He voted against it again when it was finally approved by Congress. If dollars had been spent sooner in Korea, the United States probably would not be spending the lives of our young men there today.

### FAILURE TO LOOK AFTER THE FARMER'S INTERESTS

The Pace Bill is designed to make the growing of cotton a monopoly of the worn out areas of the South at the expense of the 16th Congressional District. Ken Regan said he was against the Pace Bill. He voted to amend it, and lost. Then he switched around and helped to keep it alive by voting against sending it back to a committee.

### FAILURE TO SUPPORT A FAIR MINIMUM WAGE

Ken Regan voted against the 75-cent-an-hour minimum wage standard approved by the last Congress for employees of business concerns engaged in interstate commerce. Instead, he supported a Republican-sponsored compromise proposal designed to keep down the wage scale and to fill the law with loopholes. ### FAILURE TO FIGHT HIGH FREIGHT RATES

The Bulwinkle Bill, which was sponsored by the railroads, allows the railroads to fix freight rates with only the formal approval of the Interstate Commerce Commission. ### FAILURE TO PROVIDE FACILITIES FOR VETERANS


