

monstrations were the most popular. More than 26,000 girls conserved 1, 261,000 quarts of food; 38,528 made and re-made more than 150,000 garments; 29,436 prepared and served 1.855.000 meals, and 10,042 were inerested in home industry, arts and crafts. Gardening, poultry and home improvement demonstrations ranked next in number of girls enrolled.

The training of future leaders is an important part of the girls' 4-H club work, Miss Stevens says. More than 2,700 girls were trained to serve in positions of leadership in their clubs and communities, while more than 3000 training meetings were held over the state. On the fun side of the picture, there were 198 county and district 4-H girls' camps held during the summer months and more than 6,000 girls attended.

Through the encouragement and voluntary assistance of parenus, adult leaders older club girls, local school systems and civic organiza-tions, the 4-H club girls of Texas were able to accomplish outstanding results in 1947," Miss Stevens says. "They look forward to an even bet ter year in 1948."
