





The article dealt with a report my office issued on possible costcutting ideas for the state, including consolidation of small school districts. In our report we made it very clear that the Comptroller's office WAS NOT pushing any of the ideas.

Then I began to see several newspaper articles which said that the so-called working papers and names of the districts involved were "under lock and key" in our office. Nothing could be further from the truth.

Upon investigation, we learned that this "lock and key" stuff came from Mr. Morrow's publication. This article, we learned, was sent to an unknown number of superintendents with the suggestion that it be given to local newspapers. I don't know whether or not you received one.

Our records show that neither Mr. Morrow nor anyone else has asked for the so-called working papers. Had such been requested, they would have been released, right then and there.

The truth is that these so-called working papers consist of nothing more than a consolidation proposal sent in here a year ago by

Field events get underway at 11 a.m. Preliminaries in the running events get started at 11 a.m., with finals in the running events to start at 3:30 p.m.





in a fourth grade classroom at Webb Elementary. She taught there three years but took time out again when Jody was born in August of 1978.

Webb lost a kindergarten teacher in January 1980. Some shuffling was done and Janet returned to teaching--this time in the fifth grade.

Janet taught fifth grade two years, moved to the third grade for two years and came back to the fifth grade this year.

It's been fun, she says, to again have the students she taught two years ago. "It's been good to see how much they've learned...the progress they've made."

"I've got such a good group of kids," she says.

Janet teaches all fifth graders science. Her students move to Esther Graham's class for social studies and to Teresa Akin's class for health and P.E.

Fifth graders, she explains, get to begin science experiments. The weather this fall forced them to cancel plans for a nature walk so that they might study the seeding of various plants.

They did, though, plant different seeds in their classroom in their study of plants.

Janet finds it difficult to pinpoint her favorite grade level. She enjoys fifth grade particularly because those students can do more independent reading. She and fellow fifth grade teachers encourage students to read and are boosters of the library. "If you can get a student to read just one book that captures his (or her) interest, one they really enjoy, then they're 'hooked' and will enjoy reading," she says. Janet has a cousin who teaches school in Tennessee. Always especially close, the two last year came up with a pen pal project for their students. "She gathered the names and addresses of fifth grade students in her school and sent them to me. I did the same with our students,


The theme of this year's banquet, "Celebrate Friona," is unusually appropriate.




