One bedroom at the fort is called the Susan Magoffin room. It was her that nineteen year old Susan Shelby
Magoffin stayed for about two week while accompanying her brand new husband on a trip to Santa Fe and on into Old Mexico. I had brushed
shoulders with Susan many times bu shoulders with Susan many times but
standing in her room at Bent's Fort standing in her room at Bent's Fort
made me realize that I knew very little about her.
The above mentioned book gave as
a reference "Down the Sants a reference "Down the Santa Fe Trail
and Into Mexico" --the diary of Susan and Into Mexico"--the diary of Susan
during parts of 1846 and 1847 . Edited by Stella M. Drumm, published by Yale University Press in 1926, it is a true account that proves again the
