WARNED ON CONDUCT

All fans are reminded that the strict state laws governing athletic events. Most important, and one will be strictly enforced, according to Sheriff H. E. Exkols, is against drinking of intoxicating beverages at such games. Officials have stated that they are asked the law enforcement agencies to pay particular attention to this.

Laws now in effect make a person responsible for the conduct of fans at events such as football games and should a crowd or fans become abusive and unruly, the school can be suspended from athletic competition.

Rankin's Red Devil football team will make their first home appearance here Friday night against the Stanton Buffaloes of Class A.

Following their 33-0 loss to Iraan last Friday night, the Red Devils are expected to make a somewhat better showing this week against the visitors due to the fact that they will have had an extra week's work in addition to the belief that the Buffalo team will lack some of the polish and experience that was displayed by the highly rated Iraan squad.

However, once again, the Red Devils will probably be rated as underdogs since they continue to be plagued with the flu bug that has kept a good part of the team on the sick list at one time or another. Too, Stanton will field a heavy team against the light Red Devils.

Stanton backs will average 151 pounds as compared to 143 for Rankin while their line will average 174 pounds per man as compared with 155 for the Devils. Nine seniors and seven juniors dot the Stanton line-up.

Game time will be at 8:00 p.m. at the Red Devil Stadium.

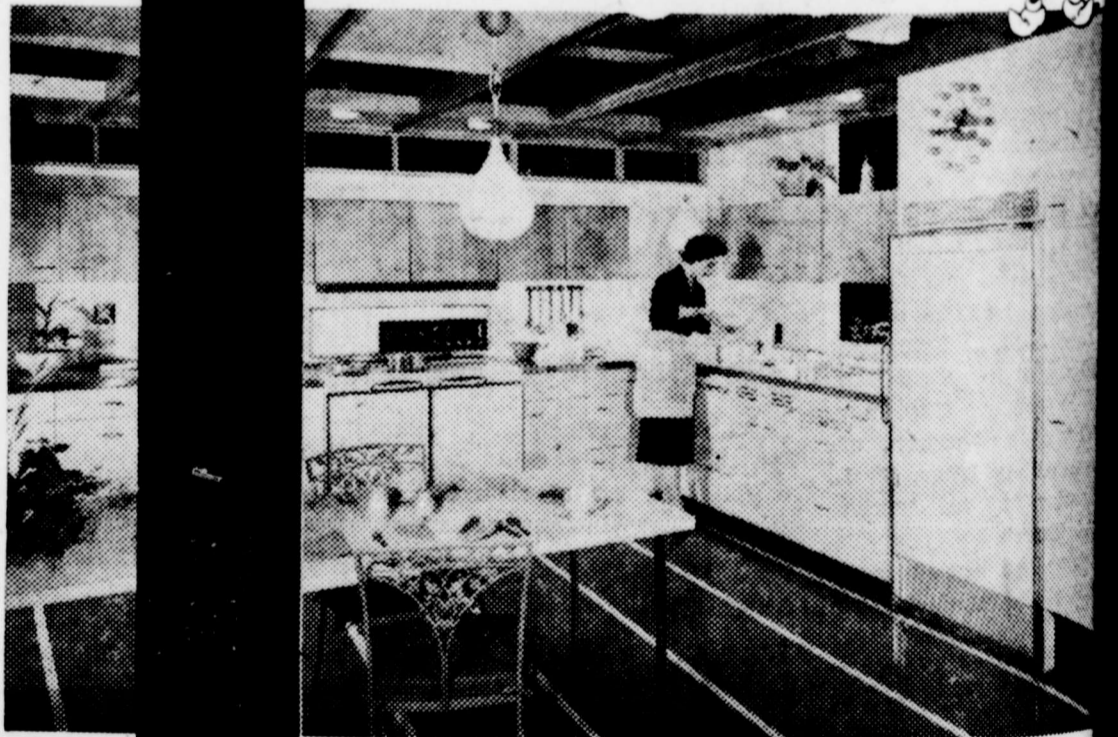

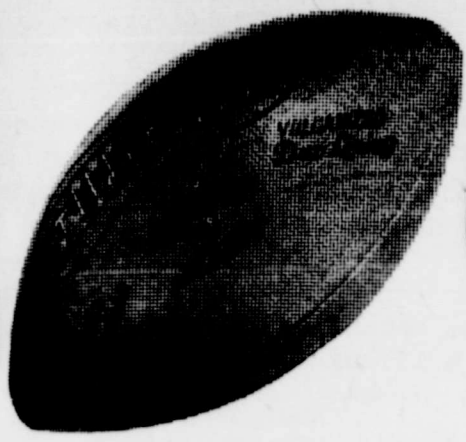
