Report Published on Upton County Water from Survey Work

## ED

 D.: Several years ago, a water report on Upton County was began through the Commissioners Court, working with state and federal agencies. The report has now been completed and published in book form. The following news release is one received here this week concerning the report.Upton County's water supplies are obtained almost exclusively from wells, according to a ner Texas Water Development Board publication. The report, "Ground Water Resources of Upton County. Texas," was written by D. E. White of the U. S. Geological Survey. It was prepared by the Survey in cooperation with the Water Development Board and the Upton County Commissioners Court.
Large supplies of ground water were found stored in the Trinity Sand, the county's principal aquifer. About 8 million acre-feet is available to wells but its renewal is extremely slow. "Because of the low rate of recharge," the report concludes.
