## Club Sponsors Card Project

OVER THE WEEKEND I was thumbing through the current issue of one of my favorite magazines, when I noticed a rather provocative article about the American political scene. The magazine offered some rather interesting suggestions, and in view of the 1980 presidential campaigns coming up soon, we decided to pass along some of these innovative ideas to our readers. See what you think of them.

Political candidates shall not be allowed to receive campaign contributions from individuals or large corporations. However, they will be allowed to finance their campaigns by driving a cab or panhandling on the street.

Outside interests in large corporations, real estate ventures or the stock market will be forbidden to all politicians. However they will be allowed to moonlight as garbage men, soda jerkers, gas station attendants or something equally suitable.

The President of the U.S. will receive a minimum wage (\$2.65 an hour) and, at the end of his term, will be "tipped" by the American public. Tips will not be allowed to exceed \$5.00 per person (since that's too small to be considered a bribe.)

The salaries of the President, his cabinet members, and all members of Congress will not be raised in accordance with the rising cost of living, since it's their job to keep it down in the first place.

In order to prove their dedication to their job, all politicians will be forced to take a "vow of poverty" before entering office.

Because congressmen have a tendency to fall asleep while on the job, a Surprise Quiz will be given at the end of each daily session of Congress, and the results will be published.

A fine of \$50.00 per word will be charged to all candidates who use five-syllable words where a two-syllable word (or less) would do just as well.

Government agencies will no longer be allowed to spend tax dollars for any reason whatsoever without first having to ask permission from each and every taxpayer.

Any politician claiming to be "one of the common people" will be required to live among the "common people" in a slum neighborhood while serving his full term of office.

Expense allowances for Congressmen will not exceed \$149.50 per week. If they can't manage their budget, why should they be allowed to manage ours?

All political candidates will be obliged to draw up a contract explaining in outline form what they plan to do if elected. And at the end of their terms, they will be paid a flat fee for every promise that wasn't broken.

Congressmen, Governors, Mayors and Supreme Court Judges will not be given bodyguards or Secret Servicemen since it's their job to keep the streets safe to begin with.

When they retire, all politicians will receive the same type of pension that is given to the average school teacher, coal miner, auto worker, clerk, etc.

Modern Study Club will sponsor "Project Christmas Card" in Friona for the 24th consecutive year, the club announced this week.

The project benefits Parmer County Community Hospital during the Christmas season each year, and in the course of its history has raised over \$42,000 for equipment for the local hospital.

Equipment which cost over \$29,400 has been provided in the past nine years by gifts to the project.

Residents of the area are requested by the club each year to donate to the fund rather than mailing Christmas cards to local friends. Names of those contributing are published on a full page in the Christmas edition of the Friona Star, as a community-wide greeting to everyone in the Friona area.

Donations may be left at Friona State Bank. Club members will also place containers at several local businesses, where residents may leave their donations.

Deadline for donating to the fund and being a part of this year's project will be Saturday, December 15.

There is no set amount for the donations, but each person or family is requested to donate at least the amount of money they would normally spend on Christmas cards and postage, mailing to local friends.

Laverne Burrow, chairman for the event for the second straight year, says that the drive will be made to purchase a table and carts for the hospital's operating room, and a new light for the emergency room. Cost of these items will be around \$2,000, which is approximately what the drive raised in 1978.

Mrs. Burrow and her committee, consisting of Eva Miller, Carol Ellis and Sandra Nichols, were busy this week making posters, which will be placed in local businesses on Monday of next week.

Project Christmas Card was started in 1956, and in the 23 years since its beginning, has contributed to making Parmer County Community Hospital one of the most modern and well-equipped medical facilities in the area.

In recent years, the fund has purchased a heart monitoring unit, automatic beds for the new hospital wing, heating and air conditioning for the emergency and surgery rooms, fire alarm system for the building, an anesthetic machine, a Coulter counter, a monitor for the surgery room, a spirometer (a device to measure pulmonary functions for lung patients), and I.V. drip counters.

Beginning in 1970, the project has selected a particular object or need for its funds each year, and in that time has purchased equipment costing \$29,600.

Project Christmas Card has become a fine way for residents of the area, and even former residents, to say "Merry Christmas" to their friends, and at the same time assist the local hospital.

## United Fund Tops 100 %

Friona's 1979 United Fund drive topped the 100 per cent mark this week.

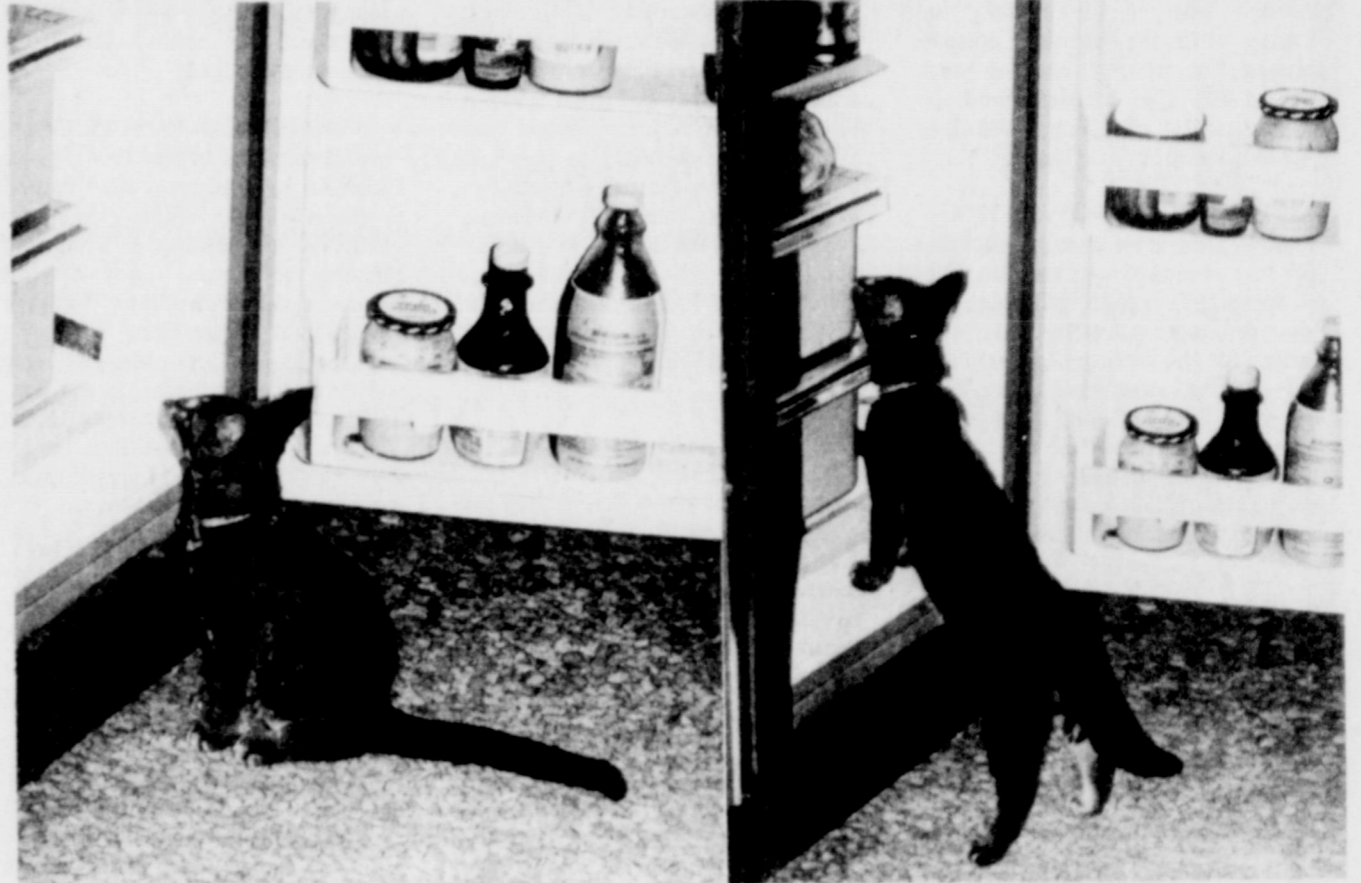
Co-chairmen Danny Kendrick and Larry Knowles reported that as of Wednesday noon, a total of \$10,934 had been deposited at Friona State Bank. This represented 103 per cent of the 1979 goal.

"We might still receive additional funds which could run the total up another three or four per cent, because we know of some workers who have not reported," Knowles said.

Knowles said that by topping the goal, the designated gift deductions could be paid, and assure that every agency receives 100 per cent.

"We are real pleased with the results of the drive. Everyone pitched in and worked real hard. It's a good feeling to make the goal, and do it in fairly short order," Knowles said.

He and Kendrick voiced their appreciation to all who helped in any way with the drive.

Two of the leaders in the Friona Star's football contest proved that they are going to be tough during the stretch run of the contest by posting impressive scores during the 11th week of the contest.

Jerry Hinkle scored a 20, to forge into a two-point lead, and Richard Wilson had a 19, to take over second place. Hinkle has a score of 178, which now paces the field, and Wilson is next with a score of 176.

Hinkle's only misses were in picking Texas Tech over SMU, and Pittsburgh over San Diego. Wilson mis-fired on Tulia over Floydada, Miami over Cleveland and Pittsburgh over San Diego.

C.H. Veazey, who had been in a tie with Hinkle for first place going into last weekend, had a score of 16, and fell to third place, with a score of 174.

Steve Clark holds onto fourth place with a score of 173, after posting a score of 17 for the week. James Clark and Ron Smiley are next at 171.

Scores in the contest were considerably better the past week, as evidenced by the fact that the two leaders' scores were so high.

The weekly winner, Ted Procter,

claimed the season's best score with a total of 21 of the 22 games picked correctly. Procter's only miss was in picking Pittsburgh over San Diego, whose upset over the Steelers cost most of the contestants a miss. Procter was presented a check for \$10.00.

## Details Are Announced

The Friona Chamber of Commerce will sponsor a Christmas Lighting Contest this year, and has offered prizes totalling \$250.

# FRIONA FLASHBACKS

....from the files of The Friona Star

**50 YEARS AGO--NOV. 29, 1929**

What might have been a most destructive fire at the gin Tuesday evening was averted by wise management and presence of mind of the overseer, Mr. Waddell. Some cotton became ignited, and Mr. Waddell kept the machinery in motion until the burning cotton reached the press, where it was covered with other lint and bound up in a bale and discharged, so that the only loss was the bale of cotton.

**45 YEARS AGO--NOV. 30, 1934**

Many farmers of this locality are still busy sowing wheat; the rain that fell two weeks ago delayed planting. Some of these farmers had been waiting for the moisture to complete their seeding operations; others had not sown any, and still others find themselves obliged to resow much of their acreage that had already been sown earlier but failed to get a stand on account of lack of moisture.

**40 YEARS AGO--NOV. 24, 1939**

Reports reaching the Star office are to the effect that work on the Parmer County REA project is progressing at a most satisfactory rate, and that present indications are that the lines will be ready for energizing by the

early part of December. Workmen are busy wiring homes of the subscribers so as to be ready for the current as soon as the lines are ready to receive it.

**35 YEARS AGO--NOV. 24, 1944**

The biggest crowd in Friona's history is expected for the district title game which will be played on Thanksgiving Day in Friona between Friona and Hereford. Friona and Hereford won the right to play last week when the executive committee of the district met. Three teams, Friona, Hereford and Tulia, tied for the district's co-championship, but Hereford and Friona drew the right to play to see who represents the district in bi-district play.

**30 YEARS AGO--NOV. 25, 1949**

The Rev. George Meyer of Baker, Montana, will arrive here during the week, and will preach at the Congregational Church Sunday morning. Rev. Meyer is coming here to look over the situation with a possible view to accepting a call to locate here as pastor of the church.

**25 YEARS AGO--NOV. 26, 1954**

Less than \$9,000 stands in the way for construction planning for the new

Parmer County Community Hospital, manager Jimmie Baxter said this week. The organized drive is still underway to secure the needed funds in the next few days, and over one-third of the contacts remain to be made in Friona alone. At last accounting, \$32,594 was in hand on the project with another \$8,688 on the books as pledged.

**15 YEARS AGO--NOV. 26, 1964**

Nine members of the 1964 Friona Chieftain football team were named to the all-district teams chosen by District 3-AA coaches at a meeting Monday at Olton. Four of the players, tackle Dale Milner, fullback Doug Dodd, tackle Gene Weatherly and halfback Milton Hargus, were selected to the first teams. In addition, halfback Danny Murphree, tackle Ray Braxton, guard Bob Sims, center Bing Bingham and end Larry Buckley were named to the second teams.

**10 YEARS AGO--NOV. 27, 1969**

Lazbuddie's Longhorns, out for their second straight class B bi-district championship, will face a Groom team bent on revenge when the two meet Friday night at 7:30 p.m. at Panhandle.

The last service to be conducted at the old building of the Union Congregational Church will be held next Sunday morning at 11 a.m. The adobe building, which the members of the church have been using for 47 years, will see its last use as a place of formal worship on this date.

**5 YEARS AGO--NOV. 24, 1974**

Boswell and Crafton, Inc., Contractor, has begun reconstruction work on the first section of State Highway 214 from the Bailey County Line, north to Clay's Corner. Work will include the reconstruction of the grading, structures, flexible base, and asphalt surfacing to a 26 ft. travelway with 9 ft. paved shoulders.

Lars Asbrink of Stockholm, Sweden, was a visitor in Friona the week of November 8-14, in the home of Mr. and Mrs. W.A. Cochran. The Asbrinks were the host family for Kay Cochran, who was an American Field Service exchange student to Sweden during the summer of 1973.

## Longtime Resident Dies Here

Graveside services for Walter Loveless, 97, longtime Friona resident, were conducted Wednesday in Moore, Oklahoma. Burial was in the Moore Cemetery.

Loveless passed away at 9 p.m. Sunday, November 18 at Parmer County Community Hospital, where he had been hospitalized since the first part of November.

Loveless was born September 9, 1882 in Crowell, Texas. He was the son of Cadelia G. Brooks and Jesse Bart Loveless.

He was a retired farmer, and also served several years as Justice of Peace for the Friona precinct. He has been a resident of Prairie Acres Nursing Home for the past few years.

Survivors include his wife Kitty of the home, five sons, Walter of Oklahoma City, Okla., Roy of Connell, Washington, Carl of Visalia, California, Luther of Chattanooga, Tennessee and Howard of Knoxville, Tennessee.

Also surviving is a sister, Vinnie Brown of Chetopa, Kansas, 19 grandchildren, 29 great-grandchildren and 12 great-great grandchildren.

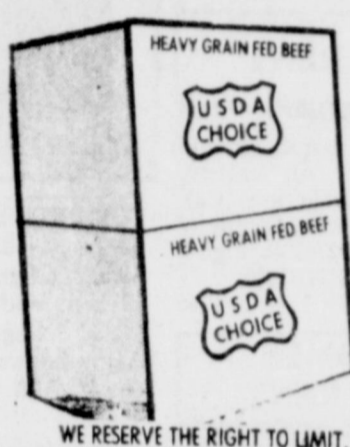

## Highway Work Set For County

Bids are scheduled to be received during November by the State Department of Highways and Public Transportation for the reconstruction of sections of U.S. Highway 60 at Friona and Bovina in Parmer County, and for the resurfacing of U.S. 60 in Parmer and Castro Counties.

Lubbock District Engineer George C. Wall said the two reconstruction projects involve 0.9 mile of U.S. 60 in Friona from S.H. 214 eastward, and 0.4 mile in Bovina from F.M. 2290 eastward.

Raised medians will be removed at both locations and the roadway will be reconstructed to provide four through lanes, continuous left turn lanes and two parking lanes at each site.

The resurfacing project will repair the existing surface of U.S. 60 from Friona northeastward to the Deaf Smith County line, a distance of 14.6 miles.

The department's engineer in charge of the work is Rhea Bradley of Littlefield.

# Season Ends On Sour

## Note: Dimmitt, 28-2

Even though the calendar clearly showed that it was closer to Thanksgiving, the Friona Chieftains felt like giving presents in their 1979 season football finale last Friday.

The Chiefs gave Dimmitt six turnovers, including four in an error-filled first quarter, and the Bobcats, never one to look a gift horse in the mouth, accepted all the gifts, enroute to a 28-2 win.

The loss left the Chieftains with a 1-8-1 season record, their worst season record since the "winless wonders" of 1961 and 1962 went 0-10 two straight years.

For a minute or so in the opening quarter, it looked as though Friona was going to take it to the visiting Bobcats. Dimmitt let Mark Montoya's kickoff roll, and finally had to recover it at their own two.

On the second play from

scrimmage, Scott Fangman broke through and tackled speedy Jimmy Stewart in the end zone for a safety, and with only 44 seconds expired, Friona had a 2-0 lead. They also should have come away with the football in good field position. But, then again, if "ifs and buts were candy and nuts, we'd all have a Merry Christmas," someone once said.

Friona deployed too deeply for the kickoff following the safety, and one of the up-men fumbled the high kick, with Dimmitt recovering at their own 46.

On the first offensive play, Friona was stung by a 30-yard pass interference penalty, as the ball was moved to the Friona 24. But the Chiefs dug in, forcing a punt after Dimmitt lost five yards in three plays.

But the Dimmitt punt hit an unsuspecting Chieftain, and the 'Cats

recovered at the Friona 16. Dimmitt had moved the ball 84 yards, and at this stage of the game showed minus four yards on their own power--Friona giving up 88 yards due to their own mistakes.

It finally boiled down to a fourth down and 21 play for Dimmitt. Robin Ryan passed to Steve Stone, who made a nifty run for a touchdown after catching the ball. Stone's kick gave Dimmitt a 7-3 lead with 7:27 left on the clock.

Joe Malouf threw an interception on Friona's second play following the TD, but Friona held without damage. Then, on their fourth play after getting the ball again, Mike Hubbard fumbled and the 'Cats recovered. Friona had turned the ball over four times in less than ten minutes of clock time.

Early in the second quarter, Dimmitt drove 74 yards in ten plays, with Stewart scoring from the two. The PAT kick was blocked, but Dimmitt had a 13-2 lead with 5:30 left before halftime.

That could have been the halftime score, except that Friona wasn't through giving gifts. The Chiefs

fumbled a pitchout at their 29 with less than a minute to play. Dimmitt obliged, and then converted a 29-yard pass play for a TD, and relaxed with a 20-2 lead during the intermission.

Dimmitt drove 51 yards for a score in the third quarter, with Stewart again getting the TD from a yard out. Dimmitt made two points on a pass to hike their lead to 28-2.

The Chiefs never threatened in the game. In fact, the fourth quarter was played completely in Friona's end of the field, as the Chiefs never made it to midfield.

Tony Jackson did make a good defensive play in the final quarter to keep the score from being worse than it was, intercepting a pass at the Friona goal-line and running it out. Dimmitt had a man open in the end zone.

Just to show you it wasn't their night, at one point Friona punted, Dimmitt fumbled and the Chiefs recovered. But the play was nullified as Friona was called for illegal procedure.

Friona's ineptness was shown in the fact that they completed only one of 17 passes.

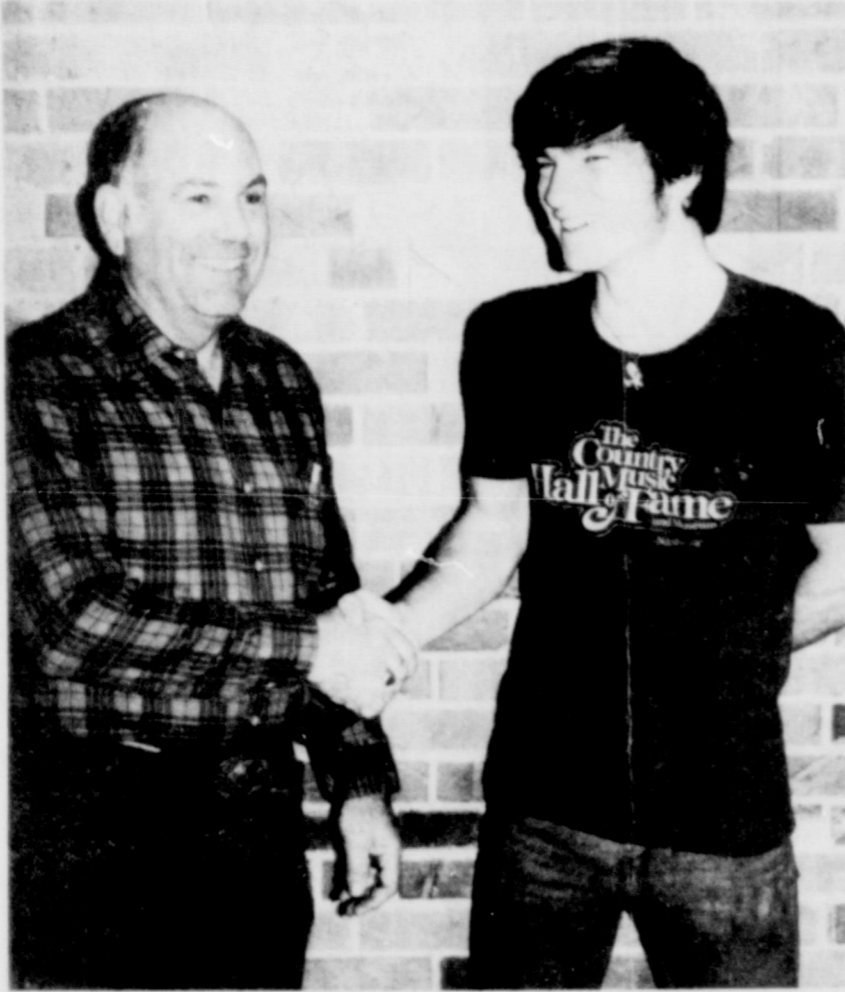
