PORTLAND, June Sth-After more than two years of preparation, and the expenditure of \$5,000,000 the Lewis and Clark Exposition opened its gates to the public on June the 1th, and the public thronged the grounds. The day was made a legal holiday in Oregon, Washington and Idaho and every business house in Portland was closed. Visitors to the Exposition on the opening day found the Fair much better prepared than any previous enterprise of the kind has been, and were pleased with the general appearence of things. The Exposition site, which embraces 406 acres, is composed of hill and dale, with a little lake and peninsula in the latter on which the United States govtructures are located. 
