Commissioners In Shortened Session

Parmer County Commissioners considered an abbreviated agenda on Monday at their regular meeting. The agenda was shortened due to the death of Commissioner Tom Lewellen of Precinct 1.

In the first item of business, the commissioners were given reports from officials in charge of the Running Water Draw dam site number three near Lazbuddie. It was reported that much of the delay has been caused by certain tests made concerning the structure.

It was also reported that the bid for construction of the structure should be awarded in December of this year.

The court was to consider bids for a new road grader for Precinct 1, but due to Commissioner Lewellen's death, a motion was passed to reject

all bids at this time, with further action postponed until after January 1, 1977.

George Wall, district highway engineer from Lubbock, attended the meeting and gave the commissioners an update on the situation facing the Texas Highway Department.

Wall said that the highway department is having trouble operating under the present budget system, with inflation being a big cause of the trouble.

It appears that the state's Farm to Market highways can probably be continued at their present level, due to \$15 million being designated for this purpose.

However, Wall said that it appears that interstate road construction will have to be almost stopped, and that highways similar to Highway 60 in Parmer County will only be rebuilt or reconstructed as a two-lane road within the next 20 years, unless the situation changes.

The annual inspection date for the dam site near Bovina is to be September 13, it was announced. The commissioners unanimously adopted the following resolution, to be made a part of the court's minutes:

"The Commissioners Court of Parmer County humbly desires to pay tribute and recognition to Thomas Lewellen, Commissioner of Precinct No. 1 and a member of this Court until his death in the early morning hours of this the 23rd day of August, 1976.

"From the time of his first taking office, almost 16 years ago, Thomas Lewellen was a dedicated public servant and devoted his time, energy and resources to his County and his Precinct. His devotion to the responsibility that goes with the office was always foremost in his mind. He knew and did his job well, thereby gaining the respect and admiration of all members of the Commissioners Court as well as all others within his precinct and county.

"His counsel, guidance, and experience will be greatly missed by the Commissioners Court. Yes, Thomas Lewellen will be sorely missed by his wife and family, his church and community, and by the members of the Commissioners Court of Parmer County. The memory of Thomas Lewellen will always be an inspiration to all who knew him."

SWPS Station Burning Coal

Brac Biggers, division manager for SPS in Amarillo, has announced that Southwestern Public Service Company is now burning coal at its new Harrington Station northeast of Amarillo.

This is the first time in the modern history of the company that coal has been used to fuel the boilers that produce steam at Southwestern's power plants. The low-sulphur coal

is brought in from Wyoming in 110 car unit trains on a twice-a-week schedule and will be used at the rate of 3500 tons per day when the generating unit is operating at capacity.

Construction of the second 350,000 kilowatt generating unit is underway at Harrington Station with completion scheduled for 1978. Plans call for additional coal-fired units to be in service in 1980, 1982, and 1984.
