the school by us in our talk at Rowan:
