The Randall County Fair opened yesterday, and there was a good attendance during the afternoon to look over the exhibits.

The hogs at the fair show a decided improvement in quality to the shows made during the past two years. The results of the past fairs have been a decided success and any visitor will note the improved herds shown.

There are not quite so many hogs in the show this when the judging starts today

It was not expected that a big show would be made in the agricultural exhibits owing to the continued dry weather this summer. But there is certainly a fine exhibit so far as the quality goes. There is a display of practically every find of grain and fruit and vegetable that you would expect to find at a county fair, ${ }^{\prime}$ but only a few in each class.
