Glen A. Lindsey, county agent, this morning started delivery of cotton options taken by Floyd County farmers in the 1933 cotton acreage reduction program.

Farmers wishing to sell options may do so by signing, dating them and mailing to Washington, D. C. The difference is 6 cents per pound and the present market price on the date specified, will be sent them. Approximately \$107,000.00 in options is coming to Floyd County.

Farmers not wishing to sell his options may borrow four cents per pound on options providing he agrees to go into the new cotton reduction program.

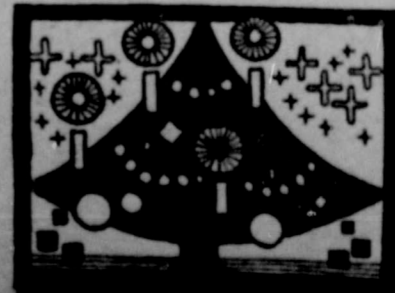

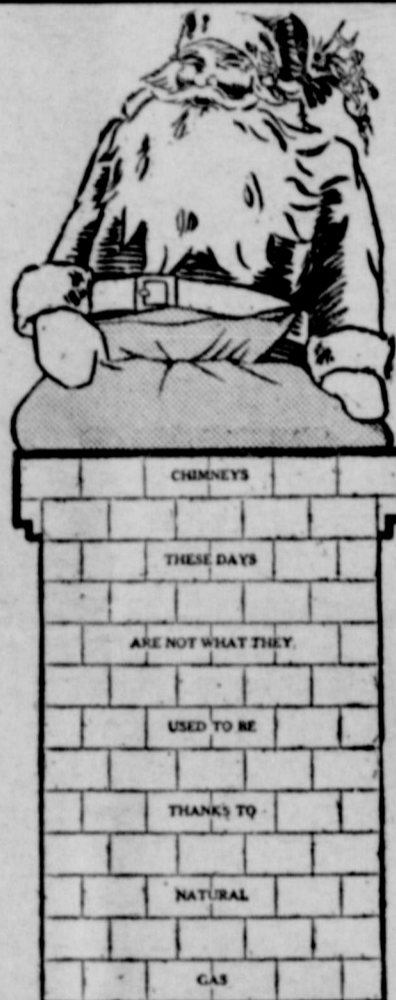
