Maryland Farm Gets Blitz Rehabilitation Service



Over 500 volunteers worked for one day at the farm of Mrs. Nellie Thrasher near Frederick, Md., and when they were finished the farm had doubled in value—a project which would have taken five years normally. While 30,000 people watched, the men built a 22-cow dairy barn, dug drainage ditches, built roads and ponds, remodeled the farmhouse, fixed the trees, terraced and fertilized the fields and repaired fences. The work was sponsored by civic and farm organizations as the super-event of "Maryland Conservation Field Day." ## How To Make Iced Coffee

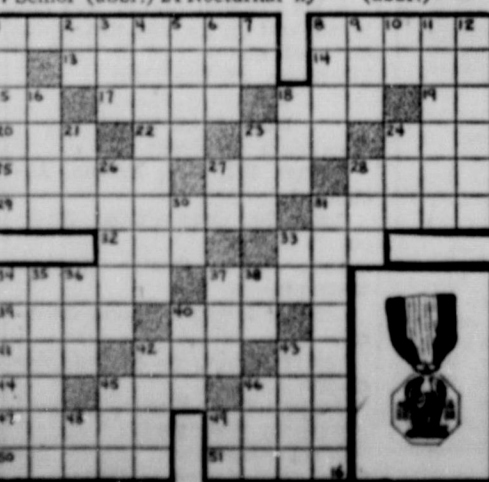

**THE BRIDE COOKS DINNER**

Avocado and Celery Cocktail with French Dressing  
Shrimp with Fresh Tomatoes\*  
Hot Cooked Rice  
Crispy Rolls and Butter  
Frozen Fruit Salad  
Beverage

(Recipe for Starred Dish Follows)  
**SHRIMP WITH FRESH TOMATOES (For Two)**

Ingredients: 1/2 pound fresh jumbo shrimp (about a dozen), 1 tablespoon butter or margarine, 1/4 cup finely diced onion (1 small), 1/4 cup finely diced green pepper, 1-3 large green pepper, 1 clove garlic, 3 medium-sized ripe tomatoes (1/2 pound), 1 teaspoon salt, 1 bay leaf, freshly ground pepper, red pepper, 2 tablespoons cooking sherry (if desired).

Method: Wash shrimps under running water, peel off shells. With small pointed knife cut each one lightly along back and, holding under running water, remove each black vein with fingers or knife. Drain shrimps in colander. Melt butter or margarine in 8-inch skillet over low heat; add onion and green pepper. Mince or crush the peeled garlic and add to skillet. The onion, pepper and garlic should cook until partly tender, about 5 to 7 minutes. In the meantime peel the tomatoes and cut each one into eighths; add to skillet with salt, bay leaf, a little freshly-ground pepper and a dash of red pepper. Cover, increase heat slightly and simmer, stirring frequently. Slice the shrimp lengthwise and when tomatoes have cooked for about 10 minutes add shrimp. Keep covered and simmer for about 5 minutes, until shrimp is cooked through. Remove from heat, take out bay leaf, add cooking sherry (if used) and stir well. Serve immediately over hot cooked rice. (You will need to cook 1/2 cup raw rice to accompany this dish for two.)

**MONDAY DINNER**

Jumbo Hamburgers with Raw Onion Rings  
Fluffy Mashed Potatoes

Fresh Peach Sundae\*

(Recipe for Starred Dish Follows)  
A famous chain of restaurants makes the best of peach sundaes and I've noticed that their secret is to crush some of the fruit and slice the rest. You'll find I've done this in the following recipe, and I've added lemon juice to keep the peach slices from discoloring. The touch of lemon rind suggested gives a piquant flavor, along with the vanilla, that you may like.

**FRESH PEACH SUNDAE**

Ingredients: 4 medium-sized ripe peaches (1 pound), 2 tablespoons sugar, 1/4 teaspoon vanilla, 1/4 lemon (rind or juice), 1 pint vanilla ice cream.  
Method: Peel two of the peaches, slice and cut into shallow bowl. Crush well with potato masher or fork. Add the sugar, vanilla and lemon rind and mix well. Peel remaining two peaches, slice lengthwise and slice thinly over crushed fruit. Squeeze lemon juice over slices and mix all together well. Let stand in refrigerator while dinner is being served. Pile vanilla ice cream into 4 serving dishes and surround with peach sauce. Makes 4 servings.

**TUESDAY DINNER**

Broiled Chicken  
Mashed Potatoes

(Recipe for Starred Dish Follows)  
**MOLDED ORANGE AND BANANA WHIP**

Ingredients: 1 tablespoon (1 envelope) unflavored gelatin, 1/2 cup cold water, 1 teaspoon finely grated orange rind, 1/2 cup very hot water, 1 cup strained orange juice, 1/2 cup strained lemon juice, 1/4 cup sugar, 1 tablespoon cooking sherry (if desired), 1 large fully-ripe banana.

Method: Pour the cold water into a medium-sized mixing bowl, sprinkle gelatin over the surface and allow to stand a few minutes so gelatin will absorb water and swell. Add the hot water and orange rind and stir to dissolve gelatin well. Add orange juice, lemon juice, sugar, and cooking sherry (if used) and stir to dissolve sugar thoroughly. Put in refrigerator to chill and when consistency of egg white, whip well with rotary egg beater or electric mixer. Turn into 6 sherbert glasses or small glass serving dishes. Peel banana and score or flute with the sharp tines of a fork drawn down the length of the fruit; slice thinly and float a few slices on top of each serving of the whip. Put in refrigerator to set. Serve in glasses in which desserts were molded. Makes 6 servings.

Note: If oranges are quite sweet use 1-2 to 1-3 cup of sugar.

Finals in the 1948 State 4-H Club Girl's Dress Revue featuring 98 of Texas' prattiest and most accomplished girls, will take place Saturday, Oct. 16, at the Hall of State at the 1948 State Fair of Texas, James A. Easton, Rural Youth Day committee chairman, has announced.

The 98 finalists will be selected from among 5,216 contestants in 126 county dress revues to be held prior to the State Fair. Judging will be in three classes—wool garments, school or sport dresses, and dresses or ensembles for special wear.

The state winner will receive a trip to Chicago for the National 4-H Club Congress in November, where she will represent Texas in the national dress revue.

A total of 22 girls will be selected as winners at the State Fair. Winners will receive prizes of electric irons, electric sewing machines and savings bonds. Judges at the State Fair will be Margaret Brumby, extension clothing specialist of the University of Louisiana; Mattie Walker, head of John Tarleton College home economics department, and Iris Davenport, women's editor of Southern Agriculturalist.

Dresses in the contest will be scored at Texas A & M College for workmanship, selection of material and pattern by Mary Routh and Nona M. Roberson, clothing specialists of the Texas Extension Service.

CHICAGO—Accidents are the greatest killer of young people in the United States, far out-ranking any of the more generally feared childhood diseases.

According to the 1948 edition of "Accident Facts," statistical yearbook of the National Safety Council, accidents claimed five times as many lives in the 5-to-14 year age group in 1946 as heart disease, the second cause of death. And accidents killed six times as many children in that age group as pneumonia, the third place child-killer.

### Student Body Of TCU Expected To Be Largest Yet

FORT WORTH—The student body of Texas Christian University during the 1948-49 school year will be the largest in the school's history, it was predicted today by Registrar S. W. Hutton on the basis of students already registered and a continuing flow of applications for admittance.

With the opening of classes still three weeks away, 1594 students have already been admitted at a special "pre-registration" week Aug. 2 to 6, the first time students have been enabled to register before the opening of the fall term.

Total full-time day student enrollment is expected to reach approximately 4000. The 1594 students already registered equal 43 per cent of last year's student body—and this group includes no freshmen and relatively few upper-classmen from points other than Fort Worth, except those attending summer classes.

Veteran enrollment is similarly expected to increase, in contrast to many colleges reporting smaller veteran attendance after last year's peak and in contrast to several special schools exclusively for veterans which have already closed. Pre-registration, subsistence applications and inquiries indicate a veteran enrollment at TCU in excess of 2300, according to the TCU Veterans Administration Office.

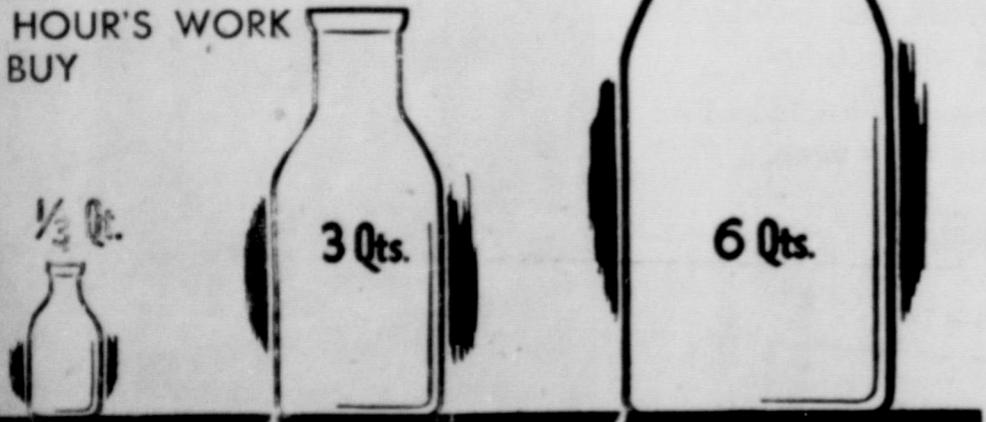

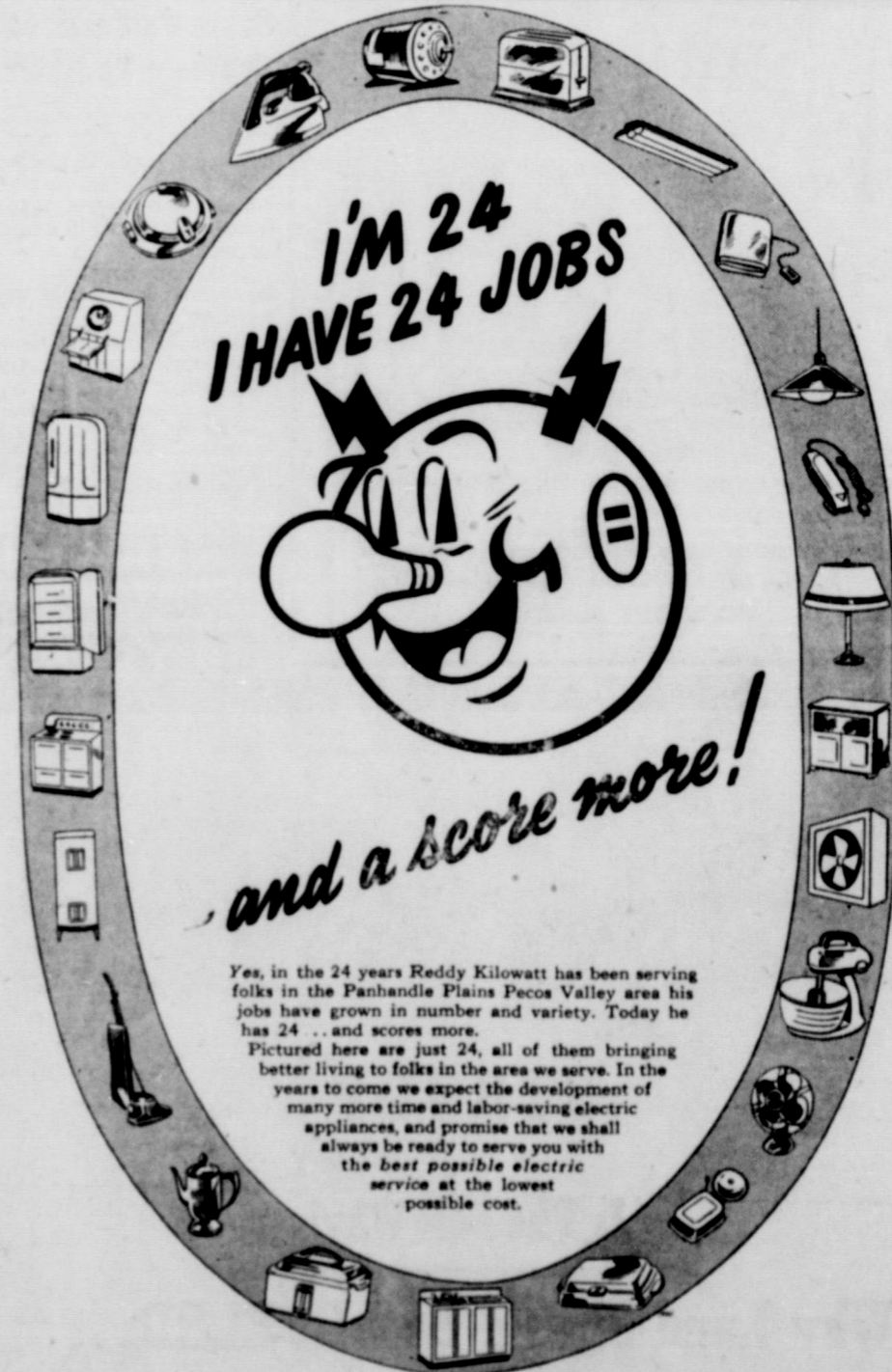
