Star Lites

WE HAVE HAD SOME hail damage in our immediate area, but from the pictures we have seen in area newspapers, and on television newscasts, we would say (at least as of this writing) that Parmer County for the most part has been fairly fortunate, in connection with the recent violent weather.

On two consecutive Wednesdays, we had some bad weather, but in both instances, the cloud more or less "made up" in our area, and became progressively worse as it went eastward.

A report in this week's Dimmitt newspaper indicated that the May 25 storm had caused over \$5 million in property damage alone—to homes, vehicles and business houses. No estimate was given on crop damage, which also was severe.

The storm pounded the Dimmitt area with stones ranging in size from lemons to cantaloupes. The storm lasted for almost an hour in Dimmitt. Roofs of homes were damaged, and one mobile home ruined. Grown wheat and emerging corn was destroyed, and cotton was washed out by the gully-washer that accompanied the storm.

Then, at Nazareth, funnel clouds destroyed a mobile home belonging to Kent and Teresa Birkenfield, who luckily left to find a storm cellar. Their home and belongings were flattened by the storm.

The storm also hit the Lawrence Schmucker farm a half mile from where the Birkenfields lived, and did massive damage to their home. Other farm homes in the Nazareth area were hit, but these two were the worst.

A group of 75 people huddled in the basement of the Holy Family Church at Nazareth. The steel archway to the Holy Family Cemetery was ripped out of the ground on one side, and twisted out of shape.

The funnel-bearing cloud which hit the Nazareth community also caused considerable damage at Tulia, but according to one eyewitness, the city of Tulia could also consider itself lucky.

According to a second-hand, but eye-witness report from Tulia, there were at least two funnels from the massive cloud system. The larger funnel was a black, menacing affair, and had been bearing down on the city, but must have lifted in time to spare the city major damage. As it was, the gin on the west side of town was destroyed, and some homes sustained damage.

In the Dimmitt area, ice from the hailstorm was three to four inches deep in the barrow ditch along Highway 86.

THESE RECENT STORMS should serve to warn us just how much damage can be done by hailstorms and tornadoes, which are common to our area this time of the year.

Residents should have a plan at all times, as to where they will go if the area comes under a tornado warning. You should have a place in mind, whether at home or at work, to go for protection.

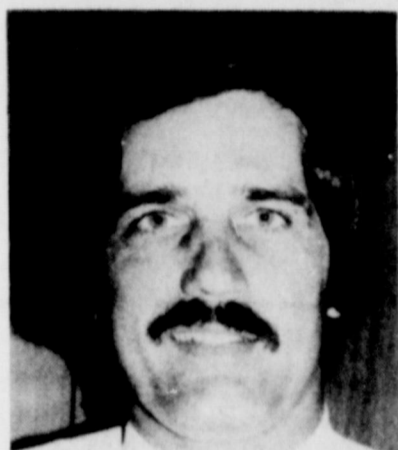
If you do not have a storm shelter, an inside room, such as a bathroom, is the best. The idea about lying in a bathtub and pulling a mattress over you has proven a good one, where storms strike such as the one described above.

Just because a tornado "never has hit you before" is no sign that it won't. An ounce of prevention could be just enough to save your life, or the lives of your loved ones.

SPS Granted Rate Hike

An order allowing Southwestern Public Service Company to increase its electric rates was received today by the Company from the Public Utility Commission of Texas.

The rate case has been pending since last February when the Company filed for rate relief with the city governments in its Texas service area.

All the cities have previously approved the rate application. The rates will go into effect immediately and will be on the June billings.

Gardening: Popular Hobby For Several

Gardening is probably one of the most popular hobbies in the Friona area. A good garden is also a source of pride for its owners.

"I've been making a garden all my life. Even when I was growing up, we had a garden. Of course, in those days you had to have a garden in order to eat. It just wouldn't seem right if we didn't have one," said Herschel Johnson, one of Friona's avid gardeners.

"I've been having a garden for at least 35 years, and I think this year has been one of the hardest to get the things going like they should be. If it isn't one thing, it's another," Johnson says.

Johnson, who lives at 208 West 14th Street in Friona, can be seen working in his garden plot virtually every day. He has at least ten different varieties of plants, in addition to fruit trees.

"I think a garden is a good pastime. I come out here to blow off steam. It's good exercise. You can spend 30 to 40 minutes a day in your garden, and you'll accomplish something. But I wouldn't recommend it as a way to save money. The cost of everything you use to make a garden has gone up," Johnson says.

The longtime Friona resident says he uses regular dry commercial fertilizer for his garden plot. He also uses commercial spray to control the insects.

Johnson has a one-inch joint of plastic pipe connected to his garden hose, and has quarter-inch openings in the pipe at intervals, so that he can water several rows at a time, or just one, according to the amount of water pressure he uses. He can open or close the openings, according to which rows he wants to water.

"This is the same principal we use in irrigating our crops," Johnson says.

"I plant all of my garden crops on the beds, rather than in the furrow. Some of your gardeners plant their crops in the furrow, but I have found that, particularly where you have to water your crops, they do better on

the beds. It keeps them out of the water," Johnson says.

Among the crops Johnson grows are squash, okra, green beans, blackeyed peas, tomatoes, carrots, onions, cabbage, sweet peppers and beets.

He also has apple and pecan trees, which were carefully planted in rows in the back yard of the Johnson home.

"I need to point out that this garden is a partnership venture with Virginia Jennings. She does most of the 'bossing,' and I do most of the work," Johnson said. "We need to make that distinction. Seriously, Elvie Jennings keeps me up to date on what chemicals to use for what purpose," Johnson says.

The longtime gardener starts his tomato plants from seeds, when it's still winter-time, getting them started in the house, and transplants them later in the season. He has about 40 tomato plants at the present time.

"I use 'hot caps' over the tomatoes, rather than cans, as most people do," explained Johnson, describing the way he puts a paper "cap" over each tomato plant. "You can cut a little opening with your knife to let them breathe," he says.

"This has been the darndest year to get beans and peas going. I have one row of beans I've planted the third time. And you see those peas (indicating his smallish black-eyes)...I don't know what's wrong with them," he mused.

His pecan trees are now eight years old, and are just beginning to produce. "A pecan tree has to be about ten years old before it really produces. You have to trim the growth back, and you'll only get pecans on the new growth—similar to grapes," Johnson explained.

As to how he controls his weeds, Johnson points to a what appears to be a well-used hoe. "That old goose-necked hoe, and a rake, are about all I use for that."

And, when you pass the intersection of Fourteenth Street and Euclid Avenue, you'll almost always find Johnson practicing what he preaches.

Democratic Runoff Set

The Democratic runoff election will be held on Saturday, June 7, with all of the county's 16 polling places to be open.

Three state races will appear on the ballot. For the Associate Justice of the Supreme Court, Place 1, J.P. (Jim) Wallace and John C. Phillips are opposing.

For the Court of Criminal Appeals, W.T. Phillips and Mike McCormick are candidates for the Place 2 position. Tom Davis and Edith Roberts are candidates for the Place 3 spot on the court.

In Parmer County, Max Crim and Archie Tarter meet for the county commissioner's spot for Precinct 3 (Farwell-Lariat-Oklahoma Lane area).

City Gets Fourth Hail

The city received its "weekly Wednesday storm" again this week, with marble-sized hail falling for a time late in the afternoon.

It marked the fourth time in five weeks that the city has received at least some hail on a Wednesday.

This week, the cloud moved hurriedly on, and did inflict considerable damage farther to the east, particularly in the Canyon-Happy area.

Very little moisture was gained from the late-afternoon storm.

Temperatures for the past week were the hottest of the season, with the highs being in the 90s almost every day.

term), the building would become the property of the board.

The only hitch involved appears the reluctance by some members of the board to obligate the appraisal board for a long period of time.

The board voted Monday to accept the city's proposal, provided that the city would agree to the terms on a year-to-year basis. The City Council will discuss the matter at its next meeting.

There have been two additional offers by individuals who would rent space, already available, for use of the new tax office.

Before the meeting was over, E.A. (Tony) Parham, board member from Lazbuddie, made a motion that the previous action of the Board concerning the new building to house the tax appraisal board be rescinded, and the building be put adjacent to the county courthouse in Farwell, "where it should be."

Parham and Gilbert Kaltwasser, board member from Farwell, voted in favor of the motion, and Lawrence Jamerson of Bovina and D.C. Herring of Friona voted against. Chairman David Grimsley then voted against, to break the tie.

The board interviewed two prospects for the position of chief appraiser, bringing to five the number they have personally interviewed.

There had been a total of ten applications for the position of chief appraiser, and the board weeded these to five and have now personally interviewed these five, having previously talked to two.

FRIONA FLASHBACKS

...from the files of The Friona Star

50 YEARS AGO--MAY 23, 1930 The election here last Saturday for school bonds resulted in a victory for the bond issue with a count of 212 for and 110 against.

Miss Amelia Schlenker, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. F.T. Schlenker, whose home is 14 miles west of Friona, was pronounced by the judges in a tie for first place in the state oratorical contests for rural schools, in a contest at Austin.

45 YEARS AGO--MAY 24, 1935 The long and severe drought which was accompanied by the most severe dust storms this region has ever experienced, seems to have had its back completely broken by the arrival of good soaking rains that apparently covered the entire panhandle area last Friday and Saturday.

40 YEARS AGO--MAY 17, 1940 Harold Lillard, son of Mr. and Mrs. L.F. Lillard of Pure Bred Farm, seven miles northwest of Friona, placed his community and county on the map last week, when he won the banner and four ribbons on his entry of seven head of fine Shorthorns, on exhibition at the Plainview Dairy Show May 7-11.

35 YEARS AGO--MAY 18, 1945 The children of the Black School were taken to the Hereford Park Thursday, May 10, for an all-day picnic, where they enjoyed playing games and a basket lunch at the noon hour.

30 YEARS AGO--MAY 12, 1950 Vera Ann Jones, Friona High School student, returned from Austin

last week and the Interscholastic League typing contest after adding the state title to her growing list of typing accomplishments. Vera Ann surpassed all entrants in classes AA and A, chalking up a 96.69 accuracy score.

25 YEARS AGO--MAY 20, 1955 Announcement was made this week by Friona Superintendent-elect Dillie Kelley of the two notable changes in the local school faculty.

20 YEARS AGO--MAY 19, 1960 Three members of the Friona Squaws' basketball team have been chosen to play in the annual North-South all-star basketball game at the close of the annual Girls Basketball Coaches Association meeting this summer.

15 YEARS AGO--MAY 20, 1965 Graduation exercises for Friona's eighth grade class will be held Saturday, and for the high school seniors next Monday.

10 YEARS AGO--MAY 21, 1970 The preliminary census figures announced last week by the Amarillo district offices bears out the fact that the three-county area of Parmer, Deaf Smith and Castro, often referred to as the "Golden Triangle"

in recent years, really is one of the flourishing areas on the High Plains. Deaf Smith County, as expected, set the pace with a population of 18,533, a healthy increase of 5,346 over 1960's 13,187.

5 YEARS AGO--MAY 18, 1975 Honor graduates were announced Friday for Friona's eighth grade graduating class. Valedictorian of the class will be Donna Rector, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Floyd Rector.



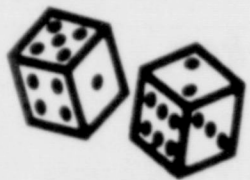

Texas farmers and ranchers who want information about the disaster recovery loan program of the U.S. Small Business Administration now have a toll-free number they may call, says Seth Ralston, county agent with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M University System.

SBA has already assisted more than 10,000 agricultural producers in Texas, and this toll-free number will make it easier for farmers throughout Texas to receive information about the SBA program.

Farmers who have questions about being eligible or how to apply for an agricultural disaster loan may receive a brief explanation by calling, toll-free, 1-800-692-4296 from anywhere within Texas. If a farmer has already applied to SBA for assistance, he may leave his name, address and phone number with the receptionist and a loan officer familiar with the application will call back at once using another line rather than tying up the toll-free number for any length of time.

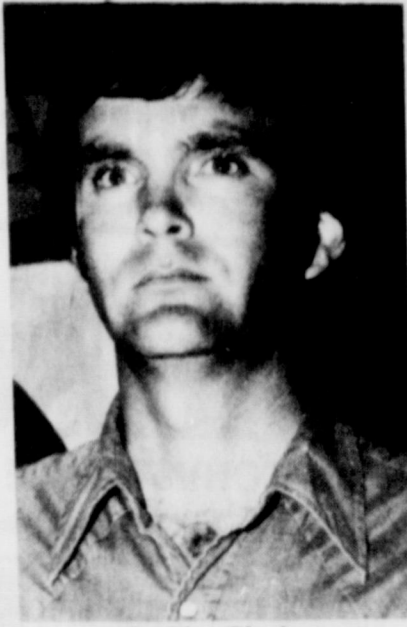

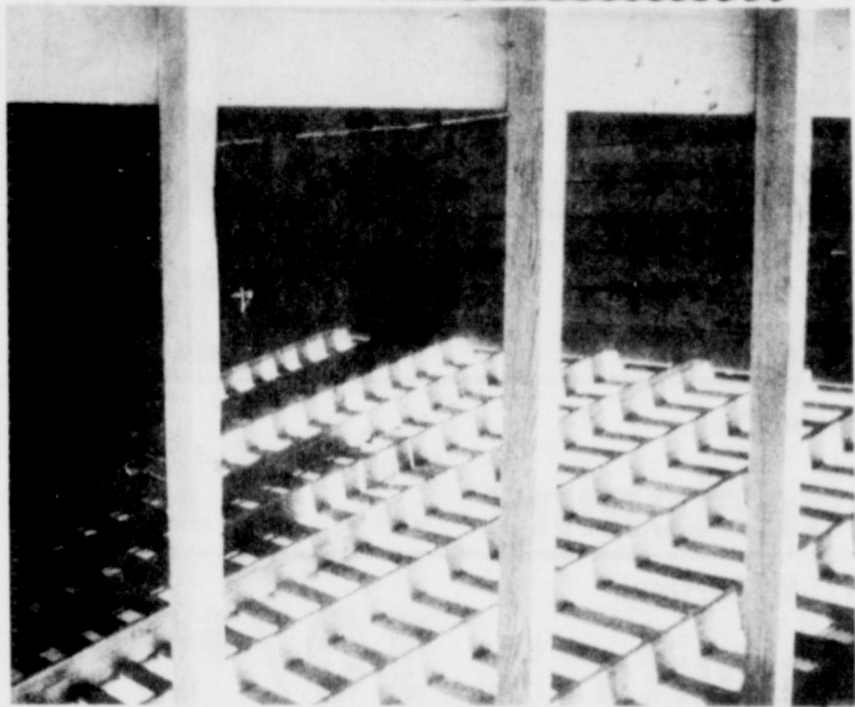

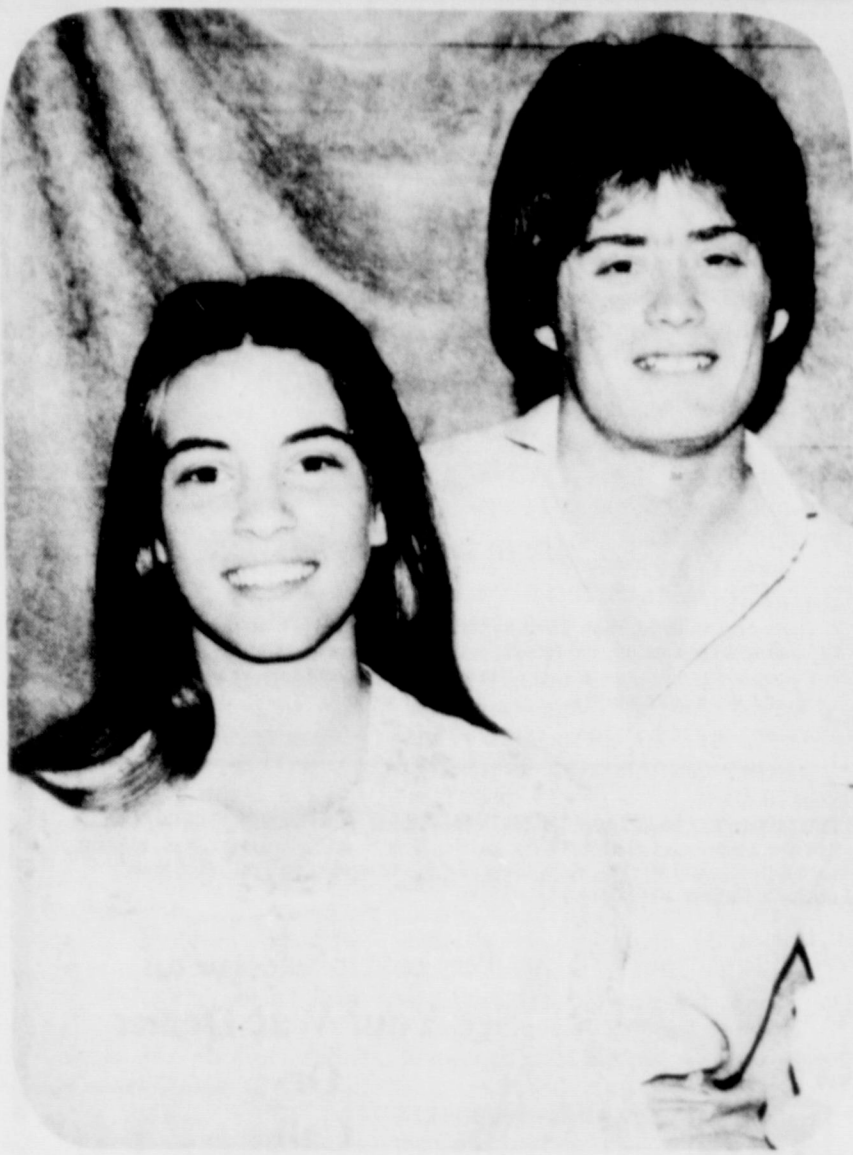
