## Work to Begin on Highway

The first section of the new highway through Terrell county, consisting of 13 and a fraction miles, has been approved and on last Monday the commissioner's court ordered that advertisements for bids for building this 13 miles of the highway be put in different newspapers, and June 20th was set as the day on which the bids are to be opened and award made. As soon as the contract is let construction work will begin, so in a few weeks now men with implements and material will be busy on the west end of the highway. This first section of the road extends from the western boundary of Terrell county to a point slightly east of the town of Sanderson, and is a fraction over 13 miles in length.

Bids for construction work on other sections of the highway will be advertised as soon as plans are approved.

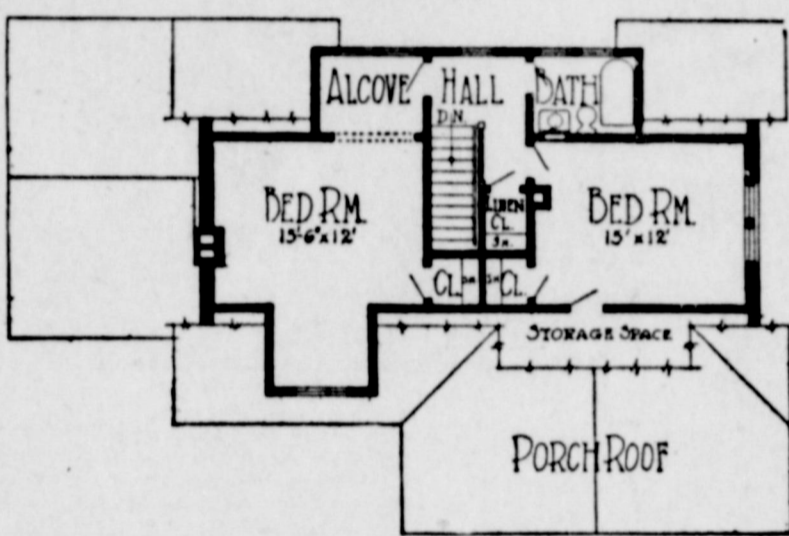
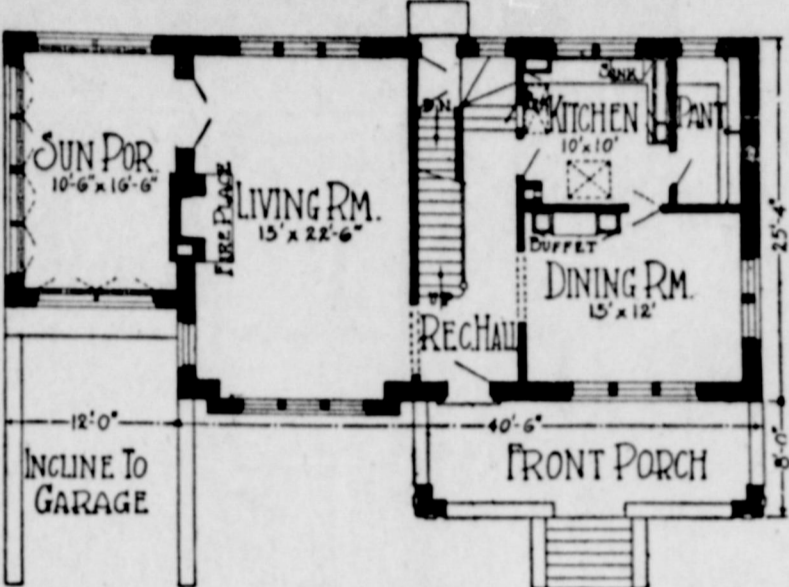

HOME AND GARAGE IN COMBINATION

Arrangement That Has Attractions for Owner of Car.

HOUSE IS SENSIBLE DESIGN

Five-Room Residence of Brick Utilizes Latest Style of Garage as Integral With House—Sited for Corner Lot.

This illustrates a combination which is becoming increasingly popular with home-owners. The garage is attached to the house proper and in such a way as to be inconspicuous, yet amplify the general plan of the house.

Naturally extra precaution is necessary. The fire hazard is increased when the garage is made integral with the dwelling, but with many modern forms of fireproof and safe construction to choose from there need be no difficulty on that score.

The porch proper is very roomy and it gives into a reception hall and thence into the dining room and living room. The latter is a nicely balanced room, 15 feet by 22 feet 6 inches.

Our second floor has two bedrooms and a bath, with excellent clothes and linen closet space, storage space, and an alcove off the larger bedroom which could be utilized as a sleeping porch in mild weather.

It is undeniable that much of the attractiveness of this type of a house comes from having its grounds properly landscaped, to take away from it any appearance of stiffness.

Observe that a shelf below the front windows is suitable for flower boxes, and also that the wide porch coping also lends itself to treatment in this respect.

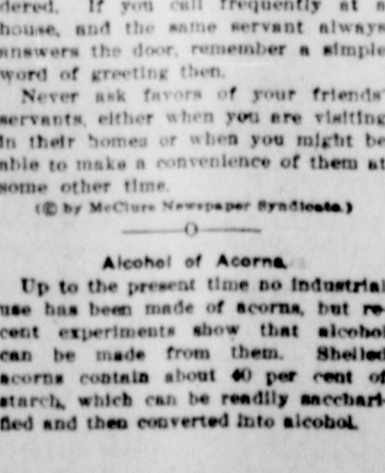

RAIN BENEFITS COTTON IN TEXAS

Condition in Texas More Favorable Than in Many Other States, Says Report.

Washington.—Conditions during the week, ending May 29, generally were too wet or too cool for growing crops in the South and Southeast, according to the weekly weather and crop review of the department of agriculture made public Saturday.
It was generally all and decidedly too wet in the Southeastern States, except in parts of the Carolinas, while sunshine was deficient and the nights too cool during part of the weeks for warm weather crops.
Conditions varied in the trans-Mississippi States. It was generally warm and sunny in Texas, with beneficial showers at many points, and was generally favorable for field work and crop growth.
Conditions were decidedly unfavorable, however, in Oklahoma and much of Arkansas.
