50 YEARS AGO--APRIL 10, 1931 Main Street has finally been put in good shape, having been in a disgraceful condition all winter. Commissioner W.M. Alexander suggested that the city buy a fourhorse light maintainer, costing about \$250 and after each rain hire a man and teams to smooth the streets. He believes that one man with four horses can be hired at \$7.00 a day and that he could scrape every street in town in one day.

45 YEARS AGO-APRIL 10, 1936 Issue missing in Star files.

40 YEARS AGO-APRIL 11, 1941 Local news items revealed that Lee Spring was in Lubbock recovering from an appendectomy, and Ray Landrum was in a Clovis hospital, having had the same operation. Walter Loveless suffered a broken leg in a farm accident involving a tractor.

35 YEARS AGO--APRIL 12, 1946 Raymond Schlabs exhibited the grand champion boar, and Joe Osborn had the grand champion female, in the Parmer County Livestock Show in Friona last Friday and Saturday. Other winners included Friona FFA, the grand champion bull; R.V. Miller, senior champion female; Lloyd Rector, junior champion female, and Miller, grand champion female.

30 YEARS AGO--APRIL 5, 1951 On Monday, April 2, the Masonic Lodge in Friona was set to work under a dispensation from the Grand Lodge of Texas. Officers installed were Charles S. Bainum, Worshipful Master; Elroy Wilson, senior warden; and Edd Boggess, junior warden. A ham and bean supper was served to 149 Masons representing six states and 26 different lodges.

Hurst was named "Man of the Year," Mrs. Wilson was honored as "Woman of the Year," and Mrs. Williams was chosen "Most Courteous Employee."

15 YEARS AGO--APRIL 7, 1966 W.L. (Preach) Edelmon was

elected mayor, with Dr. Lee Cranfill, and Rene Snead being named aldermen in a good turnout of voters in Friona's city election Tuesday. Edelmon received 179 votes. Outgoing mayor J.C. Miller Is 1980 Man Of Year

Dr. Roy V. Miller, Chairman, Agriculture Department at Southwest Texas State University has been selected by the Comal-Hays-Guadalupe Soil and Water Conservation District as Professional Man of the Year.

This honor has been bestowed upon Dr. Miller for rendering the greatest unself service to aid the cause of soil and water conservation.

Dr. Miller grew up on a farm in Friona, Texas, where he and his brothers assisted their father in operating their family farm. He entered Texas Tech University and received a B.S. Degree in Animal Husbandry in 1953. He served in the United States Navy from 1953 to 1957. From 1957 to 1966 he was on the Experiment Station Staff as Range Conservationist at Colorado State University.

While at Colorado State University, he received his M.S. Degree in Range Management in 1960, and Ph.D. in Botany and Plant Ecology in 1967. From 1966 to 1969, he developed the Range Management Program for Chico State University. From 1969 to 1974, he was Area Range and Brush Control Specialist for the Extension Service at Vernon, Texas.

In January of 1974, Dr. Miller was selected Chairman of Southwest Texas State University Agriculture Department, and currently holds this position. Since arriving at SWTSU, he and his staff has judged all of the Soil Conservation Essays and Posters for the Comal-Hays-Guadalupe Soil and Water Conservation District.

He has assisted the Soil Conservation Service on many occasions. He recently hosted the

SCS Prescribed Burning Training Seminar at the University for the Austin and Fredericksburg areas. He has also assisted the SCS in range, brush and wildlife management. The SCS participates annually in the University's Range and Soil Judging Contest. Part of the annual Soil Conservation Tour was held at SWTSU's Horticulture Center in 1980.

Since coming to SWTSU, he has added Agriculture Journalism and a Graduate Program for agriculture students, along with The Horticulture

Dr. Miller has encouraged Soil Conservation Service personnel to talk to his students, and arranged several field tours each year to show students conservation practices applied to local farms and ranches.

Each year, he teaches a course in soil conservation, and all of his students actually visits local ranches and develop soil and water conservation plans. He has also developed a Farm Beautification Committee to enhance beautification and conservation on the University

Dr. Miller is a member of the First Baptist Church of San Marcos, the Balcones Kiwanis Club, and the Society for Range management.

Child Abuse Workshop Held Locally Saturday

Last Saturday the Child Welfare Board of Parmer County held two workshops on the problem of child abuse and neglect.

Mary Lee Johns from the Texas Conference of Churches was the featured speaker for both sessions. She used a low-key approach to the subject. The morning session was well attended by ministers and lay leaders from Parmer County churches.

This session challenged churches to take an active role in helping deal with this serious problem. Residents are asked to contact their minister or Rev. Skip Sirnic if they would like further information on how their church might help.

The response to the afternoon session for the general public was much weaker than the morning turnout. However, some people interested in Foster Parenting and others just concerned about the problem did attend and felt they gained much by the experience.

The bake sale held in conjunction with the workshop netted some \$400.00 for the Board to use in situations of need.

"The Parmer County Child Welfare Board would like to thank all those folks who participated in the workshops. They sacrificed a portion of their time to help better understand and deal with the very real problem of child abuse and neglect," said Rev. Sirnic.

Jimenez died at about 3:45 p.m. Sunday at Hi-Plains Hospital in Hale Center after a brief illness.


A native of Floresville, he had lived in Olton the past 20 years and was a farm laborer. He was a member of the Trinity Baptist Mission.



Three of the students qualified for the regional meet in two events each. Stanley Ellis placed first in calculator application, a new event, and second in headline writing in the journalism

Amber Smith placed second on poetry interpretation, and third in ready writing, and will enter regional in both events. Janette Reed placed second in newswriting, and third in informative speaking, to also become a double qualifier.

The FHS number one debate team, Mark Blankenship and Mark Zachary, the defending state champions, breezed to a first-place finish in the district meet. The number two debate team, Stanley Miller and Don Robinson, placed third and also qualified for the regional meet.




