## Historic makeover: Harriet Tubman to be face on \$20 bill

 WASHINGTON — U.S. paper money is getting a historic makeover.  
 Harriet Tubman, an African-American abolitionist born into slavery, will be the new face on the \$20 bill.  
 The leader of the Under-

ground Railroad is replacing the portrait of Andrew Jackson, the nation's seventh president and a slave owner, who is being pushed to the back of the bill.  
 And Alexander Hamilton, the nation's first Treasury secretary who's enjoying a revival thanks to a hit Broad-

way play, will keep his spot on the \$10 note after earlier talk of his removal.  
 The changes are part of a currency redesign announced Wednesday by Treasury Secretary Jacob Lew, with the new \$20 marking two historic milestones: Tubman will become the first African-Amer-

ican on U.S. paper money and the first woman to be depicted on currency in 100 years.  
 "This gesture sends a powerful message, because of the tendency in American history, the background of excluding women and marginalizing them as national symbols," said Riche Rich-

ardson, associate professor in the Africana Studies and Research Center at Cornell University. "So even the symbolic significance of this cannot be overstated."  
 Lew also settled a backlash that had erupted after he had

## Family escapes injury in fire

Blaze consumes Sand Springs home

SAND SPRINGS — The investigation into a fire that destroyed a trailer house early Wednesday morning in the Sand Springs area is continuing, according to Howard County Volunteer Fire Department Chief Tommy Sullivan.  
 Sullivan said early indications point to a possible issue with wiring caused by a lightning strike, but added the cause of the fire was still under investigation.

The volunteer fire department received a call of a fire around 1 a.m. Wednesday in the Sand Springs area. No one was injured in the fire including the family of four living in the home.

"I live about a mile and half away from it," Sullivan said. "When I got the call...I walked out the door, went to the end of the road, and I could see the glow."

Nine Howard County fire units, one city of Big Spring unit, and an ambulance were called to the home, which was fully engulfed in flames when the first unit arrived on the scene, Sullivan said.

At one point, Sullivan said the flames reached 40-45 feet high. Firefighters were able to knock down the flames in about 30 to 35 minutes, saving nearby homes, and remained on the scene for about four hours.

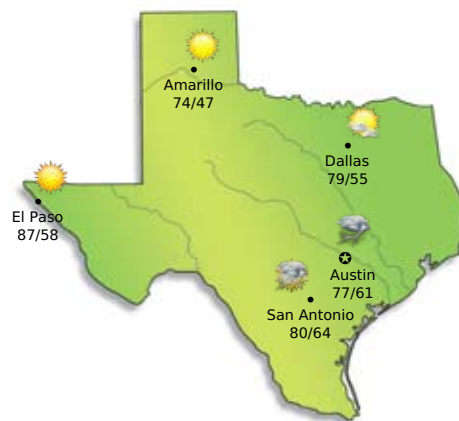

# News in brief

## Obama, Gulf allies meet in Saudi Arabia to discuss security

RIYADH, Saudi Arabia (AP) — President Barack Obama met Thursday with top officials from six Arab nations to discuss regional security issues in the Persian Gulf including the fight against the Islamic State militant group.

The meetings in Riyadh are meant to build on a similar summit convened last year at Camp David, the American president's Maryland retreat. They reflect an effort by the White House to reassure and coordinate with important but wary Mideast allies that harbor serious doubts about Obama's outreach to Iran and U.S. policy toward the grinding civil war in Syria.

Obama and officials from the U.S.-allied countries of the Gulf Cooperation Council opened up talks Thursday morning by posing for a group photo. The leaders, meeting around a circular table in an ornate meeting room in the Diriyah Palace, made polite conversation and smiled for cameras, but offered no remarks.

Defense Secretary Ash Carter, Secretary of State John Kerry, National Security Adviser Susan Rice and CIA Director John Brennan also attended the meeting.

The summit follows bilateral talks that Obama held with Saudi King Salman on Wednesday shortly after arriving in the kingdom. Besides Saudi Arabia, the GCC includes the United Arab Emirates, Qatar, Kuwait, Oman and Bahrain.

## Trump, Cruz feud shifts to luxury seaside resort

HOLLYWOOD, Fla. (AP) — The messy fight for the Republican presidential nomination is shifting to a luxury seaside resort in south Florida as Donald Trump and chief rival Ted Cruz quietly court party leaders ahead of another set of high-stakes delegate contests.

Cruz conceded publicly for the first time that he doesn't have enough support to claim the nomination before the party's summertime national convention, but he also vowed Wednesday to block Trump from collecting the necessary delegates as

well. The Texas conservative predicted a contested convention that many party loyalists fear could trigger an all-out Republican civil war.

"What's clear today is that we are headed to a contested convention," Cruz told reporters in between private meetings with Republican National Committee members gathered at the Diplomat Resort & Spa for the first day of their three-day annual spring meeting.

Campaigning in Indiana, Trump railed against his party's leadership, even as his senior lieutenants courted GOP officials behind closed doors in Florida.

"It's a rigged, crooked system that's designed so that the bosses can pick whoever they want and that people like me can't run and can't defend you against foreign nonsense," Trump charged at the Indiana State Fairgrounds.

## Paris climate deal on track for early start

UNITED NATIONS (AP) — About 160 countries are expected to sign the Paris Agreement on climate change Friday in a symbolic triumph for a landmark deal that once seemed unlikely but now appears on track to enter into force years ahead of schedule.

U.N. officials say the signing ceremony Friday will set a record for international diplomacy: Never before have so many countries inked an agreement on the first day of the signing period.

That could help pave the way for the pact to become effective long before the original 2020 deadline — possibly this year — though countries must first formally approve it through their domestic procedures.

"We are within striking distance of having the agreement start years earlier than anyone anticipated," Brian Deese, an adviser to President Barack Obama, said in a speech last week at Reed College in Portland, Oregon.

The U.S. and China, which together account for nearly 40 percent of global emissions, have said they intend to formally join the agreement this year. It will enter into force once 55 countries representing at least 55 percent of global emissions

have done so.

## Senate candidate bills campaign for family trip

INDIANAPOLIS (AP) — A Facebook page belonging to the wife of an Indiana congressman touted the family's visit to the Ronald Reagan presidential library in Simi Valley, California, with photos showing the two children by the conservative icon's grave and the couple in front of a "humble" wooden table where Reagan signed a massive tax cut.

Although a caption on one of the photos describes the trip as a "family vacation," documents obtained by The Associated Press show Rep. Marlin Stutzman's Senate campaign paid more than \$2,000 for the four airline tickets to Los Angeles and covered expenses for a van rental and Hilton hotel room recorded during the August trip. Federal Election Commission guidelines forbid the use of an official campaign fund for personal expenses.

On Wednesday, Stutzman campaign manager Josh Kelley said the candidate repaid the campaign fund last week for the family's portion of the trip after the AP began asking questions about it. Kelley said Stutzman was told last August by a campaign attorney that the trip was a "legitimate" campaign expense because Stutzman's wife and children joined him at some political functions, but he decided to repay it "in the interests of full disclosure."

The California visit represents just a small part of the over \$300,000 in flights, vehicle charges, meals and hotel stays Stutzman's campaign fund has spent since the tea party-backed Republican went to Washington in 2010 on a pledge to oppose special interests, an AP review found. That's roughly three times more than Rep. Todd Young, his GOP Senate rival in the May 3 primary who joined the House about the same time.

Regarding the six-day California trip, Kelley declined to elaborate about the political events he said the family attended, other than to say some included donors and constituents. Kelley said the Hilton expense was incurred in Indianapolis the night before the trip but provided no specifics.

announced an initial plan to remove Hamilton from the \$10 bill in order to honor a woman on the bill. Instead, the Treasury building on the back of the bill will be changed to commemorate a 1913 march that ended on the steps of the building. It will also feature suffragette leaders Lucretia Mott, Sojourner Truth, Susan B. Anthony, Elizabeth Cady Stanton and Alice Paul.

The back of the \$20, which now shows the White House, will be redesigned to include the White House and Jackson, whose statute stands across the street in Lafayette Park.

The \$5 bill will also undergo change: The illustration of the Lincoln Memorial on the back will be redesigned to honor "events at the Lincoln Memorial that helped to shape our history and our democracy."

The new image on the \$5 bill will include civil rights leader Martin Luther King Jr., who gave his famous "I have a dream" speech on the steps of the memorial in 1963, and Marian Anderson and Eleanor Roosevelt. Anderson, an African-American opera singer, gave a con-

cert at the memorial in 1939 after she had been blocked from singing at the then-segregated Constitution Hall. The Lincoln Memorial concert was arranged by Mrs. Roosevelt.

An online group, Women on 20s, said it was encouraged that Lew was responding to its campaign to replace Jackson with a woman. But it said it wouldn't be satisfied unless Lew committed to issuing the new \$20 bill at the same time that the redesigned \$10 bill is scheduled to be issued in 2020.

Lew didn't go that far Wednesday. But he pledged that at least the designs for all three bills will be accelerated so they'll be finished by 2020 — the 100th anniversary of passage of the 19th amendment giving women the right to vote. He said the new notes will go into circulation as fast as possible after that, consistent with the need to incorporate new anti-counterfeiting measures in the designs.

U.S. currency has undergone upgrades over the years to stay ahead of counterfeiters. But the updates proposed by Lew for the three bills would be the most sweeping changes since 1929, when all U.S. paper money was redesigned to feature more standard designs and a smaller size to save printing costs.

Lew had initially selected the \$10 bill to feature a woman because under the original timetable it was the next bill to be redesigned. But that proposal met fierce objections from supporters of Hamilton, who is enjoying renewed popular interest with the smash Broadway hit musical "Hamilton."

Tubman, who was born into slavery in the early part of the 19th century, escaped and then used the network of anti-slavery activists and safe houses known as the Underground Railroad to transport other slaves to freedom. After the Civil War, Tubman, who died in 1913, became active in the campaign for women's suffrage.

Numerous groups have been campaigning to have a woman honored on the nation's paper currency, which has been an all-male domain for more than a century.

Amrita Myers, a historian at Indiana University, said honoring Tubman was appropriate.

"Not only is this going to be the first African-American historical figure on U.S. currency, but it's a woman specifically from the era of slavery," Myers said.

Wednesday's announcement helped mark a decades-long decline in the reputation of Jackson, once a pillar of

the modern Democratic Party but now often defined by his ownership of slaves and the "Trail of Tears" saga that forcibly removed American Indians from their land.

Cherokee Nation Principal Chief Bill John Baker said in a statement that the currency move was a "small but meaningful vindication" for Native Americans.

The last woman featured on U.S. paper money was Martha Washington, who was on a dollar silver certificate from 1891 to 1896.

The only other woman ever featured on U.S. paper money was Pocahontas, from 1865 to 1869. Susan B. Anthony and Sacagawea are on dollar coins.

# Parent's Corner: Love, gizzards, and digestion

I have to smile when I think of my mother's older sister, but Aunt Ruby was a delight. She always had a smile and a funny story to tell to anyone who would listen. In my mind's ear I can still hear her say as any of us departed, "I love you with all my heart and half my gizzard!"

Recently these words came to me from out of nowhere, and I sat momentarily pondering Aunt Ruby's way of expressing her love. Then I couldn't keep from smiling as I thought about her words and the fact that she didn't have a gizzard to love me with; only birds have gizzards, but is that really so?

Exactly what is the function of the gizzard and what creatures possess them? I determined it was time to do a bit of research, and I discovered that the gizzard is the organ found in the digestive tract of several crea-

tures: birds, dinosaurs, crocodiles, alligators, earthworms, some crustaceans, a few fish, and even in certain insects and mollusks.

However, since we usually think of it in birds I will use that term to describe the process. When a bird swallows food, it goes from the throat to the esophagus. Some species have an expanded, thin-walled offshoot or pouch in the esophagus called the crop, or the craw, where they can store food before it's sent the rest of the way through the esophagus to the stomach.

Some birds, such as Pigeons and doves produce a food called crop milk in the crop for their young.

Birds have two parts to their stomach. The first is the glandular stomach, where digestive enzymes are secreted to begin the process of digestion. This part of the stomach is very much like our stomach. The second part of a bird's stomach, the part humans don't have, is the gizzard or sometimes called the muscular stomach.

Before food reaches the crushing machine of the gizzard, it goes down the esophagus, through a narrow glandular organ that resembles a stomach which produces digestive juices, and then into the gizzard. The arrangement varies with different species, but all birds and mammals have the same basic digestive system design as do we humans.

However the gizzard is used for grinding up and crushing food often aided by particles of stone or grit and the entire process is used to aid in digestion. This muscular tissue is very thick in some species, such as

ducks, chickens, grouse, quail, turkeys, emus, and doves. Most of these birds eat hard items such as seeds and nuts.

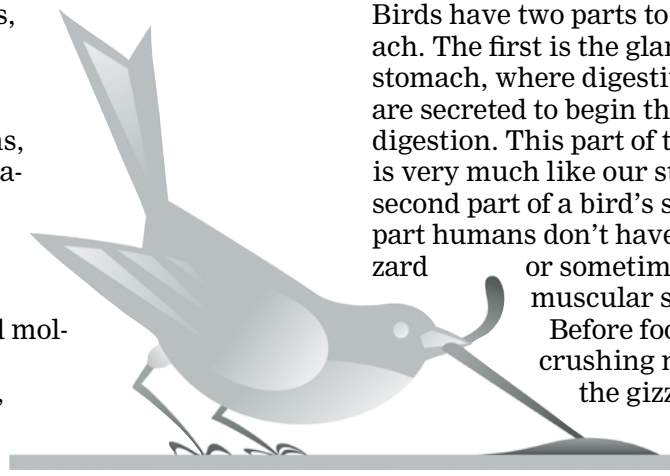
Birds with thick gizzards frequently pick up grit, or little stones, sand, and small shells, which collect in the gizzard. When food and digestive juices enter the gizzard, the thick muscles, together with the grit, help pulverize the food. The power of this internal organ is so remarkable that even glass objects and lead items can be pulverized.

In both chambers of the stomach, soft tissue from the prey is liquefied and then moves on to the intestines. Bones, teeth, feathers, and fur collect in the gizzard, and later coughed up. Now, since my research has enlightened me with such valuable information, I wonder if loving me with half her gizzard was all that good, but I can certainly understand what she meant when she would also remark, "I think that song is hung in my craw!"

## UAE tycoon launches largest Arab education fund with \$1.14 billion

DUBAI, United Arab Emirates (AP) — A billionaire businessman from the United Arab Emirates launched the Arab world's largest education fund on Wednesday, setting aside \$1.14 billion (4.2 billion dirhams) in grants for under served youth from the region.

The Abdulla al-Ghurair Foundation for Education said it plans to provide scholarships for 15,000 Middle Eastern students over the next 10 years. The recipients will be students in need of financial assistance who also qualify for entrance to the region's top universities.

Fund Chairman Abdul Aziz al-Ghurair said his family has allocated a third of their wealth for the initiative. He said the endowment is likely to grow over the coming years as the family's business revenues increase, with the scholarship fund intended to continue well beyond its initial

10-year mark.

"It has to be significant in size. It has to make an impact in the region," al-Ghurair told *The Associated Press*, describing the foundation as a "perpetual endowment."

The al-Ghurair family has stakes in a number of businesses, including the Dubai-based Mashreq Bank, as well as in iron and steel, packaging, cement and insurance companies.

In the presence of Dubai ruler Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, the foundation signed its first agreements Wednesday with The American University in Cairo, The American University of Beirut, The American University of Sharjah and Khalifa University in Abu Dhabi.

The first batch of students will be receiving scholarships as early as this upcoming fall semester, said the fund's CEO Maysa Jalbout.

"We're looking to have young people who are well-rounded,

who can think critically, who are creative," Jalbout told the AP. "We're hoping to help them enter the top universities, both in the region and globally, so that they can be competitive and be able to compete on a global level for the jobs of the future."

More than half of the 369 million people living in the Middle East are under 25 years old, but unemployment runs high in part because many do not have access to quality education or jobs.

According to a Brookings Institute paper co-written by Jalbout and Columbia University doctoral candidate Samar Farah, Arab governments have struggled to meet the needs of young people, with the pace of development trailing behind.

The Middle East had the world's highest youth unemployment rates in 2014, with 46 percent of women and 24 percent of men unemployed, according to the International Labor Organization.

## McAllen ISD debuts McTalks, series of talks to inspire students

McALLEN — As high school seniors Diana Dominguez and Lizbeth Fernandez get ready for graduation, they are feeling the pressure.

They both plan to start their higher education at the University of Texas Rio Grande Valley and are considering careers in the medical field. But they have felt weighed down at the idea of maintaining high grades before and while in college to make it into medical school.

That pressured was eased Friday, after hearing a doctor from McAllen school district talk about his own experiences during and after high school.

"My story is certainly not glamorous in high school," Dr. Jay Shapira told the students. "I'm talking to you guys who are not the coolest kids. I'm talking to you guys who are not the best students ... Realize one thing at this point, just one thing, one message: Hard work — that's all it takes."

Shapira graduated from McAllen High School and returned to the school as one of the first McTalk, a McAllen school district series modeled after the famous TED talks and aimed at inspiring students across the district.

Shapira is a cardiologist and clinical professor at Cedars-Sinai Heart Institute in Los Angeles.

"Hearing them speak gave me a vision of what I'm getting ready to

encounter," Fernandez said. "I had that fear of as soon as I got there my priorities had to be 'A's, 'A's, 'A's. But as soon as (Shapira) said, 'My first semester was OK. My second semester was worst,' I was like I have hope. I'm OK if this happens. I can always step back up and keep going ahead."

Also speaking to the 550 high school students from across the district, were Linda McGurk, principal at Milam Elementary, and Dr. Mario Luis Ramirez, a Memorial High School graduate and former United States Air Force flight surgeon and emergency physician.

This first McTalk was focused on career goals and what students can expect after graduation. The district live-streamed the event and bused in high school seniors

from Memorial, Rowe, Achieve and Lamar high schools.

All three speakers happened to be in town to be honored at the McAllen Education Foundation third annual fundraiser happening Saturday.

Interim Superintendent Jose Gonzalez said they wanted to take the opportunity to introduce the three honorees to students, especially seniors who are about to leave the district to hopefully move on to college.

"We knew that people within our city and specifically within our district were making an impact on communities across the world," Gonzalez said. "The main message that we hope our students take away is that everyone has dreams but dreams without goals are just dreams."

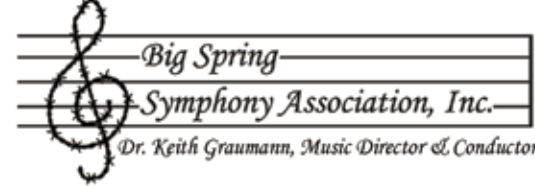

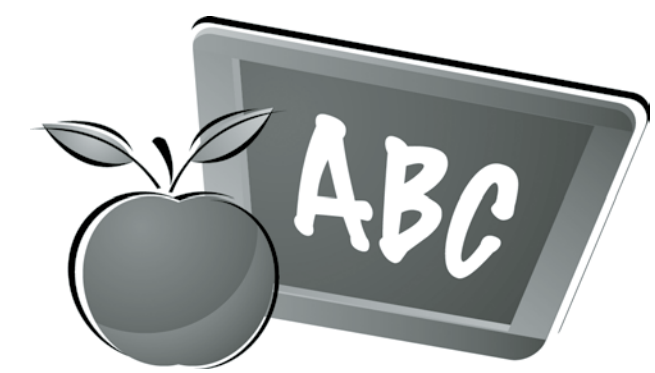

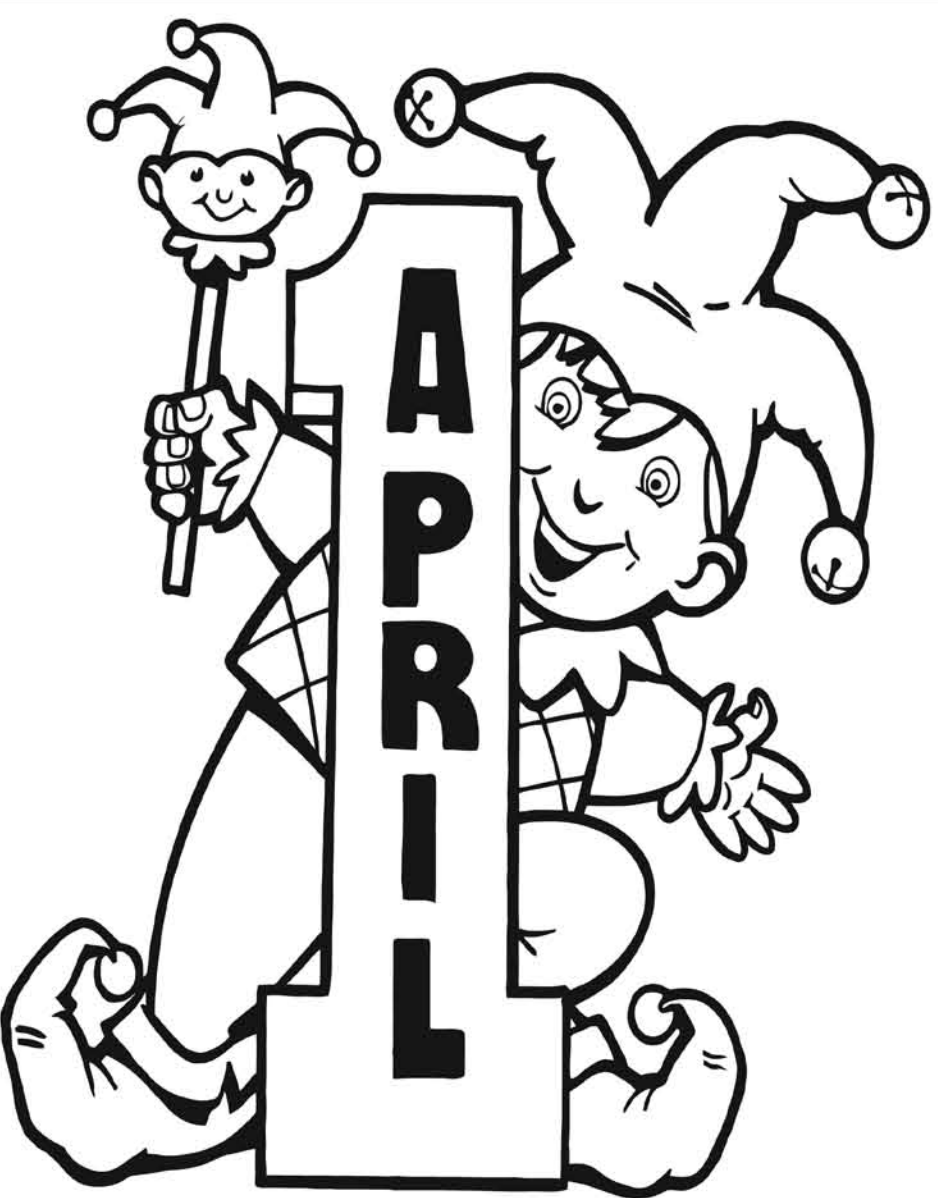

Instead, people delivered mail by horseback, train and ship. One of the most well-known horseback mail delivery services was the Pony Express.



The Pony Express started in St. Joseph, MO, on April 3, 1860. There were stations set up between Missouri and California, where riders could change horses. Most riders traveled 60 to 75 miles at a time.

For 15 an ounce, Pony Express riders promised to deliver mail to California within 10 days. The Pony Express remained in business until 1861 when the telegraph reached the West.

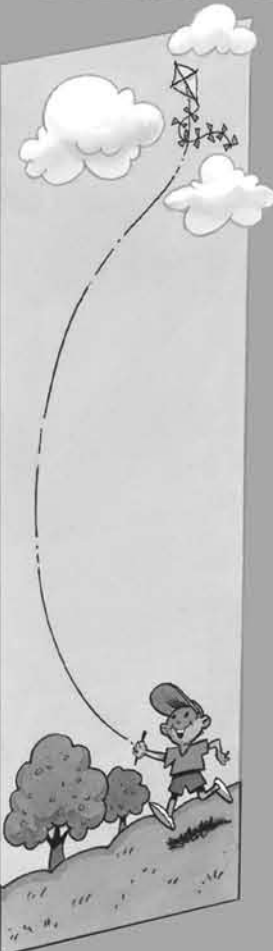

### Eagles get No. 2 pick

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Desperate for a franchise quarterback, the Philadelphia Eagles can get their man. Soon.

The Cleveland Browns will wait for their guy.

The Eagles acquired the No. 2 overall pick in next week's draft from Cleveland in exchange for five picks on Wednesday. The Browns are getting Philadelphia's first-round pick this year (No. 8), a third-round pick (No. 77) and fourth-rounder (No. 100), plus a first-rounder in 2017 and a second-rounder in 2018.

Cleveland also sends a fourth-round pick in 2017 to the Eagles.

"It's a tough price to pay," said Howie Roseman, Philadelphia's executive vice president of football operations. "We're very sure we're going to get the player we want. We've spent a ton of time investigating these guys and looked at the quarterback market going forward, and this is a rare opportunity we're in."

The trade allows Philadelphia to select one of the top quarterback prospects, Carson Wentz of North Dakota State or Jared Goff of California at No. 2. The Los Angeles Rams already acquired the top overall pick from Tennessee for a slew of picks and have indicated they will take a quarterback.

It is the fourth time the top two selections in the draft have been dealt.

"These guys are pretty even," Eagles coach Doug Pederson said of Wentz and Goff. "From all the physical tools, both of them are extremely gifted. Good arm strength, good mobility. Obviously, Carson is a little bigger, maybe a little better athlete right now. There's not much separating those two."

The Eagles signed Sam Bradford to a \$35 million, two-year contract in March. Roseman said he'll be the starter. They also signed backup Chase Daniel to a \$21 million, three-year deal. But Roseman couldn't resist an opportunity to move up after acquiring the No. 8 pick from Miami for cornerback Byron Maxwell, linebacker Kiko Alonso and the 13th overall pick.

"We're going to invest in quarterbacks," Roseman said. "The key to being championship caliber over a long period of time is quarterbacks."

The last time the Eagles drafted a quarterback in the first round was 1999 when Andy Reid took Donovan McNabb at No. 2. McNabb led Philadelphia to five NFC championship

### Astros help Hamels' 10th straight win

ARLINGTON, Texas (AP) — The Houston Astros wanted to get to Cole Hamels early. They simply gave away several chances to do it.

The Texas ace hit the first two Houston batters of the game, the Astros had three straight singles to start the second inning and a leadoff hit in the third.

But Houston didn't score after making an out on the bases in each inning, and Hamels ended up extending his career-best winning streak to 10 games while getting a two-run home run from Rougned Odor in the Rangers' 2-1 victory Wednesday night.

"We talked about before the game where you've got to get to him early if you get a chance to," Houston manager A.J. Hinch said. "We did a really good job of creating havoc for him. We just didn't do anything with it."

Hamels (3-1) had never hit more than two batters in a game, and ended up with a career-high three. That included Jose Altuve twice — to start and end the left-hander's outing.

"I don't think I've hit more than two guys in a game and I definitely just

broke that record," Hamels said. "But to lead off a game, it's not what you want to do."

Doug Fister (1-2) allowed Odor's second homer in the second inning as the Astros lost their ninth straight at the Rangers. But the right-hander went six innings for the first time in three starts for Houston, allowing two runs on five hits.

"That's the best that Doug's been as an Astro," Hinch said. "I was very im-

pressed with how he went about it."

Hamels allowed rookie Tyler White's fifth home run in the sixth but combined with reliever Sam Dyson to strand the tying run at third with one out in the seventh.

Jake Diekman got called third strikes on Colby Rasmus and Evan Gattis with the tying run at second in the eighth, and closer Shawn Tolleson pitched the ninth for his fifth save.

In addition to three hit batters, Hamels walked three and gave up five hits with seven strikeouts in 6 2/3 innings. But the Astros helped him survive.

White took a called third strike on a double steal in the first, and Texas catcher Bryan Holaday threw behind the lead runner to get George Springer easily at second.

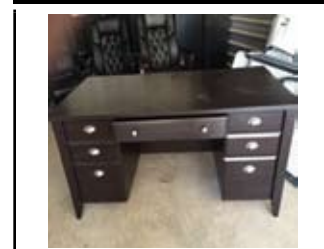

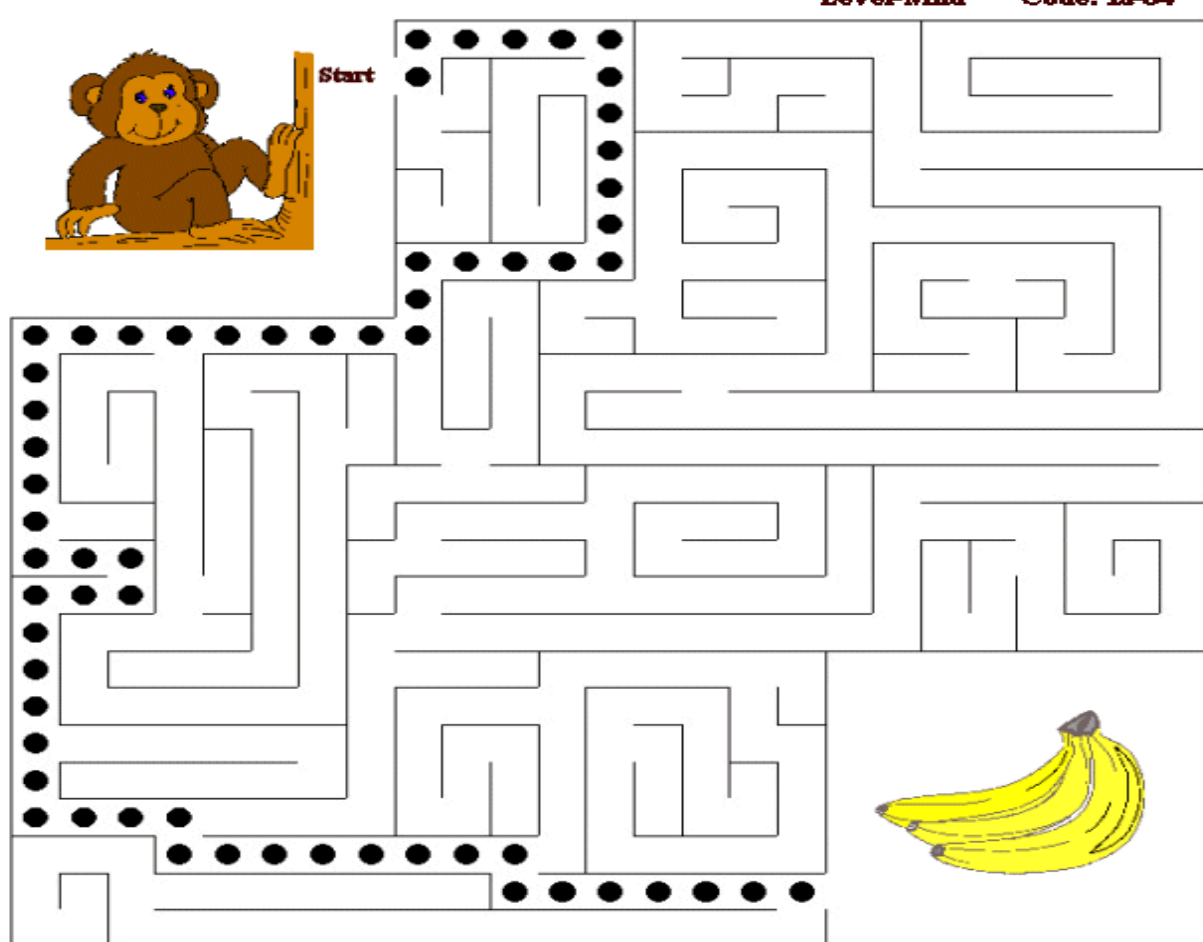

In some deals, the outcome depends on how well declarer manages his trumps. Such hands can be complicated and hard to play because declarer must look nine or 10 tricks ahead. But even these difficult cases usually work out well if declarer merely does what comes naturally.

For example, take this case where West leads a trump against five dia-

monds. South is immediately faced with the question of where to win the first trick and how to proceed thereafter.

Declarer should almost instinctively win the trump lead with the ace and try to take advantage of dummy's heart length. Accordingly, declarer leads a heart to the ace at trick two, ruffs a heart and cashes the A-K of clubs, discarding two spades from dummy. He then ruffs a club, ruffs a heart and leads a diamond to dummy's king, learning that West has a trump trick coming. South now ruffs a heart with his last trump, producing this position:

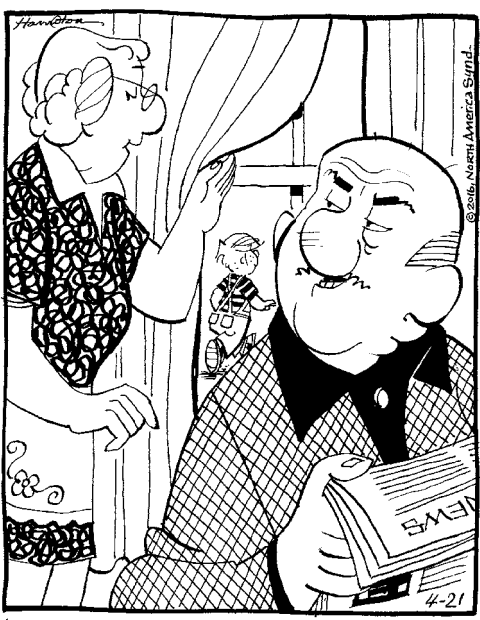

When declarer ruffs the jack of clubs in dummy and plays the established jack of hearts, West is helpless. If he ruffs, he must return a spade and hand declarer his 11th trick; if he discards instead, South automatically acquires his 11th trick.

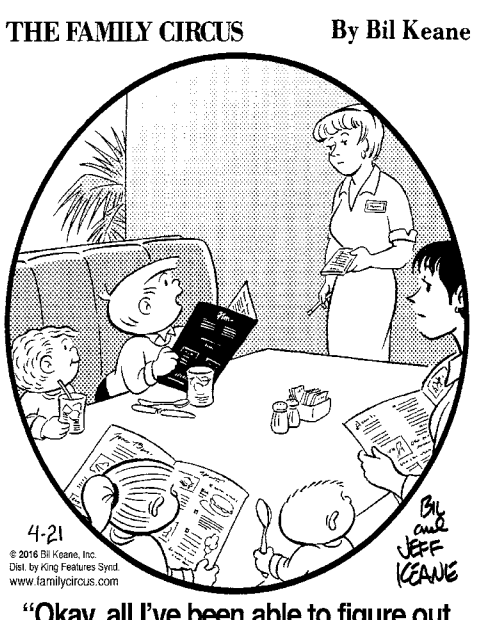

This Date In History

Today is Thursday, April 21, the 112th day of 2016. There are 254 days left in the year.

Today's Highlight in History:

On April 21, 1926, Britain's Queen Elizabeth II was born in Mayfair, London; she was the first child of The Duke and Duchess of York, who later became King George VI and the Queen Mother. Christened Elizabeth Alexandra Mary, the princess became monarch upon the death of her father in 1952, beginning a 64-year-old reign surpassing that of Queen Victoria.

On this date:

In 1649, the Maryland Toleration Act, providing for freedom of worship for all Christians, was passed by the Maryland assembly.

In 1789, John Adams was sworn in as the first vice president of the United States.

In 1816, Charlotte Bronte, author of "Jane Eyre," was born in Thornton, England.

In 1836, an army of Texans led by Sam Houston defeated the Mexicans at San Jacinto, assuring Texas independence.

In 1910, author Samuel Langhorne Clemens, better known as Mark Twain, died in Redding, Connecticut, at age 74.

In 1930, fire broke out inside the overcrowded Ohio Penitentiary in Columbus, killing 332 inmates.

In 1940, the quiz show that asked the "\$64 question," "Take It or Leave It," premiered on CBS Radio.

In 1955, the Jerome Lawrence-Robert Lee play "Inherit the Wind," inspired by the Scopes trial of 1925, opened at the National Theatre in New York.

In 1960, Brazil inaugurated its new capital, Brasilia, transferring the seat of national government from Rio de Janeiro.

In 1976, clinical trials of the swine flu vaccine began in Washington, D.C.

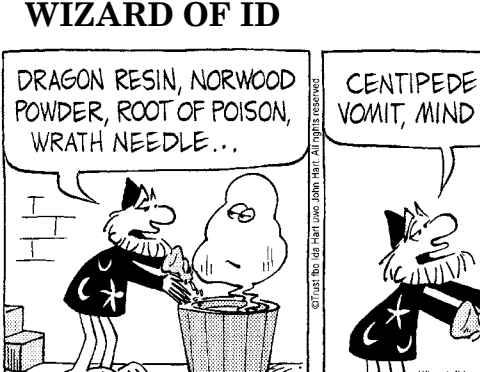
In 1996, oddsmaker Jimmy "The Greek" Snyder died in Las Vegas at age 77.

Indiana has contained All-Star guard DeMar DeRozan but not center Jonas Valanciunas, who is averaging 17.5 points and 17 rebounds and has sparked Toronto's 32-15 advantage on the offensive glass.

There will be fewer rebounds to get if DeRozan and Kyle Lowry start hitting.

Cleveland may still be able to get a quarterback — possibly Memphis' Paxton Lynch — in the draft, but it won't be one of the top two guys. After the Rams leaped from No. 15 to No. 1, the Browns were no longer going to have their choice of Goff or Wentz.

The Browns recently signed Robert

Griffin III, making it easier to trade the second pick. Griffin signed a two-year, \$15 million contract and was viewed as a "bridge" QB until the team develops a young player.

The Browns' new front office led by Sashi Brown has placed heavy emphasis on analytics in preparing for this year's draft and putting together Cleveland's roster. With so many needs, the Browns chose to accumulate as many picks as possible to fill holes on both sides of the ball.

"These picks will play a major role in building our team for long-term sustained success," Brown said. "We want to assemble a young nucleus of talented players and this trade positions us really well. There is a good depth of talent in the first round and we felt we could make a larger impact to our roster by adding more draft picks and that's why we made the decision to trade down."

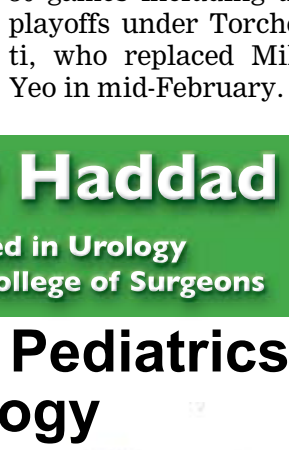
