



age of this crop at the expense of good cultural methods. This is a time when, "if a thing is worth doing at all, it is worth doing well."

Extreme dry conditions do not always permit ideal wheat land preparation. An ideal seed bed for wheat is early, and has become firm and well in a loose, open seed bed, and it is,

therefore, not advisable to work the land deep just before sowing time. Whatever is done to get land ready for wheat, it should be remembered that the earlier it is done, the better. Early discing, listing, or plowing gives better results than late work; but, regardless of when the land preparalate shallow work is necessary to keep down weeds, preserve moisture and make plant food available.



CANYON IS LISTED-ON TWO HIGHWAYS OF THE STATE

According to the maps just issued by the State Highway department, Canyon will be on two new State Highways under the law which was passed by the last legislature.

One highway will run from Canyon south to Plainview, following the line of the old Puget Sound highway, which has never been thoroughly developed.

The other is designated to run from Amarillo through Canyon on west, and is named the Ozark Trail on the new maps. However, since the Ozark Trail was designated by the inspectors to go west through Vega instead of Canyon, this town may not get the proposed new Highway to the west unless some definite action is taken. The new state highways are the result of the new tax on automobiles and Randall county should see that we get our share of these new lines.

Panhandle Must Feed Texas. "The Panhandle and East Texas will be commissioned with the task ot feeding the state of Texas this year," was the declaration made Thursday morning by Judge R. Walker Hall, associate justice of the Seventh Court of Civil Appeals Thursday. Judge Hall has just returned from Port O'Connor, where he attended the interesting session of the Epworth League encampment, of which he is one of the trustees. The judge states that crop prospects in the southern coast country and Central Texas are very bad. Cotton is stunted and aside from the good prospects of rice. Texas must lean on East Texas and the Panhandle for its sustenance for the year."

First of all, it is not the business of congress to conduct the war, but merely to provide the means for its conduct by the constitutionally designated authorities. A congressional committee would be of no service to the president or to the country. It would merely add to the burdens already put upon the administration. It would be a meddlesome, useless, cumbersome, irritating body, and, unless its members should differ materially from the rank and file of their colleagues in the two houses it would be a super-political and demagogic nuisance.

Congress has enough to do within. the provinces of effort laid down for it, without seeking to take over the work of the executive department. Certainly nothing has thus far developed to indicate that it possesses any especial fitness for the conduct of the war by committee, even had it any right to do so.

The people should enter a vigorous protest against this effort to muddle the business of carrying on this war. They should demand that congress at. 




