**1947 Loan Cotton Will Be Pooled On August 1**

COLLEGE STATION, May 15—The U. S. Department of Agriculture announced today that all 1947-crop loan cotton, including American Egyptian, still under loan on August 1, 1948, will be pooled on that date by the Commodity Credit Corporation for producers accounts. The loans mature July 31, 1948. On March 26, 1948, loans were outstanding on nearly 170,000 bales of 1947 crop cotton from the 269,000 bales placed under loans to that date.

Producers may either sell their equity in the loan cotton or redeem the cotton from the loan and then sell it in the open market. Producers are urged to give serious consideration to marketing the loan cotton before it is placed in pools.

At present market prices, farmers should be able to dispose of most of this cotton at prices that will net them good profits above the loan and charges against the cotton.

The 1947 crop loan cotton not redeemed before August 1, 1948, will be placed in pools, as provided in the loan agreements, and sold in an orderly manner by Commodity Credit Corporation. On final liquidation of all cotton in the pools, the net proceeds, if any, after handling charges will be distributed among the producers whose cotton was placed in the pool, in proportion to the amount of the loans on the cotton placed in such pools. No payment will be made to producers at the time their cotton is placed in the pools, and after July 31, 1948, producers will not be entitled to order the sale of the cotton.

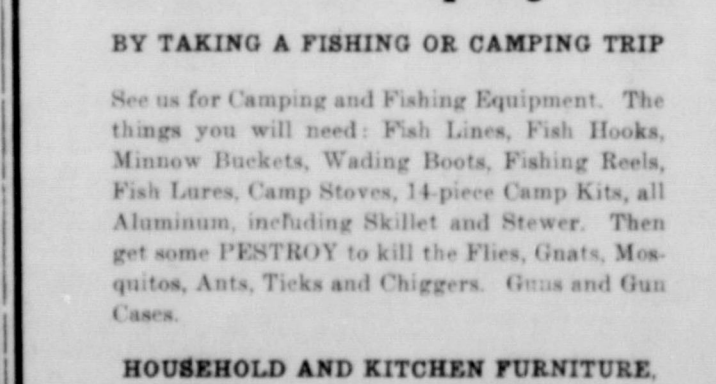

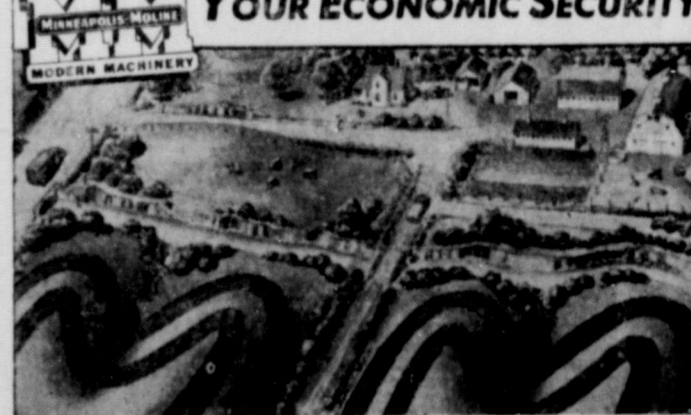

### Check Your Car And Check Wrecks Is Patrol Warning

"Check your car . . . check accidents" is the May slogan of a continuing program aimed at saving lives on the streets and highways of Texas.

"The brakes of your car can mean the difference between life and death," said Colonel Homer Garrison, Jr., Director of the Texas Department of Public Safety. "Lots of people realize that. But still it's deplorable how many motorists continue to drive with poor brakes. Other car parts, too, can be life savers. Lights, windshield wipers, tires, steering and wheel alignment, the muffler and exhaust system, the glass, rear-view mirror and horn, all are important to safety."

"The Texas Highway Patrol requests all motorists to keep their cars in safe operating condition as one means of preventing factors from traffic accidents. This project for May is part of the year-round Operation Safety program for traffic safety. The continuing effort is part of a nation-wide traffic safety education promotion of the National Safety Council," said W. J. Elliot, Chief.

"Your life and the lives of others may depend on whether or not your car is kept in safe operating condition." Captain Polk Ivy of the Amarillo District Office of the Texas Highway Patrol said. Vehicle defects were contributing factors in hundreds of fatal traffic accidents, according to accident reports. Yet this figure does not tell the whole story. Information on vehicle condition is available in less than half of all reported fatal cases.

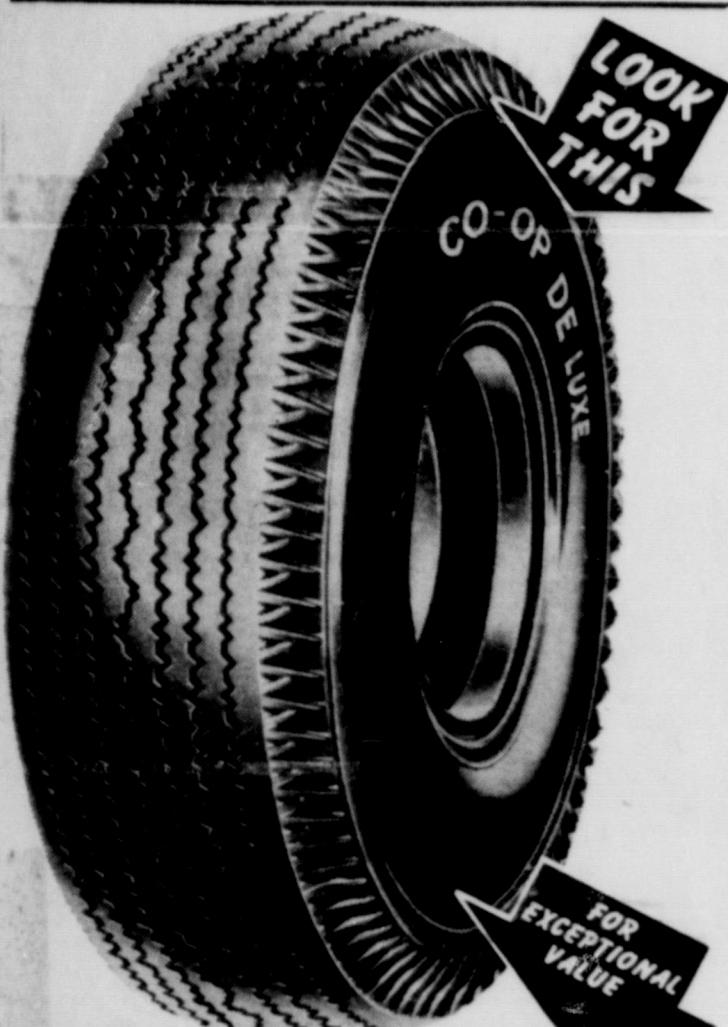

Texas Technological college is scheduled to open June 9 for six weeks. D. O. Wiley, director of the summer band session and conductor of the concert band, announces.

The teaching staff of 10 musicians will include guest artists Dr. A. A. Harding, director of the University of Illinois Bands; R. A. Dhosche, director of Vocation and Technical High School band, San Antonio; and Michael Belnemones, formerly of the Berlin State Opera orchestra.

Dr. Julian Paul Blitt, head of the college department of music, Wiley and Joe L. Haddon, a member of the faculty and specialist in trombone and baritone, are to be members of the summer faculty also. Visiting instructors will include N. G. Patrick, bassoon; John James Haynie, cornet; Frank Herring, French horn; and Charles A. Wiley, oboe and saxophone.

Enlarged facilities make it possible for the college to accommodate the largest band school in the history of the summer clinic. Also additional dormitory space will provide campus dormitory housing for pre-college boys and girls separate from college students.

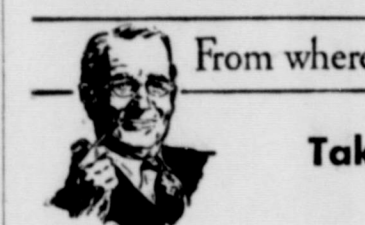

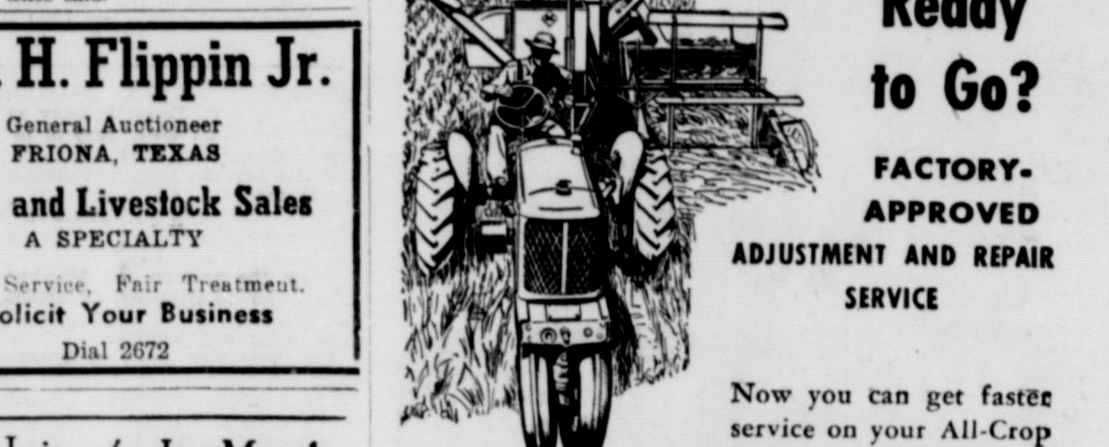
