The deadline for returning ballots is September 10. The newly elected directors will be seated at the October 18 board meeting.

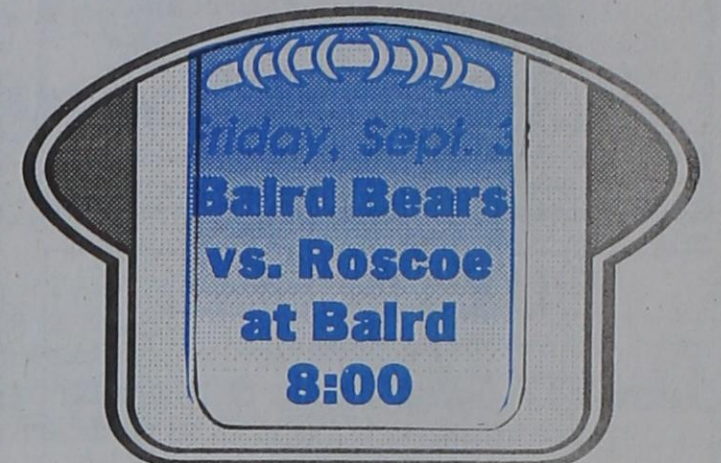

### Easy Potato Bake

Prep Time: 10 minutes  
Baking time: 35 minutes  
1 package (32 ounces) frozen Southern-style hash brown potatoes  
1 container (16 ounces) Sour Cream  
1 package (8 ounces) Shredded Cheddar Cheese  
1 can (103/4 ounces) condensed cream of chicken soup  
1 cup each chopped green onions and corn flake crumbs  
2 Tbsp. butter or margarine, melted  
MIX potatoes, sour cream, cheese, soup and onions in large bowl.  
SPOON into greased 13 x 9-inch baking dish. Toss crumbs and butter; sprinkle over potato mixture.  
BAKE at 375°F for 35 minutes. Makes 12 to 16 servings.

### Fluffy 2-Step Cheesecake

Prep Time: 15 minutes plus refrigerating  
1 package (8 ounces) Cream Cheese  
1/3 cup sugar  
1 tub (8 ounces) COOL WHIP Whipped Topping, thawed  
1 prepared graham cracker crumb crust (6 ounce or 9 inch)  
BEAT cream cheese and sugar in large bowl with wire whisk or electric mixer on high speed until smooth. Gently stir in whipped topping.  
SPOON into crust. Refrigerate 3 hours or until set. Garnish with thin apple slices and curled orange peel. Store leftover cheesecake in refrigerator. Makes 8 servings.

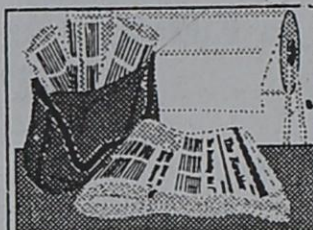



# ON THE ROAD

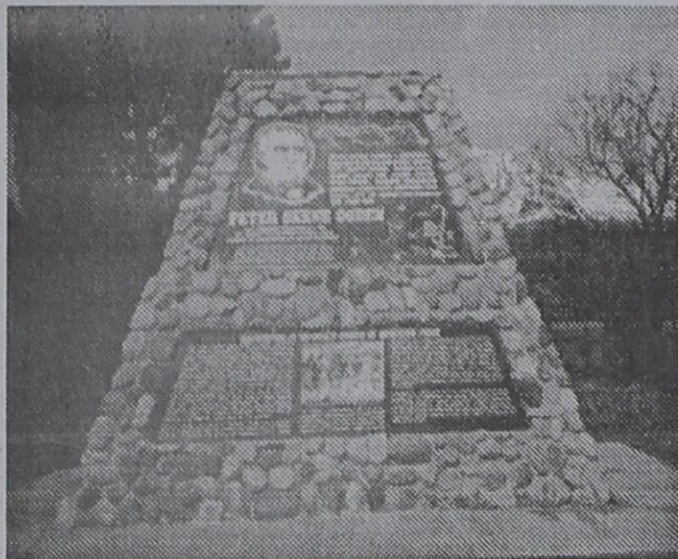
During a trip going west the highway we were on was the original Lewis and Clark trail. I remember those guys from history classes in school. The highway was I-84, and the river going beside it was the Columbia River.

A barge was hauling goods down the river, and on the other side of the river a train was traveling the railroad tracks hauling goods and this US Xpress truck was hauling goods for the American people. What a sight.

We get to see historical sights all the time. A highway we were on in Wyoming, Utah, Nevada, and California was the

original Pony Express Trail. You really have to respect those guys who delivered mail during early frontier days. It was a lonely and rugged stretch of road.

Also I-80 and I-84 is the original Oregon Trail. At a road side park on I-84 in Oregon a display was set up with letters or pages from diaries from the pioneer families who traveled the Oregon Trail. One letter said the Indians do not attack the settlers, but a lot of horses or cattle disappear when the Indians come around. One entry in a diary told of a family coming across a broken down wagon and oxen lying

around either dead or dying. A family was waiting there, so a small wagon was built for them.

It took 12 days for a wagon trail to get through one mountain pass. At places 10-12 men would have to stand on one side of the wagon to keep it from tumbling down the mountain side. The man wrote that they had traveled 15 miles one

day. "It was a good day," he wrote. At the end of the letter a man wrote, "Oh to see verdant land again." A woman wrote in her diary about having to bury her 4-year-old son, Willy. "He is in the arms of the angels now," she wrote. "We buried him at the top of the mountain."

We were headed to Portland, Oregon, and we had to go across

Pendleton Mountain. Coming down on the west side was what the truckers call "Cabbage." It's a winding steep road where the speed limit for trucks is from 18 mph to 47 mph, depending on the weight of the load. What made it worse was road construction crews cutting the road down to one lane at times.

This was nerve wracking for me, but Herrel said the only

thing that bothered him was the truckers who few past us. They have probably driven down this road so many times they think nothing about it.

Then about 5-7 miles past the mountain was a yellow sign, "Warning: Blowing Just Area Next 40 Miles," which was funny because it snowed on us on Pendleton Mountain. And drivers were talking about a foot of snow in Pocatello, Idaho and Wyoming. This was in the first week of April.

We had picked up snow chains from a "snow chain bank" in Longmont, Colorado. We will drop them off at another "Snow Chain Bank" or at a US Xpress Terminal when we come across one.

Till next time this is Tumbleweed and Wonder Woman in the Hammer Lane. Drive safe.

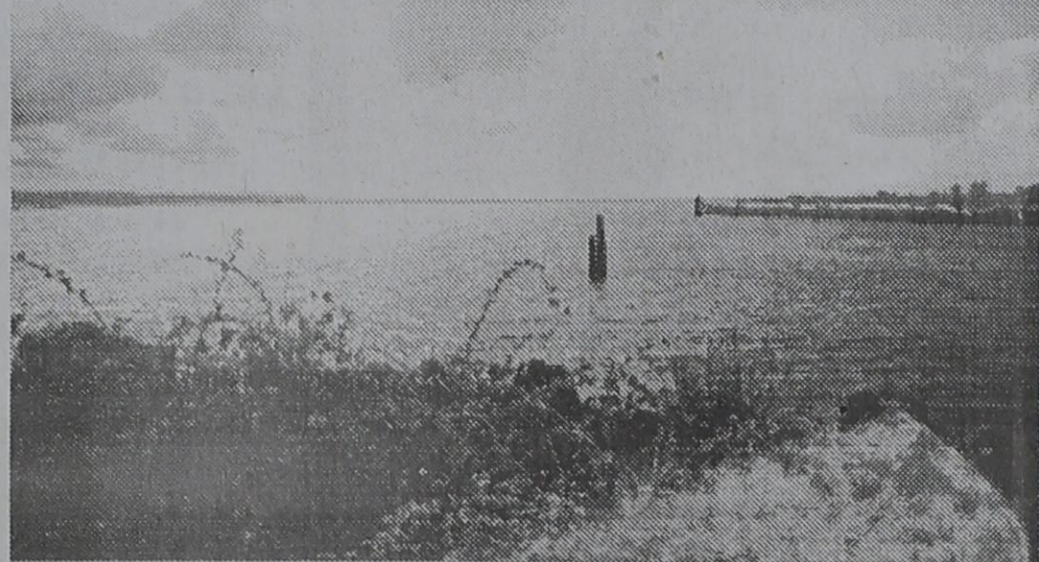

## New Truck Speed Limit Effective September 1

The Texas Department of Transportation will remove the 60 mph day/55 mph night speed limit signs for trucks by 5:00 p.m. Wednesday, September 1 is the effective date for the new truck speed limit on all interstate, U.S. and state highways. There will no longer be a difference in speed limits for cars and large trucks on many Texas highways. The law applies to both rural and urban areas.

House Bill 676 passed by the 76th Legislative session changed the law to reflect the desire to have all vehicles travel at a more uniform speed. It is generally considered safer for all vehicles traveling on the same road to travel the same speed rather than varying speeds.

The new law does not impact Farm-to-Market and Ranch-to-Mar-

ket roads. The maximum speed limit on those roads will remain at 60 mph during the day and 55 mph at night. FM and RM roads total nearly 41,000 miles in Texas. Car speed limits will remain at 70 mph day and 60 mph at night. Motorists should always drive a speed that is safe and appropriate for the conditions. Speeds should be reduced during bad weather or during other poor driving conditions. Crashes can be prevented if motorists practice safe driving habits. They should obey the speed limit, use safety belts properly, pay attention to traffic and never drink and drive.

One of the greatest events in the history of the western frontier was the arrival of the stagecoaches carrying mail and passengers from Saint Louis and San Francisco. These semi-weekly coaches of the Butterfield Overland Mail Company began on September 15, 1858 and continued to run until the beginning of the Civil War. This direct and rapid communication was vital to the settling of the frontier. Fort Belknap was used as a depot where mules were kept to pull the stage through Indian Territory. Here the stagecoach horses were replaced by mules; no self-respecting Comanche would ride a mule! The Mail route followed the military road from Jacksboro, Fort Belknap, then Fts. Phantom Hill and Chadbourne.

This September, both travel and communication along these military roads have improved dramatically and the attractions and sites could not be busier.

Almost every community along the Texas Forts Trail has a unique activity to share this month but one that should not be missed is the World Championship Goat Cook Off in Brady over Labor Day weekend. September 10-18 brings the West Texas Fair and Rodeo to Abilene, along with traditionally a chance of rain. Eastland hosts the Old Rip Festival on September 18 and the San Angelo Museum of Fine Arts opens its new facility on September 25.

Also, Eldorado, Texas, and its energetic high school students, are hosting the First Annual Texas Forts Trail Day, living histories, readings, and music are a part of this day long festivity. Austin recording artist Pat Green ends the day with an outdoor concert. And also on September 25, Comanche welcomes the Comanche County POWWOW, a tribute to the Native Americans that populated the area.
