R. Treider Announces Candidacy

Raymond Treider, Jr. of Lazbuddie, has authorized the Friona Star to announce his candidacy for County Commissioner, Precinct 4, in the upcoming Democratic Primary,

Treider is a Parmer County native and he and his wife, Charleta, have raised their four children in Parmer

Treider is a construction foreman, who plans, if elected, to devote his full-time efforts to his county commissioner work.

Not a stranger to previous county service, Treider served Parmer County as a maintainer operator for three years and also worked under the late Sheriff Charles Lovelace as a

He has also been a past county commissioner for Precinct 4, after having been appointed in 1966 to fill a spot vacated by George Crane. Treider then was re-elected to that position for two terms, thus serving the residents of Precinct 4 for a total of nine years, as a commissioner.

"If elected, I plan to devote my entire time to the position of County Commissioner, and I feel that I am very well qualified to accept the responsibilities that this requires," commented Treider.

"I would appreciate your vote and influence in the upcoming election in the May primary," he stated.

Stock Show Sale Hits Record \$120,000

Parmer County Jr. Livestock Show capped off a successful show with a record total of \$120,025.47 paid to the young showmen.

Of the auction total amount paid for the animals, \$69,837.90 was in premiums over and above the floor price, and \$50,187.57 was paid by the floor bidders

"We were thrilled that the sale was as good as it was. We had been concerned that it might not be, due to the farm situation and the depressed economy. But the buyers dug down and did better than they ever had," said John Taylor, assistant show superintendent.

The barrows sold for an average of \$2.00 per pound at the auction. One group, the Friona Livestock Boosters, went back and added to the animals they bought, to assure a minimum of \$2 per pound for each

Steers sold for an estimated \$1.25 per pound, and the sheep sold for \$2.70-\$2.80 per pound on the

The auction total compared to \$93,729.47 at last year's sale--a whopping 28 per cent increase for the sale totals.

"We appreciate everyone who supported the sale, and the young showmen by purchasing their animals. It helps them 'come out' on their projects when they can get good prices," Taylor said.

Jeff Lundy, who exhibited the grand champion steer, sold his animal at auction for \$3.00 per pound. Successful bidder on the steer was Ag-Chem Farm Services. Charlie Trimble sold his reserve champion steer for \$1.65, as Bovina Feeders was

Danna Ralston's grand champion barrow was sold for \$3.00 per pound. to the Farwell Championship Club, and Vandi Tarter's reserve champion went for \$1.90 to North Lazbuddie

The top sheep, the grand champion showed by Bret Whitten of Bovina, was purchased by Agri-Sprayers of Bovina at \$3.25 per pound. The reserve champion sheep, owned by Jon Riddle, was bought by First State Bank for \$2.40 per pound.

Floor prices at the 1982 sale were 65 cents per pound on the steers, bought by Leroy Berend; 48.75 cents per hundred-weight on the hogs, bought by Clovis Hog Company, and 48.75 cents per hundred-weight on the sheep, by Lazbuddie Sheep

The win by Lundy in the steer show gave his school, Friona, its 17th steer title in the 35 years. It was the sixth time for a crossbred steer to win the county title, and second year in a row for an Angus-Chianina to win. Herb Vogel of Hereford was the breeder of the champion steer for the second straight year.

Lundy's sister Corrie made it a weep for her family by winning the

first-ever grand champion heifer trophy with her lightweight entry. The heifer was likewise an Angus-Chianina cross.

In the barrow show, completed Friday evening, young Danna Ralston, Farwell 4-H Club member, had the grand champion, a 245pound barrow which had been earlier judged as the champion in the crossbred division.

Miss Ralston gave her school only its fifth-ever barrow title, first since 1977. It was the seventh time for a crossbred barrow to win the county title. The first crossbred barrow to win was in 1966.

Other breed champion trophies and banners were won by: Yorkshires, Devera Rhodes, Friona 4-H; Chester White, Mark Teague, Bovina FFA; Berkshires, Suzahn Inman, Farwell 4-H; Duroc, Vandi Tarter, Lazbuddie 4-H; Hampshires, David Boozer, Bovina 4-H; and Spots and Polands, Beth Johnson, Friona 4-H.

The lamb judging, held on Thursday, saw Bret Whitten, Bovina FFA, with the Grand Champion (Continued on Page 2)

Previously announced were Floyd Reeve, Teddy Fangman and George Frye, the three incumbents.

Deadline for filing is March 3, and Superintendent Tom Jarboe noted that since school will be closed on Monday through Wednesday, the deadline date, prospective candidates could call him at home, or that failing, contact board member Jerry Hinkle at Friona State Bank for an application.

Candidates in the city council race are apparently "holding back," as no one has filed as of this writing.

Commissioners Okay Radio For Sheriff

county commissioners, meeting in regular session last Monday, approved the purchase of a high-band radio for the sheriff's department, at a trade price of \$1,916. This puts all of the sheriff's department vehicles on high-band, said County Sheriff Bill Morgan.

A bill was approved to the law firm of Bickerstaff, Heath and Smiley for work on the reapportionment of the commissioners' precincts, in the amount of \$1,298.74.

No word has been received as yet, as to the approval or disapproval of the reapportionment by the U.S. Justice Department.

A bill was approved to pay boarding care bills on five county foster children, in the amount of

Another bill, from Central Plains MH/MR, on a county student who had received therapy treatments, was approved, in the amount of \$116.

A request from Friona State Bank, asking approval of substitution of securities, was approved. The prior securities, in the amount of \$25,000, was a municipal bond which was maturing.

A bill was approved on insurance coverage on all county vehicles, in the amount of \$9,383. A motion was approved to approve

a contract between the county appraisal district and Perdue, Brandon, Blair and Fielder for the collection of delinquent taxes owed the county.

Motion was passed to install a new engine on the deputy's car at Friona, which had blown an engine.

It was decided to invest \$15,500 in right of way money and \$25,000 of general fund money in certificates of deposit, both to mature on April 30,

Ken Rogers of Lone Star Insurance Agency visited with the court to get acquainted and let them know he was in business in the county.

Soil conservation work was approved for Joe Jones, Mitzi Walling and Dale Gober.

EMT Course Is Offered In Bovina

What would you do if the baby got a toy wedged in his throat and couldn't breathe? What would you do if a child on his way home from school fell off his bike in front of your house and broke an arm or leg? What if you were at the lake and the lady from the next table ran over asking your help because she thought her husband had had a heart attack? What if you were out on a country road and saw a pickup flip over and no other help was in sight?

If you are a parent of small children, if you are a teacher, 4-H leader, Sunday School worker, or anyone else responsible for other people's children; if you are a farmer that comes in contact with chemicals or are around those who have to work with such materials; if you drive on the highways and by-ways of West Texas, there is a good chance that sooner or later you are going to be called on to give first aid.

For this reason, the Bovina Ambulance Service is offering an emergency care attendants course beginning March 9. The class will be held each Tuesday and Thursday nights beginning at 7 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall of First Methodist Church. It will conclude on April 1.

Although this class qualifies a person to work on the ambulance, it also gives anyone willing to take the time a knowledge of first aid that may help to save a life. It will most certainly enable you to prevent further damage to an injury and ease the pain if you are the first one on the scene. You will know what to do until the ambulance arrives.

Cost for the course is \$10.00. In addition, a text book may be purchased for \$15.00. You may take the course without buying the book, but it is recommended that you buy the book for your help in the class as well as to refer to when you need to know what to do in times of

This class is open to everyone in the Parmer County area, but only persons eighteen or older will be certified by the state. We welcome high school students, but will be unable to-certify them at the end of the class.

. . . . 50 YEARS AGO--FEB. 12, 1932

The streets to Friona are being gradually improved in more ways than just simply dragging them at intervals. One of the best improvements that is being made is the concrete crossings that are being put in at places where they are most needed. One of these permanent crossings was placed across Sixth Street, at its intersection with Main, from the City Drug Store to the T.J. Crawford Store. 




