## MARKETS

(USDA)—Strong livestock markets contrasted with lower trends on most other farm products in the southwest during the past week, the U. S. Department of Agriculture's Production and Marketing Administration reports.

Hog prices varied widely up and down but closed Monday around \$2 higher on butchers at Kansas City, Denver and Wichita, and \$1 up at Oklahoma City and Fort Worth. Sows ranged generally around 50 cents higher at \$14 to \$16, and pigs sold unchanged at \$15 to \$18 at Fort Worth. Top butchers varied from \$21.50 to \$22.90.

Cattle sold generally 50 cents to \$1 higher for the week, though Texas markets held steady and yearlings about unchanged and Houston closed steady on about all classes. Common and medium slaughter steers and yearlings ranged from \$19 to \$25 at Houston, while medium and good grades brought \$23 to \$28 at Oklahoma City and Fort Worth. Sows ranged generally around 50 cents higher at \$14 to \$16, and pigs sold unchanged at \$15 to \$18 at Oklahoma City, San Antonio paid \$23.50 to \$27.50 for medium light steers, and Wichita gave \$28.50 to \$29 for good kinds. Denver took heifers to \$28.50.

Spring lambs gained around 50 cents to \$1 during the past week, though old crop lambs sold steady to lower and ewes remained about unchanged. Common to good spring lambs turned at \$14 to \$23 at San Antonio early this week, as good

## Timmons Enters Race for State Representative

AUSTIN, April 29—(Sp)—State Representative J. Blake Timmons of Amarillo, serving his first term in the Texas Legislature, this week filed for a second term with chairman C. C. Acker of Deaf Smith's County Democratic Executive Committee and in other Panhandle county chairmen of Dist. 123. Timmons will formally announce his candidacy later.

A World War II veteran and former newspaperman, young Timmons was the Panhandle's lone member of the important constitutional amendments, commerce, conservation and redistricting committees this term and a floor leader in securing the necessary two-thirds vote to submit two constitutional amendments strongly backed by West Texans.

If adopted by Texas voters Nov. 2, one proposal would give West Texas added power in the Legislature by requiring an ex officio state board to re-district in proportion to population in 1951 if law-makers then fail in their duty to redistrict under the 1950 census as they failed after the 1930 and 1940 federal census-takings. Present districts were carved out in 1921, and the Panhandle's population has more than doubled since then, while some down-state districts have actually shrunk in population.

Another proposed constitutional amendment which Rep. Timmons is urging voters to approve this fall would abolish the present 30c State general revenue property tax, long criticized on the Plains because some 34 wealthy, down-state counties are exempt through "tax remission for flood control." The new proposal, if adopted general election day, will permit counties so desiring to re-levy the 30c tax locally for farm-to-market road or conservation purposes.

Rep. Timmons efforts to obtain \$50,000 additions for the Panhandle-Plains and Tech's West Texas museums, a new experiment station near Hereford to study water-logged land problems and birdweed eradication, and a much needed library for West Texas State College at Canyon, all received over-whelming majorities in the House of Representatives. However, Sen. Grady Hazelwood's numerous attempts to bring them up in the Senate were blocked by Cosqueas Sen. Jim Taylor's powerful Senate Finance Committee. The museum bill finally passed the Senate after all available funds had been appropriated.

Timmons-Hazelwood amendments to the Rural School Aid bill, however, gave Boys Ranch, Hereford Rural High, Sunny Hill and Fairview new State Aid.

Vega Voters Okay Two Bond Issues

VEGA, April 24—Voters of Vega Saturday approved two bond issues of \$40,000 each for municipal water works improvements. Both issues passed by an overwhelming majority. The program calls for construction of a 150,000 gallon reservoir, to supplement the present 50,000 gallon overhead storage tank, and laying of approximately 11,000 feet of new water lines, plus drilling of a new municipal water well and installing two automatic booster tanks. One of the \$40,000 bond issues, backed by tax assessments, carried by a vote of 117 to 14; and the other, also for \$40,000, and to be issued as revenue bonds, carried by a vote of 120 to 14. "There will be no increase in city taxes as a result of the bond issues," according to Vega's Mayor Bill Swanson. In addition to the water works program, Vega is now finishing a paving program. "We now have 38 and one-half blocks of hard surfaced or paved streets," Mayor Swanson said.
