

The pollinator seed will be planted in wo or four rows, the male sterile seed will be planted adjacent to pollinator seed in 6 or 8 rows. The six or eight rows will be harvested for seed to plant aas a hybrid seed n 1957. The pollinator seed will e harvested for grain only in 1956.
