Grabbing a 33 point margin over runner-up Dawson County and a healthy 107 point spread over Hockley County's 3rd placed shooters, the Cochran County 4-H Rifle team captured its second straight district championship Saturday as an entomology team won a third place for the only other county showing.

Coffman, rifle instructor, and assistant, Ralph Cadjew, tutored the team to a 434 total compared to 401 for the second placed team.

HALF WAY STATION GETS \$60,000 FROM P. C. G. for COTTON RESEARCH

Cotton research at the High Plains Station of the Texas Research Foundation was strengthened by a grant of \$60,000 for 1936 by the directors of the Plains Cotton Growers Incorporated by unanimous action at their meeting April 28th. Orville Bailey, Ropesville chairman of the Finance Committee for the P. C. G., presented the proposal. Frank Moore, Plainsview area Finance Chairman of the High Plains Station outlined the cotton research program, under irrigation, to be conducted at the High Plains Station.

The cotton research program supported by the grant include variety tests, fertilizer tests, time of planting, method and time of fertilizer application, frequency of irrigation and a study of Trace Elements as they affect production, grade and profit in cotton.

Fertilizer tests on cotton include: (1) different rates and ratios of nitrogen and phosphate; (2) time of application of nitrogen; (3) comparison of six common sources of phosphate; (4) comparison of different methods of application of phosphate; and (5) a study of the effects of magnesium and trace elements. In all these fertilizer tests emphasis will be on cotton quality as well as yield. Tissue analysis will be made on the cotton grown with different kinds and amounts of fertilizer to determine fertilizer uptake.

An irrigation test will also be conducted on cotton to study the effects of the amount and time of application of irrigation water on yield and quality of cotton. The efficiency of water usage by cotton will also be studied in an effort to find out where irrigation water should be applied to obtain the greatest net return from cotton.

Senator RALPH YARBOROUGH Writes from DC -

Relief to the old people of America is long overdue. The amounts paid them monthly are, in many states, so low as to constitute starvation payments and not subsistence payments. States have a duty in this regard as well as the federal government.

The bill which I am introducing now would add an additional \$5 of federal money per month for each elderly person receiving assistance grants by providing that the federal government pay sixth-sevenths of the first \$35 on the payment (\$30 out of \$35), with equal matching by the federal and state governments of the next \$30, up to a total of \$65.00 per person per month. This would raise the level of old age assistance on which the federal government participates from \$60 to \$65, and would allow \$5 per month to each person on the old age assistance rolls. The same increase is granted of the blind and to the totally and permanently disabled.

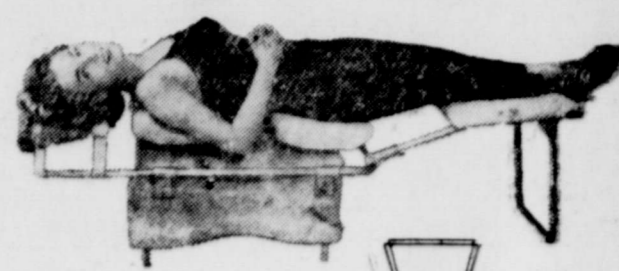

Curtis Chapman, Sr., was the adult leader and coach. He went with the team to Lubbock, and observed all the electric contests. Curtis said, "I picked up a good many things and I believe it will help me next year in training the electric team from Cochran County."
Well, the rifle team did it again. Yes, they came back with the blue ribbons, even though this team shot last, and were growing more nervous by the minute, when they came on the firing line all became quiet and the boys settled down for some first class shooting. My congratulations to the team & the coaches, Ken Coffman and Ralph Cadjev.
The entomology boys represented us pretty well by taking the white ribbons or third place in the district. These boys came back with a lot of enthusiasm and wanted to continue their training by holding another training meeting next Saturday morning, May 10. Each boy has promised to make his regular collection of insects, to get them identified by their common name, keep up their record book. A new set of slides will be purchased this year to give more intensive training in the identification phase of these 60 insects required on their test.
Again I commend the boys and coaches. The coaches were Don Avery and Bob Pierce. Don accompanied the boys to Lubbock last Saturday.
Mr. Coffman asked that all adults who want to shoot, report to the rifle range 5:00 p.m., Wednesday, both on May 7 and 14.

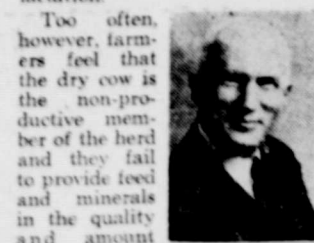

Good Care For The Dry Cow Pays In Future Production

A modern dairy cow has the maternal or sacrificial nature so highly developed that she spends herself at all costs and practically puts herself into the milk pail. In the drying-off and the dry period she needs good feed with special attention to salt and mineral needs to restore herself, in preparation for future calving and future lactation.

Too often, however, farmers feel that the dry cow is the non-productive member of the herd and they fail to provide feed and minerals in the quality and amount required by the animal. This is not good management.

Dr. E. B. Hart, of the University of Wisconsin, estimated that during a heavy lactation, cows lose as much as 25 per cent of the calcium and phosphorus of their skeleton. They even become subject to hip and leg fractures because of these mineral losses.

During the drying-off and the dry period the cow, for the first time since calving, are in a position to restore their necessary reserve nutrients. Not merely the visible reserves that show up as good condition of flesh, but also the invisible reserves, the minerals and vitamins that are stored in the skeletons, the liver, and other organs of the body. In addition to restoring her reserves during the dry period, the cow is meeting larger and larger nutrient demands of the growing fetus.

It is vital to make sure she receives the right kind and amount

of minerals. Dr. E. B. Meigs of the United States Department of Agriculture has demonstrated that an adequate supply of phosphorus during the dry period is rewarded with a better flow of milk during the following lactation. The opposite is true too—phosphorus deficiency during the dry period resulted in lowered milk production.

At the Ohio Experiment Station, Dr. E. B. Forbes showed that cows accumulate the vital calcium and phosphorus in their bodies most effectively only during the dry period and in the latter part of lactation.

Good management calls for care during the dry period. To restore the nutrient reserves she has put into the milk, she must have decent roughage, whether hay or silage or both. If her body condition requires it, don't hesitate to feed a few pounds of suitable grain mixture. Protein level of the mixture would depend on the kind and quality of the roughage fed. When limited amounts of grain are fed a mineral supplement mixture of one part trace mineralized salt and one or two parts of dicalcium phosphate or steamed bonemeal should provide the necessary minerals.

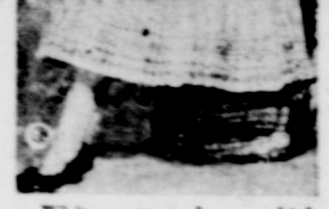
This attention to the feed and mineral needs of the dry cow will pay off in better calves and in better production throughout lactation.
