BY THE TIME you are reading this, you should have received in the mail your 1980 census form. Since the form is the most important questionnaire you will receive this year, we urge our readers to take the time to fill it out, and get it ready to be mailed back.

According to information we have, all of the census forms in Friona are to be mailed back to census headquarters, on Tuesday, April 1. Of course, if you should receive different instructions than this with your form, be sure and follow them.

This is the first time that the U.S. Mail is being used to this extent in collecting the census, and the officials are hoping that this will turn out to be a time and money-saving procedure, as well as being just as thorough as the personal visit.

In fact, many believe that a family would rather fill in their census forms in privacy and at their own pace, and will perhaps be more detailed and more accurate than if a stranger were sitting in your living room asking the questions.

The census figures are used for a variety of things, including the drawing of new district lines for congressional districts, computing such things as federal revenue sharing, and a score of other things.

Industries and businesses of all kinds use the census information to plan expansion programs.

Thus, it is vital that everyone in the local area be counted, since our area will be affected for virtually an entire decade by the "head count" that is

secured on April 1, 1980. Make sure you are counted. Our area is almost certain to have less voice in state and national governments, due to the fact that our area will not show the growth, number-wise, that certain areas will show. So it is important that every resident of our city and county be

If you do not receive a census form, they are asked to call, toll free to the Amarillo district office, 1-800-692-4061.

What do you think our 1980 population will be? Friona's official population in the 1970 census was 3,111. About midway through the decade, when new city limit signs were erected, an official estimate of 3565 was made by the city council.

If the city's growth rate from 1970 to 1980 continued at the same pace as it was for the 1960-70 decade, then our population most certainly should be at least 4,000.

From what we understand, there are few vacant houses and apartments in Friona at the present time.



Children. Littlefield High School, which presented "The Lottery," was named alternate for Area competition.


The FHS group will now advance to the area contest, which will be held at Wayland Baptist College, Plainview, on Saturday, April 12.

## **Patterson Working** On Shorter Season

Commissioner Jack Patterson, who also is president of the Parmer County Game Association, has been busy during the past few weeks working to oppose the 30-day pheasant season.

Patterson attended the convention of the West Texas County Judges and Commissioners Assn. in San Angelo, where he had an opportunity to call the problem to the attention of Governor Bill Clements.

Clements told Patterson that he would talk to the Parks and Wildlife Commission members, and ask them to listen to the residents of the Panhandle in regard to the season.

"You as residents of the area know what is best for you, and you as representatives of the people know what they are wanting in regard to the situation," Clements told Patterson.

The Parmer County official also had an opportunity to visit with state Attorney-General Mark White concerning the season.

Patterson plans to meet with the Parks and Wildlife Commission in Austin on April 18 at 9 a.m. "I was told that unless someone went to their meeting, that the tape recordings we made at the hearing in Farwell might just be ignored by the Parks and Wildlife people.

"So, I plan to go to Austin, and hope to take a car-load of county residents with me, to speak against the extended season," Patterson says.

Patterson has been securing signatures of county residents, stating their preference as to the pheasant season. The petitions are located at the Friona Star and Friona State Bank. There is space for the person to sign, and then to check their preference for a 30-day, 16-day or nine-day hunting season.

Patterson said he also was accepting donations to pay for the expenses of the group which will go to Austin. Anyone wishing to contribute to the fund may leave it at First State Bank in Bovina or at Friona State Bank in Friona.

"I have not found a single person who is in favor of the 30-day pheasant season. I'm afraid that this (the extended season) may cause some problems to develop, between the hunters and the farmers.

"It just doesn't make sense that we went from a two-day season 16 years ago to a 30-day season," Patterson concluded.

Most of the farmers feel that 30 days is too long to have their land and livestock harrassed by the hunters.







### 1980 Farm Bill Signed

Target prices for producers who plant within their NCA are: \$3.63 per bu. for wheat; \$2.35 per bu. for corn; \$2.50 for sorghum; and \$2.25 for barley.

Targets for farmers exceeding their normal crop acreages are: \$3.08 per bu. for wheat: \$2.05 for corn; \$2.45 for sorghum and \$2.29 for barley.

The cotton target price is 58.4° per lb.

This new act extends the disaster payments program through the 1980 crop year for producers of wheat, feed grains, upland cotton and rice. Because of the fact that disaster payments are based on target prices, the producer who stays within his farm's NCA will have a higher disaster payment rate than does the farmer whose plantings exceed his NCA. The maximum amount that any one person may receive in disaster payment is
