MORE INDUSTRIES FOR STATE URGED

U. S. Senator Writes Budget Chief Asking Funds Be Given For Commercial Survey.

Austin, Tex.-Gen. Herbert M. Lord, director bureau of the budget, was Saturday urged in a letter from United States Senator Earle B. Mayfield to reconsider his former action and "to allocate to the bureau of foreign and domestic commerce a sufficient amount of money that will permit it to make a commercial survey of the Texas-Oklahoma territory."




