PRESIDENT REAGAN'S announcement this week concerning the plan for the MX Missile system to be located in Wyoming ended several years of debate and speculation as to where the controversial defense

system would be located. At one point during the Carter Administration, one plan had been advanced to locate the system in Eastern New Mexico and West Texas, which brought howls of protest from the farming community, which saw that plan as a threat to the area's farmland.

The later plan, which included the proposed "Dense Pack" system, was considered a possibility for Eastern New Mexico. From a security standpoint, since Clovis already has Cannon Air Base, the addition of the MX might not have been that bad a deal, considering the impact that it would have had on the Clovis area economy

But the decision has now been made, subject to the approval of congress, which still will have the final say-so in regard to the MX proposition.

There has been some opposition all along to the MX Missile system in congress. Some say that the system is out of date, before the engineering even begins. Others argue that rather than locate our missiles in a place easy to chart by an enemy, we should come up with a system of placing them on submarines, or have airplanes capable of launching defense missiles.

So, the MX missile system will be one which faces considerable debate in congress.

It is really tough to know what to do. The president's argument that we need some type of system, to serve as a deterrent to the Soviets, and to give our country more "bargaining chips" in international talks, is reasonable.

But the final decision by congress may come down to the fact of whether or not the MX is, as President Reagan calls it "The

Missile for the Times.' The debate has (as usual), already begun on television and in the mass media, which sees themselves as the nation's problem solvers. Hopefully, congress will take its time in addressing the matter, and attempt to get the feelings of their constituents on the matter.

THE NFL STRIKE is apparently over, and for millions of Americans, watching football on Sunday afternoons has returned as a pasttime. Even though yours truly has promised to cut down on the amount of time spent in front of the "boob tube," I just had to catch Sunday's Dallas Cowboy game, for "research purposes."

What I discovered was an angle which had been overlooked by all the experts and commentators on the game. They were all worried about the quality of play, and whether or not there might be injuries, due to the eight-week layoff; how crisp the play would be, etc., etc.

The thing that was overlooked was whether or not the game officials (the guys who are charged with throwing flags) would be at their peak. After watching the Dallas game, my conclusion was that the players seemed to perform much better than expected, both on offense and defense.

But the guys who throw the flags must have had their minds on those rose beds they had started digging during the strike, or how they were going to get some other project finished up. They definitely weren't watching the same game I was.

Christmas Project **Kicks Off Here**

Modern Study Club will sponsor "Project Christmas Card" in Friona for the 27th consecutive year, it was announced this week.

The project benefits Parmer County Community Hospital during the Christmas season each year, and in the course of its previous 26 years has raised over \$52,000 to purchase equipment for the local hospital.

Equipment which cost over \$37,500 has been provided in the past eleven years by gifts to the project. Last year the project raised \$4,004.61, which provided a new "call" system for nurses on duty.

Linda Murphree, chairman of Project Christmas Card for 1982, said that the money raised this year will go to purchase a warming table for the hospital's delivery room.

Cost of the table is expected to be around \$3,000. Any money left over will be placed in a special account which is to be started for a new X-Ray machine for the hospital.

Administrator Elda Hart said the hospital's current X-Ray machine was bought in about 1946, and is beginning to feel its age. It had to be repaired recently, and it isn't known just how long it will last. A new machine is expected to cost between \$40,000 and \$50,000.

It was felt that if a special account was started for the X-Ray machine, individuals might want to contribute to it.

Residents of the area are requested each year by Modern Study Club to donate to the fund rather than mailing Christmas cards to local

Names of those contributing are published on a full-page in the Christmas edition of the Friona Star, as a community-wide greeting to everyone in the area, as well as those outside the area who receive the paper. The Star donates the full page to the project each year.

Donations may be left at Friona State Bank. Club members also will place containers at a number of local businesses, where residents, may leave their donations.

Deadline for donating to the fund and being a part of this year's project will be Wednesday, December 15.

There is no set amount for the donations, but each person or family is requested to donate at least the amount of money they would normally spend on Christmas cards and postage, mailing to friends and relatives.

Mrs. Murphree, chairman of the 1982 project, has as members of her committee Laverne Burrow, Mary Moseley and Sherri Taylor.

Posters and containers are to be placed in local businesses Friday, November 26.

In recent years, the project fund has purchased a heart monitoring unit, automatic beds for the new

Also, a Coulter counter, a monitor for the surgery room, a spirometer (a device to measure pulmonary functions for lung patients), I.V. drip counters, a table and carts for the operating room and a new light for the emergency room.

Beginning in 1970, the project has selected a particular object or need for its funds, and in that time has purchased equipment costing roughly





Applications Now Accepted For Windbreak Seedlings

Applications are now being accepted for windbreak seedlings from the Texas Forest Service.


These seedlings, grown from seed collected in West Texas and eastern New Mexico, are produced in the Service's greenhouse in Lubbock and in a field nursery near Halfway.

Conifer species available this season include Austrian pine, ponderosa pine, Arizona cypress, redcedar and Scotch pine. These containerized seedlings cost \$1 each but are sold only in multiples of 30 seedlings.

Hardwood species include bur oak, green ash, honeylocust, mulberry, native plum and Russian olive. These bare root seedlings are priced at \$25 per hundred. Minimum orders of 100 seedlings will be accepted, but applicants may order 50 of one species and 50 of another. Applicants must also add a four per cent states sales tax to the purchase price.

Seedlings ordered now will be ready for pickup and planting in March 1983. Tree seedlings sold by the Texas Forest Service may not be used for landscaping or ornamental purposes.

For applications and information on windbreaks, contact the Texas Forest Service, Route 3, Box 216, Lubbock, Texas 79401, (806) 746-5801. Applications are also available from county offices of the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Conservation Service, Agricultural Extension Agents.







Lila Vars Is Named **Development Director**

Lila Vars, who has worked as associate registrar at West Texas State University, Canyon, for the past eight years, has been appointed as the new director of development at WTSU.

She assumed the duties as the major fund-raiser of the university immediately following appointment.

Dr. Don Cates, dean of admissions and registrar, said a replacement in the Registrar's Office will be hired "as soon as possible," although the title and duties may vary

'She's been such a valuable person to this office that she'll be a difficult person to replace," he said.

Vars will be the second director of development at WTSU. The position was created in 1973 when Keith Winter became director of development. He was involved in recruiting and fund-raising, in addition to several other activities until he resigned in August to join a community development firm in Dallas.

She will raise funds for the university as she travels throughout the Panhandle region. She will be responsible for the President's Development Fund and the Endowment for Excellence. The Development Office also administers a number of memorial scholarship funds. She also will serve in an advisory capacity to the WTSU Foundation, whose members are Panhandle area residents who assist WTSU administrators with fundraising.

"This is a role of continuing importance to West Texas State University," said Dr. Gail Shannon, WTSU president. "Mrs. Vars, in her role of associate registrar, built an outstanding reputation in her relationship with students, faculty, academic administrators, prospective students and parents.

"Her fine background should permit her to move ahead immediately in various areas of fund development that are critical in the growing life of WTSU.

A graduate of Friona High School and Texas Tech University with a bachelor's degree in education, Vars taught at schools in Lubbock and Canyon before joining the registrar's staff at WTSU in 1974. In addition to her duties as associate registrar, she served as director of the Office of Programs for Women for two years and was chairperson of the governing board of the Children's Center. She was instrumental in establishing a location for the Children's Center at the WTSU Fieldhouse and beginning the center for the care and instruction of children of WTSU students, faculty and staff members.

She also traveled as a recruiter. Since August, she has supervised the activities of the WTSU Campus Services students, who serve as

phone campaign. The total is beyond the \$40,000 goal.

She is a member of the Alpha Delta Pi sorority Alumnae Association, an honorary member of Scribes Honor Society, a member of Wives, Etc., and Women Involved in New Goals and chaired three Texas Panhandle Distinguished Services Awards luncheons.
