## Cattlemen Inaugurating Program

Texas cattlemen are implementing
a voluntary 25 -cent-per-head beef
promotion investment program
effective July 1 . Under the new
system, all funds collected are to be
remited to the Beef Industry Council
of the National Live Stock and Meat
Board for use in national programs of
research, education and promotion.
For the current fiscal year (May 1 ,
1981 to April 30,1982 , the Beef
Industry Council has budgeted $\$ 2.8$
million for national beef promotion.
With their promotion investment
commitment, Texas joins 21 other
states that have united to increase
long-range funding for national beef
programs.

But even though existing Beef
Industry Council programs are highly Industry Council programs are highly
effective, many feel that more can and should be done to build better beef markets-especially in light of certain challenges now facing the industry, such as health concerns, market encroachment by other meats, and inflation
At present investment levels,
cattlemen are spending only one cent cattlemen are spending only one cent
per consumer, nationally, to sell beef). We've got to do more," said Joe Hathoot, immediate past
president, Livestock Marketing president, Livestock
Association of Texas.
