IN DEMOCRATIC PARTY VOTE --

PLACES DRAWN ON MAY PRIMARY BALLOT

HORSE RACE, DRINKS ALSO ON BALLOTS

Upton County voters will get a chance—along with the rest of their fellow Texans—to express themselves on the questions of legalized horse race betting in Texas and liquor by the drink. These two questions will be on both the Republican and Demo-

cratic Primary Ballots, to be voted May 4.

Being in the nature of a "straw vote", the balloting on these two matters will have no binding effect. However, the Texas legislature has often, in the past, been guided by these results in their law-making duties in the

state.

On last Monday, the Upton Democratic Executive Committee met at the courthouse in Rankin and a drawing for places on the ballot was held. In the ten-man race for Governor, a chap by the name of Alfonso "Al" Veloz of Harris County drew the top slot and Preston Smith of Lubbock

was last.

Incounty races, John Menefee heads the county attorney listing; while the commissioners in Precinct 1 are listed (1) Johnny Rankin, (2) H. Wheeler, (3) E. W. Love. In McCamey Commissioner Prec. 3, the listing is to be (1) Kenneth D. LaQuey, (2) Sam R. Selby, (3) E. K. Buford, and (4) Enoch Smith.

Absentee voting starts April 15 for the primary and closes April 30.

DISCOUNT SALES NEARS CLOSE ON S. A. FAIR BOOKS

Sale of discount ticket books to the HemisFair in San Antonio is nearing an end. After April 1 there will be no further offering of the advanced sales, according to the Fair people.

These books may be purchased at The News Office—as long as the remaining supply lasts—until March 28.

All sales are strictly cash. The books are offered in a price range of \$15.85 books for \$11.00; \$9.85 books for \$7.00, \$7.25 books for \$5.00, and \$4.50 books for \$3.

In addition to savings of up to 40 percent, holders of ticket books will not have to stand in line to make ticket purchases for admission, rides, entertainment, etc.

\$17000 for Licenses; What Did You Pay?

For those who felt that the minimum \$12.50 for car licenses for their "bugs", or the standards that run around \$20.00 was a little much—they can take heart that they don't have to register vehicles on the scale of Halliburton Services. opening membership with somewhat better reception, the newly formed Rankin Golf Club, Inc. met last Monday and put a limit on the

number of memberships to be taken.

"After all, it's just a nine hole golf course, our pool is being designed for 100 families and the club house can accommodate only

so many people, so there's not much point in having more members than can be handled," said a spokesman for the board.

Charter membership, those who will be accepted at a \$50 initiation fee, was set at 75. Another 25 members will be taken but the initiation fee will be \$100.00. After that, the membership will be closed.

Dues for all members will be \$10 per month.

In other action, the Board of Directors passed a resolution to the effect that after the 100 membership had been reached, a member may sell his membership, with the club having the first option.

All prospective members who have taken an application form have been asked to turn them in so that an accurate count can be taken. The \$50 initiation fee need not be paid all at once but may be "strung out" over a five month period. Dues will not become payable until the planned improvements are completed and the member begins using them.

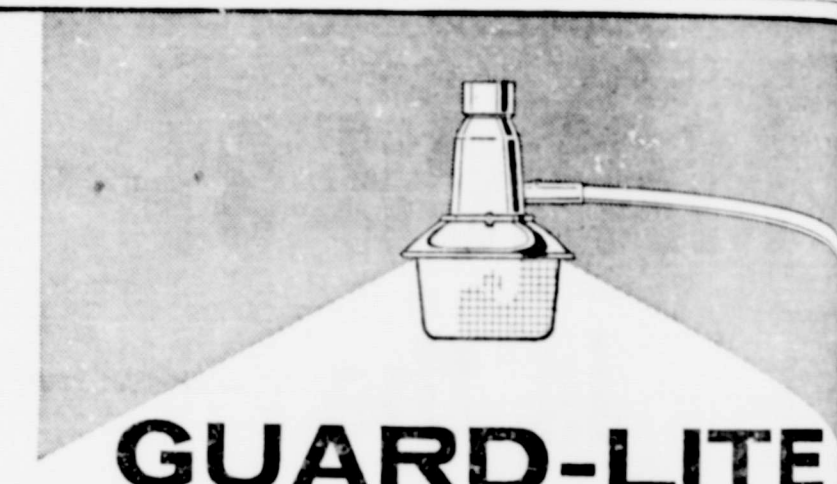

Buying Fertilizer --

Buying fertilizer for the lawn
 and garden need not be a task.
 Saving money may be important,
 but the economics of buying a
 few bags of fertilizer are not as
 important a buying quantities.
 However, you can save by avoid-
 ing small packages.

You may pay 10 to 20 times
 more for fertilizer in the one-
 pound size compared to an 80-
 pound bag. Farm-sized bags of
 80 pounds are not too much fer-
 tilizer for anyone with a vege-
 table garden, flower beds and a
 lawn.

All fertilizer containers must
 be properly labeled. This means

there is no excuse to be misin-
 formed about the merits of the
 product, although you may be
 misled by extravagant claims in
 words and pictures. Read the la-
 bel before you buy.

Don't be misled by claims of
 how many square feet a fertili-
 zer will cover. What counts is
 whether you are applying enough
 of the proper material to give
 your plants the nutrients they
 need.

Soil tests can be used to de-
 termine the kind and amounts of
 plant food needed for lawns and
 gardens as well as for field crops
 and pastures. Information on soil
 testing is available at my office.

**HINTS for the

Money Planning --

Realism is one of the key words
 in the vocabulary of planning for
 spending. A good plan can't make
 two dollars do the work of three,
 or reform a spendthrift, or al-
 ter readily a family's way of
 spending money. However, it
 can and should reflect the fami-
 ly's goals, needs and interests.
 And, of course, it should take
 into account past financial his-
 tory (for instance, debts to be
 paid off—and any benefits avail-
 able on the job—group life and
 health insurance, pension plans,
 social security, etc.)

Another key is "first things
 first." For every family there are
 fixed items, payments that have
 to be met—rent, heat, utilities,
