A Remarkable Record.  
At seven o'clock Saturday evening April 6th the stock touring car—Overland Model 90—drove into the lobby of the Lee Huckins Hotel at Oklahoma City, under its own power, completing a seven day continuous non stop, sealed in high gear run, and establishing a world's record at 4,370.1 miles for the seven days and nights.

The fame of the performance of the Carhart Motor Co., stock car No. 145,135, Overland Model 90 which broke the world's record the week of March 29th, April 5th, has spread all over the United States.

Automobile men in New York, Chicago, and San Francisco have sent congratulations as have also the president of the National Auto Dealers Association, F. W. A. Vesper, of St. Louis, who was there March 29th, and started the contender on its long grind, the Federal Tire Co., the Champion Spark Plug factory, and the officers of the Overland Company in Toledo.

Acknowledgment of the record was received by the distributor at Oklahoma City, from John N. Willys, head of the Overland company, who wired from New York City: "You can bet I am pleased. Let's go and go fast."

The problem of speeding up production of this type of car confronts the Overland factory. When the armistice was signed it caught the Overland people 80 per cent equipped for war work. The factory had reached that point of production in munitions at which it was manufacturing more gun carriages than were made in France and Italy combined. The Overland force was manufacturing shells, airplane parts and a great many other war implements.

**Big Land Deal.**

The biggest deal of late years in Union county lands was made last week by W. A. Henderson when he sold the most of the James and Haley ranches to John VanCleave of Wichita Falls, Texas, the land sold comprising 40,000 acres and the consideration being almost \$400,000.

We understand that Light P. James will leave this section on account of the altitude affecting Mrs. James' health. Some time ago he removed to Clayton and for a time she enjoyed better health but another change is necessary. We are not informed where they will go. We are also unable to state the plans of the Haley family.

John VanCleave the new owner is a multi-millionaire, being reputed to be worth \$95,000,000 most of which was made in the Burkburnett oil development, his holdings in that field being extensive. He is just 21 years of age. We understand that he will remove to Union county and become a citizen, making extensive improvements on his ranch.

During the past two weeks there have been a number of other deals for Union county land and in most cases by people interested in the oil development elsewhere. A recent geological report on this section would indicate that there was a rosy feature in store for this section, a noted geologist claiming that this is the largest undeveloped oil field in the known world and that all of north Union county is in possible oil territory.—Des Moines (N. M.) Swastika.

**Had Small Loss of Cattle.**

The Coggin firm of cattlemen are fortunate in the small loss of the 1200 head shipped in here last week, they report five or six of the weak ones succumbed to the storm of Wednesday which was the worst in years for April.—Glenrio (N. M.) Tribune.

The Traffic Department W. T. C. of C. Executive heads of the West Texas Chamber of Commerce believe the traffic department of the Chamber will render one of its most important services and they have established that department first with the idea in mind of beginning service even while organization is under way.

Ed P. Byars, traffic manager of the West Texas Chamber of Commerce brings to his office twenty-two years of experience. For eleven years he was with the railroads in the operating traffic departments. For the past eleven years he has been representing shippers. He has handled a great many important transportation matters as the representative of the Fort Worth Freight Bureau. He is secretary of the Texas Industrial Traffic League, an organization of the traffic managers of the state.

Mr. Byars makes the following brief outline of what his department proposes to do for the members of the West Texas Chamber of Commerce:

Represent the members of the organization before all rate regulatory bodies.

Take up with the proper authorities questions of adequate passenger train service, depot facilities, terminals and trackage where needed to prevent embargoes.

Keep the members advised of proposed changes in rates on staple commodities.

Furnish reliable information on rates to protect shippers from overcharge.

Take up immediately readjustment of rates on stock feeds, peanuts and peanut products, cotton, cotton seed and products, refined and crude oil, fruits and vegetables.

Secure settlement of claims against railroad, express companies for loss and damage and overcharges.

Aid in campaign for Information and Diversion Bureau which will enable shippers to learn promptly whereabouts of their cars in transit.

Mr. Byars' office will be in Fort Worth where it now is. He has assembled these files and data which are worth thousands of dollars and have cost more than ten years of time. They are now available to aid in serving the members of the West Texas Chamber of Commerce.

Headquarters of the West Texas Chamber of Commerce are in Stamford. A letter addressed there will bring information on how to organize your community to enter the new organization without waiting for the field manager of the West Texas Chamber of Commerce to call.

**Sales of Registered Animals.**

The sale of registered animals by the Harper County Breeders Association on March 22, 1919 at Laverne was a success. Every animal sold at prices satisfactory to the consignors.

The Shorthorn cattle averaged \$155 for cows, calves and bulls. Thirty-five per cent were under 10 months old. Herefords averaged \$143.75.

Brood sows averaged \$117.50. All hogs in the sale averaged \$89.10.

The top bull sold for \$300, and the top cow for \$310.

This sale was the first of its kind in Oklahoma and the animals were produced in Harper County by Harper County breeders and farmers, and was a test to see whether or not farmers could find a market for their surplus registered animals above their market value. The test was a success and the Association will have annual sales to encourage the breeding of registered animals. The farmers have some assurance of a market. The Laverne sale guarantees the market. Harper County has shown the way.

Every county in Oklahoma should follow the example of Harper and get results.—Woodward (Okla.) Democrat.

**TERRAZAS MAY RETURN HOME**

El Paso, Texas, April 15.—General Luis Terrazas, the octogenarian exile, may be permitted to return to Mexico, to spend his remaining years on the vast Terrazas estate which he acquired prior to the Mexican revolutions and which were confiscated by the constitutional government. They were valued at \$5,000,000.  
Notice has been received by Gen. Terrazas that his properties in the city of Chihuahua had been restored to him without the payment of delinquent taxes, his business representative here announced today. These include the Banco Minero building, Quinta Carolina, the famous summer home of General Terrazas in the suburbs of Chihuahua City, the beautiful marble palace which was his town house and many stores, residences and an interest in the electric light and power plant, all having a total value of \$3,000,000 gold. His vast ranch holdings in the state of Chihuahua, together with the timber tracts, mining properties and other interests outside of the capital, were not returned at this time but are expected to be soon.  
General Terrazas will be 90 years old July 22. He recently suffered a paralytic stroke shortly preceding the death of his aged wife.

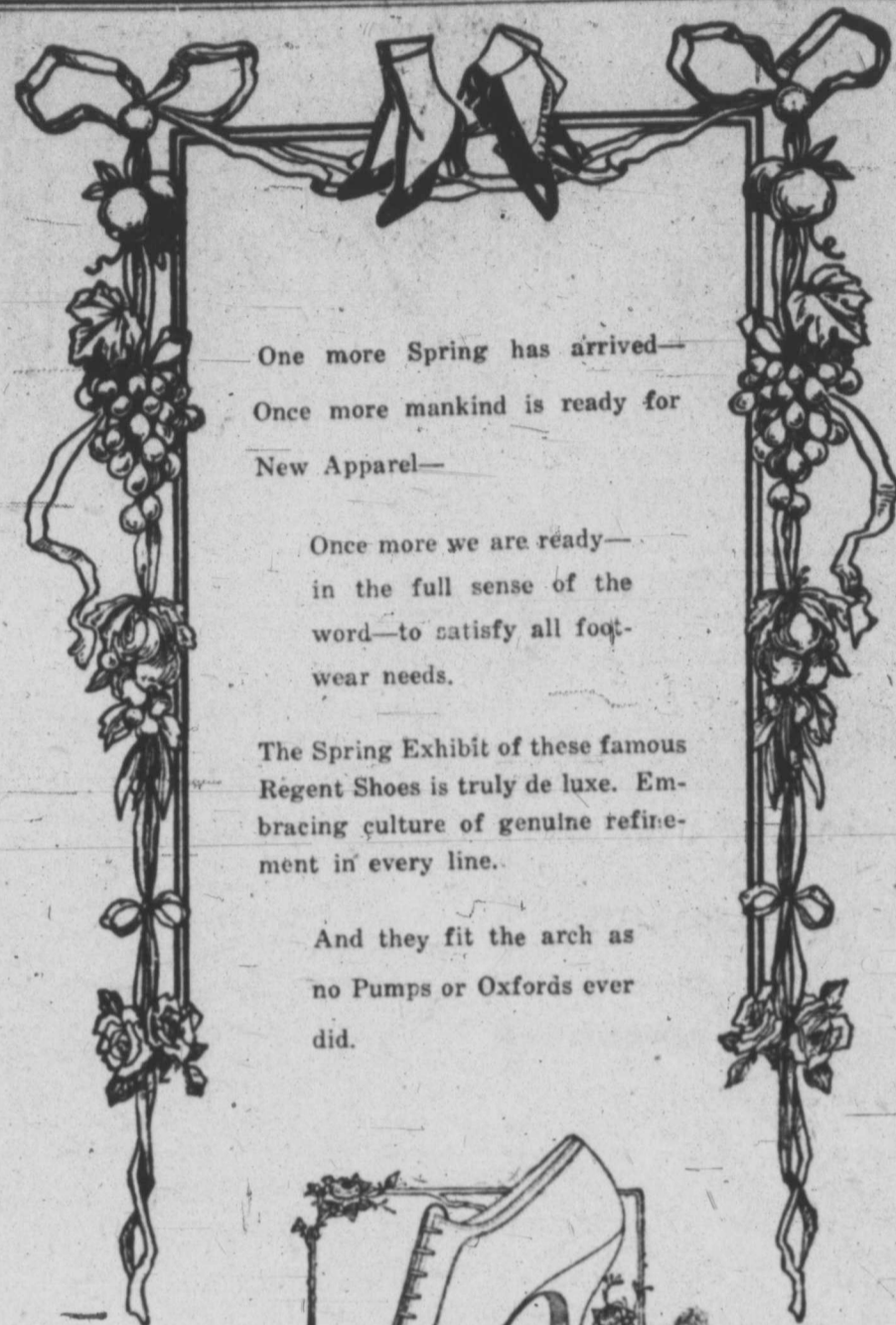

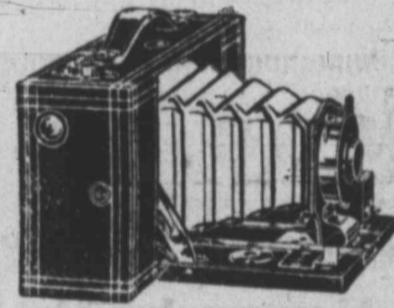

000 total of the loan, which is smaller than had been generally anticipated and the interest rate, was expressed today in hundreds of telegrams reaching the treasury from loan communities. Many of these were to the effect that the terms had raised the hopes of loan workers and financial observers.  
Officials discussing terms of the victory loan today said one reason for their belief that the market price of bonds of past issues would not be depressed by the new securities, was that there still should exist a strong demand for the older issues by large tax payers. With certain arrangement of holdings of past issues it is possible to hold \$160,000,000 of bonds absolutely tax free.
