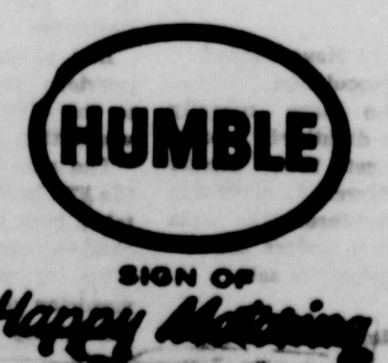

TELEPHONE TALK

HOSPITAL CARE BY TELEPHONE

Each day a number of interesting or unusual communications problems crosses my desk. While this one didn't happen here in Sanderson, I think you'll find it interesting, too.

The day after Thanksgiving, a young mother was hospitalized. She needed medication and complete rest. Everything went well until she began to miss her three little girls who were too young to visit her in the hospital. To make matters worse, she worried about not being able to do her Christmas shopping.

When the nurses discovered what was troubling her, they had a quick remedy. A phone was placed next to her bed. She talked with her children every day . . . and, what's more, did all of her Christmas shopping by telephone. It's stories and services like this that make it possible for us to advertise like this: "You name any communications need, Southwestern Bell has a service to meet it."

NOW HEAR THIS . . .

Remember this old phrase made famous by the Navy? It was used to gain attention of crew members in all parts of the ship when new orders or instructions were communicated. When answers were required, all the crew members had to do was "speak up."

Now the folks in Sanderson may have a similar communications system for the home. It's called the home Interphone and offers many advantages to save time and needless steps. For instance you can talk from room to room, call people to the phone, even answer the door without leaving the room you're in.

Near each phone in the home is a small speaker which broadcasts the caller's voice. The person called can answer through a small microphone located in the base of the phone.

If you'd like more information about the home interphone, just call the telephone business office — or ask any telephone service man.

Once in a while a child or a household pet will cause the receiver to be off the hook. When this happens the phone is automatically closed to all incoming calls.

To make sure there are no lost calls to your home, it's a good idea to occasionally check the phones in rooms where the children play.

We also are indebted to continue supporting the financial operations of our schools in an effort to pay that debt.

We feel that others should feel the same way about the education of their own children or the children of their friends and neighbors.

The taxes for school purposes asked of the ordinary citizen of Sanderson is a trivial amount in consideration of the good that it does for the younger generation.

What Is SALVATION?

(1 John 5:1) Example: Phillipian jailer asked, "WHAT MUST I DO TO BE SAVED?" "BELIEVE ON the Lord Jesus Christ and thou SHALT BE SAVED." (Acts 16:30-31).
3. Believing IN Christ brings the sinner INTO Christ. "For BY one Spirit are we all BAPTIZED INTO ONE BODY (Christ) and have been all MADE to drink into one Spirit." (1 Cor. 12:13). "For we are all the children of God BY FAITH IN Jesus Christ FOR AS MANY as have BEEN BAPTIZED INTO Christ (not in water) WERE BAPTIZED INTO His DEATH." (Gal. 3:26-27; Rom. 6:3-4; Eph. 1:6; Col. 2:12; Matt. 3:11). Entrance of Christ's Spirit INTO the BELIEVER brings salvation. "It is the Spirit that GIVES LIFE and QUICKENS the sinner who is DEAD IN trespasses and sins." (John 6:63; 2 Cor. 3:6; Eph. 2:18). Example: Simon Peter, preacher at Pentecost said to Cornelius and his friends, "To Him gave ALL the prophets witness that THROUGH His Name WHOSEVER BELIEVES IN HIM SHALL RECEIVE REMISSION OF sins, WHILE Peter YET SPAKE these words, the Holy Spirit FELL ON all them which heard the word." (Acts 10:43-44) "For as much then as God GAVE them the LIKE GIFTS AS He did unto us, WHO BELIEVED ON the Lord Jesus Christ, THEN has God ALSO to the Gentiles GRANTED REPENTANCE UNTO LIFE." (Acts 11:17-18)
4. Believers IN Jesus Christ are SAVED BY GRACE Through FAITH. (Eph. 2:8-10) "Therefore IT IS OF FAITH that IT might BE OF GRACE." (Rom. 4:16) "And if BY GRACE, then it is no more OF WORKS, otherwise GRACE is no more GRACE. But if IT BE OF WORKS, then is IT no more GRACE; otherwise work is no more WORK." (Rom. 11:6) "But BY THE GRACE OF God I AM WHAT I AM." (1 Cor. 15:10)
5. Believers IN Jesus Christ are saved WITHOUT WORKS. "THIS IS the WORK of God that you BELIEVE ON HIM whom He has SENT." (John 6:28-29) For by the WORKS of the law shall no flesh be justified." (Rom. 3:20; Gal. 2:16) "I will SHOW YOU MY FAITH BY MY WORKS" (James 2:18-24) Here WORKS JUSTIFY our FAITH BEFORE MEN and DECLARE us to be JUSTIFIED BEFORE MEN, who cannot SEE nor KNOW OUR FAITH but BY OUR WORKS. "God IMPUTES RIGHTEOUSNESS without works." (Rom. 4:5; 1 Tim. 1:9; Titus 3:5; Eph. 8:9; Rom. 5:1) No man can ever have any merit to claim which supplements the merit of Christ.
6. Believers IN Jesus Christ are SAVED UNTO good works. (Eph. 2:10) "For we ARE His Workmanship CREATED IN CHRIST Jesus unto good works." "SEE HOW faith wrought WITH his works." (James 2:22; Gal. 5:6) "BY their FRUITS you shall KNOW them." (Matt. 7:16, 20; Phil. 1:11) "That they may by your goodworks GLORIFY God." (1 Peter 2:12; Matt. 5:16; Col. 1:10; Heb. 13:24; 2 Tim. 3:17; Titus 2:14; 3:8) Your works or honest, upright walk of life has NOTHING to do with your salvation, but your salvation has EVERYTHING to do with your WORKS and WALK as a Christian who is saved by grace.
