| The Parmer County Historical Commission is still urging county residents to complete their family histories and mail them to the commission at Box 577, Friona, Texas, 79035. <br> Area Gets 1st Freeze <br> The first freeze of the season was experienced in the Friona area this week, following a strong cold front which swept through the area on Thursday. <br> Friday morning's low temperature was 26 , the lowest of the fall season, apparently low enough to put an end to the growing season. <br> A low of 30 degrees had been seen on the morning of Sunday, October 19, but only a light frost was recorded that morning as the mercury dipped below the freezing point for just a short time. <br> The freeze should facilitate the harvest season, particularly the cotton, which was needing a freeze to kill the leaves in most instances. <br> The area's corn crop has been virtually completed, and most producers have reported a considerable drop in yield, due to the summer-long drought.
