





It requires neighborhood cooperation When cholera appears in a vicinity all hogs on neighboring farms should be promptly treated with serum or scrum and virus.

Quarantine of the premises where there is cholera or where herds have been double-treated should be enforced for a reasonable time. Hogs dying from cholera should also be quickly burned or buried, and a thorough disinfection made of the yards and pens before the quarantine is removed.

America's Champion Dairy County. Green county, Wisconsin, lays claim to the title of America's champion dairy county. There are 154 cheese factories in this one county, and few farms are located over a mile from the factory. The average number of patrons is 12 and the average milk receipts are 4000 to 5000 pounds. No American cheese is made in the county, the varieties being confined to the brick, Swiss and Limberger, and nearly all of the cheese makers are native Swiss. Green County is also a great Holstein county, nearly every farmer owning a herd of these cattle, and, since January 1st, 4000 Holsteins have been sold and shipped to other states. Eliminate Waste in Stored Grain.

In the present crisis it is imperative that every effort be expended toward the elimination of each avenue of waste in our grain stores. Damage done stored grains by insect pests is considerable on every farm. - One of the most satisfactory methods of destroying such insects is by the use of carbon bisulphide as a fumigator.

The amount of carbon bisulphid ecessary to obtain good results varies, but at average temperature (70 degrees Fahrenheit) four pounds of the liquid will be sufficient to treat 100 bushels of grain. The cracks and door should be made as tight as possible before the fumigation begins. Shallow pans with large evaporating surfaces should be distributed over the top of the grain. As the vapor of carbon bisulhid is heavier than air will gradually permeate to the bottom of the bin,

It must be remembered that the fumes of carbon bisulphid are poisonous and one must not enter the bin. The fumes are highly inflammable and explosive and for that reason all fire lights must be kept away while fumigation is in progress. At temperatures below 60 degrees the results are unsatisfactory regardless of the amount of carbon bisulphid used. Thirty-six hours of fumigation will, not hurt the grain and is a sufficient length of time to kill all insect pests. The door and windows of the bin should be open for two hours before





It costs no more in time or labor to keep a good bull than a poor one. No more expense in time or labor is required to raise a good calf than a poor calf, and far short of fulfilling the requirements of a loyal American citizen is the one who now, persists in using any other than the best of sires procurable.

If every scrub sire in the United States were sent to the butcher, the beef supply of our nation would be favoraply enhanced; and, if the places of these sires were filled with good purebred dairy bulls, the milk and butter production of the United States would be doubled within the next five years. Moreover, the cost of producing milk and butterfat would be so largely reduced that profit would accure from the business even where losses are now truthfully claimed. We sympathize eafnestly and sincerely with the dairyman unable to profit from producing milk and butterfat even though he has been using good purebred sires for a number of years, but our sympathy is not unbounded for those who have persistently and consistently used scrub bulls simply because he could buy them cheaply or borrow them from his neighbors.-Kimball's Dairy
