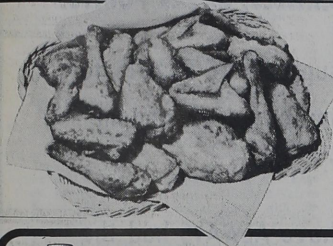

Four locals go to Washington

Scott Simpson, Mark Bruegel, and Kennon Howell of Dimmitt and Mickey Hochstein of Nazareth have returned from the National 4-H Citizenship Short Course and Heritage Tour to Washington, D. C.

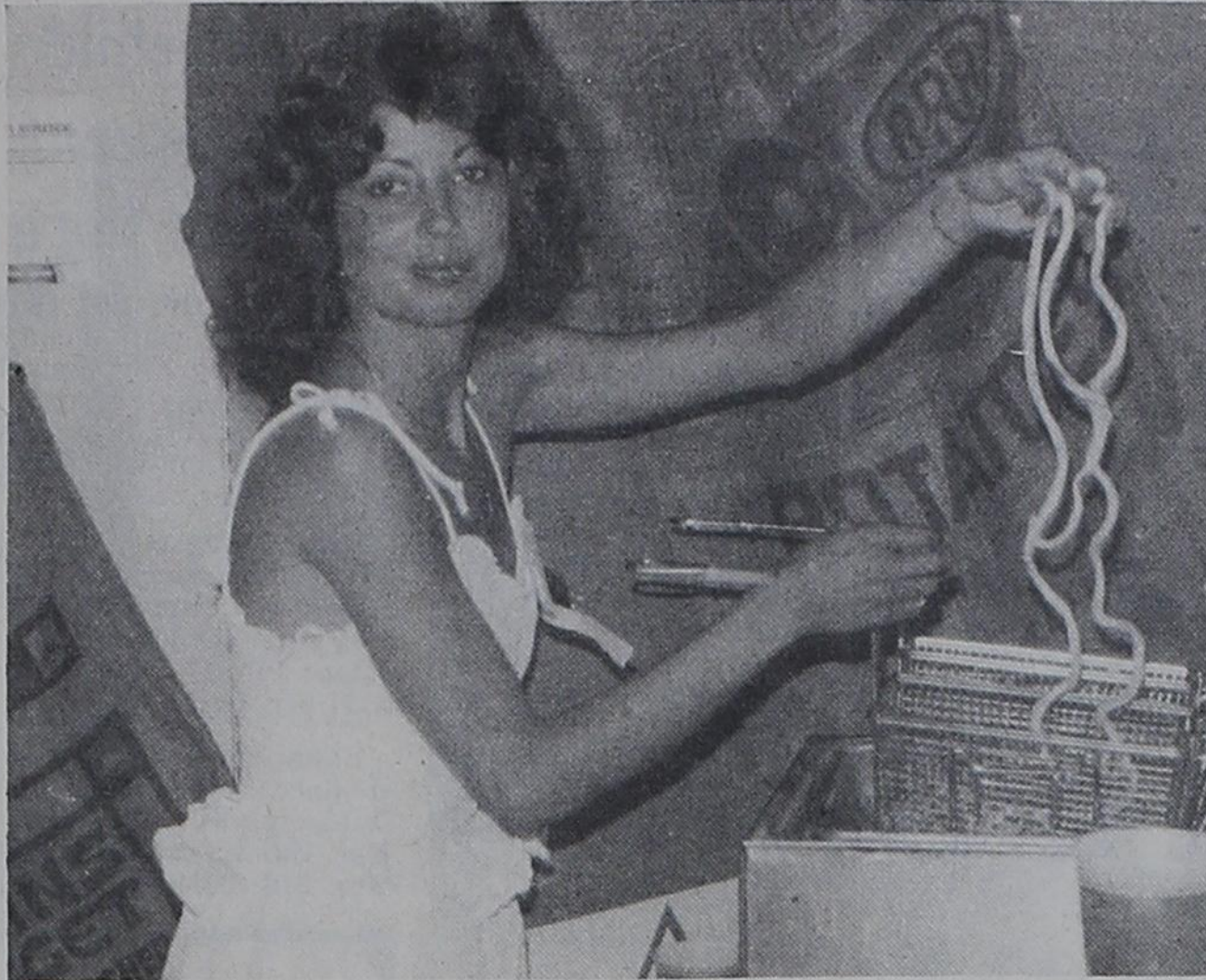
The group left Dallas on June 22 with 80 4-H members from Texas. They returned July 5. The objective of the short course and tour was to develop a better understanding for the meaning of citizenship, to gain a greater appreciation for our American heritage, and to learn the functions of government and understand the Constitution.

The Texas delegation spent 4 days traveling to Chevy Chase, Md., where they stayed in the National 4-H Center during their six-day tour to Washington, D. C.

They visited several historical sites on their trip, including the Alabama Space Center, Colonial Williamsburg, Va., and Mt. Vernon. In Washington, they toured the Capitol Complex and Office Buildings, the Library of Congress, the Smithsonian Institution, the United States Archives, the Washington Monument, the Jefferson Memorial, the Lincoln Memorial, Arlington National Cemetery, and the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier.

The four local youth met with Congressman Kent Hance in his office in the Longworth Building.

On the four-day return trip to Texas, they toured Monticello and they spent one day at Opryland in Nashville, Tenn.

Texas potatoes need their own 'identity'

Through a statewide promotional effort, High Plains potato growers are attempting to gain an identity for Texas potatoes, David Smith, chairman of the potato promotion committee of High Plains Vegetable Growers and Shippers Council, Inc., (HPVG & SC), said.

Recently the promotional committee participated in the Southwest and Texas Restaurant Association and the Texas Dietitian Association joint convention held in the Dallas Convention Center.

During the three days of exhibition, information was given to more than 25,000 people involved in commercially feeding the public and nutritionally feeding hospitalized and institutionalized persons.

Exhibitors from around the United States displayed many kinds of fruits, vegetables and meats. New techniques in cooking were demonstrated along

with supplies, computers, restaurant furniture and fixtures, and a new type of air-oven.

Sacks of Texas russets and Texas reds from potato sheds in the area decorated the HPVG & SC booth which also featured posters and promotional material. Patricia Smith of Smith Potato Inc. of Hart and Linda Smith of B. E. Smith and Son in Munday were in charge of the booth.

They conducted taste tests of Idaho russets, Texas russets and Texas reds. The test showed an overwhelming majority of participants could not tell the difference between Idaho and Texas russets. The test also revealed that the Texas reds have a better flavor than the russets, David Smith said.

Over 150 pounds of potatoes were used daily for baked and fried samples in conducting the taste test. The potatoes were supplied by sheds in Seminole and Munday, where processing is almost complete. Processing should begin in the local area by the middle of July.

"Texas potatoes need their identity," Smith said, "and taste tests such as this one is just one step toward gaining the needed

identity."

Smith said that the group of growers is considering three more food shows this summer. Plans are being formulated to attend and participate in the United Fresh Fruits and Vegetable Association's Convention slated for February of 1984 in Dallas.

HPVG & SC officers are Kenneth Gray of Lorenzo, president; Truman Touchstone of Dimmitt, vice-president; and Bill Reinauer of Hereford, secretary-treasurer.

Local shippers participating in the potato promotion include Walker Bros. Produce of Plainview, Dimco, Inc. of Dimmitt, H&S Produce, Smith Potato Inc., both of Hart, and Colville & Wilson and E. C. Reinauer & Sons, both of Hereford.

USDA offers cotton loans

The U.S. Department of Agriculture will offer special "Harvest for PIK" loans to cotton farmers who do not have enough upland cotton under Commodity Credit Corporation loan to satisfy their PIK requirements.

Rank said a special procedure will be available for those producers who are required to harvest 1983 cotton for PIK but do not want a regular loan. Two options are available at the time the loan is made: the producer may receive the PIK cotton immediately and the proceeds from sale of cotton to CCC after the PIK availability date, or receive the proceeds immediately and the PIK cotton after the PIK availability date.

CCC will pay warehouse storage charges through the date the producer redeems his loan to satisfy his PIK requirements unless the producer elects not to pay the loan service fee.

"With this procedure," Rank said, "producers will be permitted to obtain their PIK commodities before the PIK availability date but will not receive payment for 1983-crop cotton sold to CCC to satisfy PIK requirements

until the PIK availability date."

CCC also will offer to purchase cotton that has been ginned but has not been classed and is not stored in an approved warehouse. In this instance, the purchase price will be based on the 1983 loan rate for the base PIK quality for the area where PIK was earned. The cotton purchased by CCC will be used to satisfy the producers' PIK on a pound-for-pound basis, Rank said.

Producers should contact their local Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service office for further details on their loans, which will be available soon.

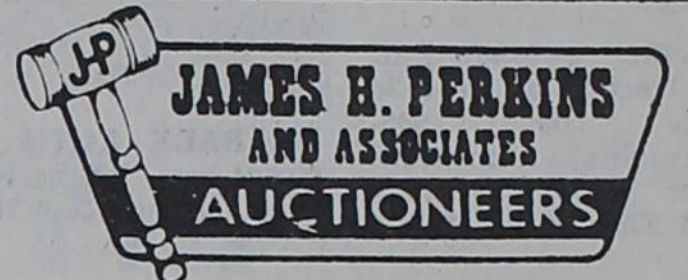

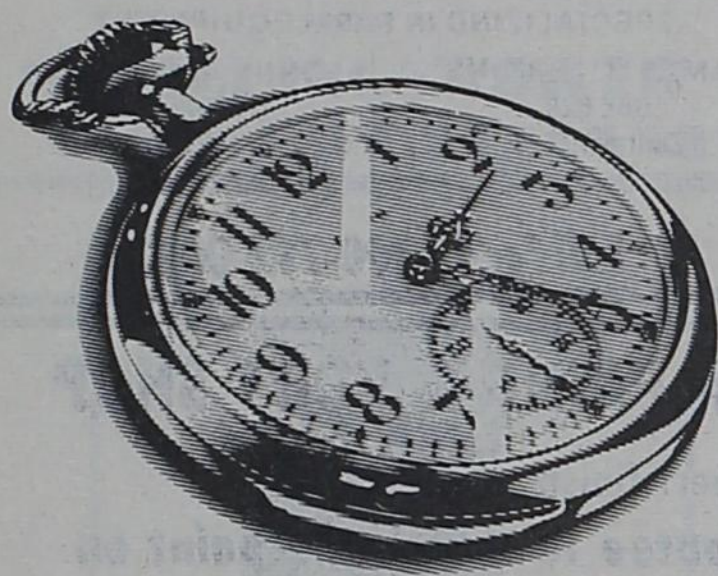

Hart hires new therapist, assistant football coach

The Hart Board of Education has voted to hire Mitchell Rankin as assistant football coach and his wife, Donna, as a

speech therapist for the 1983-84 school year.

Rankin, an Amarillo native, received his bachelor's degree from West Texas State University. He has been employed by the Canyon schools as a junior varsity football coach and a girls' basketball coach. He has had 11 years of experience.

Mrs. Rankin is a Canyon High School graduate and received her degree in speech and hearing from WTSU. She has been employed by the Hereford schools as a speech therapist. She has had 9½ years of experience.

The board also voted to reduce four full-time teachers' aides to half-time as a result of fewer pupils and a reduction in federal funds.

Tim Walker, industrial arts teacher, presented the industrial arts budget for the coming school year. The Board of Education approved the \$3,242 budget proposal.

The board voted to adopt the 1983-84 elementary handbook that was presented by Principal Jack Burkhalter and the junior high and high school handbook presented by Principal William E. Ammons.

The board agreed to pay half of the purchase price of new carpet for the fieldhouse and the cost of removing the existing carpet.

Business Manager-Tax Collector Nancy Bowden gave a report regarding delinquent tax collection, tax suits filed and the current and delinquent 1982 taxes.

Family Civil War quilt to be donated to museum

A hand-sewn quilt made by Susan Robb during the Civil War was donated to the Texas Tech Museum in Lubbock Monday.

Donating the quilt were Susan Robb's surviving great-grandchildren, J. R. Petersen of Lorenzo, Mary Lois Campbell Miller of Albuquerque, N.M., Tom F. Robb of Florence, Colo., Ted J. Robb of Dimmitt, and Don R. Robb of Idalou.

Susan, the wife of Henry Robb, was living in Chicot County, Ark. at the time she made the quilt, according to family history.

Fashioned of nine large blocks, the border blocks all contain large flower designs in the colors of red, green, yellow and orange. Figures of birds are placed throughout the design, and they are made from materials of red, orange and purple. The cherries stemming from the flower designs are red, purple and blue. The border stars are red.

The center block depicts two groups of soldiers, marching two abreast, led by a single man on foot and a single man on horseback. Detailed embroidery and quilting stitches form the faces and clothing and other details of the pictures. On one corner of the center block the design depicts a pelican (bird of the South) knocking an eagle (bird of the North) off of a stump, indicating Susan's feelings about the war, family history says.

Above the stump, the quilting stitches take the form of a small hand with four lines of brown stitching pointing upward between the fingers, symbolizing, perhaps, her asking for God's guidance in the conflict. A yellow dog in the corner opposite

the stump represents a neighbor boy's dog that followed him as he marched off to war.

The flags and uniforms of the soldiers are unknown as to what they represent. A cannon and a stack of cannon balls are included in the center block.

The quilt was in the home of Mrs. P. P. Robb of Dimmitt before it was taken to the museum. She is the wife of the late P. P. Robb, a grandson of Susan Robb.

"There is certainly a lot of work that went into the making of the quilt. The quilting and applique stitches are very small and there is so much detail work," Mrs. Robb pointed out. "The feathers of the pelican and eagle are outlined in detail, and the wings of the smaller birds are outlined with stitching. Even the tiny stars on the

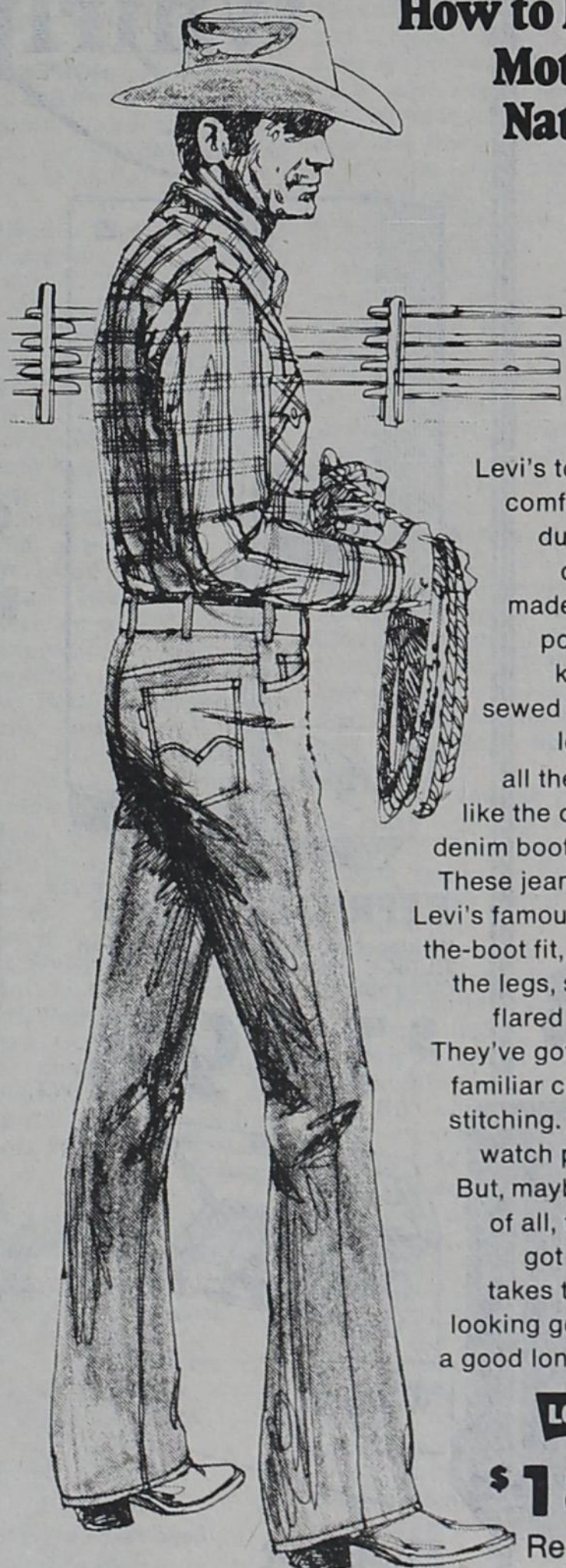
flags are stitched on."

Susan also stitched the name T. J. Robb into the quilting. He was her youngest son and the quilt was given to him after her older two step-sons died, one during the war and one in 1871.

Mrs. Robb related that while the T. J. Robb family was living near Sulphur Springs, Indian Territory in 1897, the quilt was stolen. T. J. advertised a reward for the return of the quilt. But one evening while bringing in the cows from the pasture, one of his sons found the quilt draped over a mesquite bush. It was undamaged except for one corner that had been slightly chewed by a cow.

"We're all glad that the quilt can now be kept safe in the museum where many people can see and enjoy its rich history," Mrs. Robb said.
