The Sanderson Volunteer Firemen planned a turkey shoot for Sunday, November 13 at their neeting Monady night. The turkey shoot is an annual affair for raising funds for the department.

Turkeys have already been contracted and are of a size worthy of the efforts of local marksmen.

The rifle range will be 100 yards as usual with the turkey's head as the target.

There will also be competitive shooting with .22-calibre rifles at a close range at paper targets. A turkey will go to the high score shooter and \$10 will be charged for each round of contestants. The contestants at this range will put up their proportionate share of \$10 for entry and this contest is open to all entries with a limit on period. the number of wins possible for any one person to two turkeys. There will be ladies' and men's

separate contests as well as any matched shoot.

Pistol targets will be fired at late in the afternoon.

An added feature this year will the gift of \$35.00 worth of groceries as an attendance prize. Each person shooting on the 100-hand range is eligible and the winner of the prize must be present to claim his reward. The groceries will be given away at 5 o'clock.

Each shooter is requetsed to make arrangements for his owr gun and ammunition before the shoot as the price charged by the firemen to shoot does not include the gun or ammunition.

As always in the past, every effor will be made ti see that con testants observe every safety precaution in the handling of the fire arms. Parents are asked to please keep their children well back of the firing line and not under the elbows of the shooters or at the

Businesses may show their injuries due to the drouth conditions in the form of comparative operataccounts receivable, a decline in sales volume because of the drouth or similar information.

Loans may be for a term of 10 years, and the proceeds must be, for the most part, confined to working capital. However, refinancing of indebtedness (except bank loans) on which delinquencies are directly attributable to the drouth, is permissible, according to the information Congressman Rutherford received from SBA

SBA officials said no drouth disaster business loans will be made for the expansion of facilities, and that the collateral requirements are the same as for other types of disaster loans. Neither will loans be made available when credit is therwise available or to any business estabished during a drouth

SBA officials said no drouth disaster business loans will be made for the expansion of facilities, and collateral requirements Rutherford received from SBA authorities

The authorities told Rutherford farmers and stockmen are not eligible for drouth disaster business oans. They should apply to the Farmers Home Administration for ssistance, just as in the past.

Wendell Barnes, Administrator f SBA, said that banks in the crouth area have been urged to participate in the program. Barnes pointed out that the loan applications should not be made to Congressmen or other public officials, but to local banks participating in the program or directly to the Small Business Administration.

U.S.90 now runs from Jackson ville Fla. to Van Horn, Texas or its eastern section is known as he Atlantic Gulf and Pacific Association. The highway links such cities as New Orleans Mobile Houston and San Antonio, Texas itizens have been seeking the extension to the West Coast since 1946

Koch explained that the approv-I of the highway commissions in I states on the proposed route is ecessaryy, and that when these are secured, the proposal can ge o the numbering committee of the Association of State Highway of ficials, which meets in New Orcans in December. Commissions in Arizona and Texas have already approved the extension, and approval is being sought in New Mexico and California.






