

# **Building Airplanes Is A Hobby** For Active Friona Octogenarian

Lew Longmire is building an airplane in the garage at his house on Columbia Street in Friona.

At the age of 82, and after building 30-40 airplanes during his lifetime, Lew says this will be the last one. After visiting with him this week, I wouldn't count on it. The airplane he is working on now is 15 feet long, will have a 19 foot wing span and carry the light weight of only 400 pounds. He says it will cruise at 135-140 miles per hour. In the past, Lew has built two 2-seat airplanes and the rest have been single seaters. This one he says he will fly 25-30 hours of flight time, then fly it to Albuquerque (about 2 hours away) and turn it over to his son.



The street value was estimated at \$1,000 per pound, crediting Officer Herrera with a \$70,000 drug bust. The two subjects were arrested and booked into Parmer County jail on felony drug possession with intent to distribute charges. Chief Geries said that the city would likely confiscate the 1992 Surburban. The marijuana was sent to a DPS lab in Amarillo.

Howard said he is withdrawing from the race for personal reasons.





Fischer pointed out that if the rate request had been fully implemented, Energas' rates would continue to be below the state's average for natural gas.







# **Rites Held Sunday For** I. Stephens




To The Citizens of Parmer County:

I would like to take this opportunity to address the upcoming election for Parmer County Sheriff. As most of you know, I was raised in Farwell and have lived in Farwell for 28 of my 41 years. I have worked for the Parmer County Sheriff's Office for the past five years; the last 11/2 years as Sergeant and then as Chief Deputy, the position I currently hold.

Since his appointment and subsequent election, I have had the pleasure of working for Sheriff Walt Yerger. As you know, the most common crime in rural Parmer County is burglary. Over 90% of the burglaries in this county are a direct result of the drug problem that is increasing nation-wide. Sheriff Yerger, from the time he took office, has combated this problem by instituting aggressive night patrols in rural areas and communities, even with our limited manpower.

In addition, we have conducted numerous counter-drug operations, which have resulted to date in the seizure of 10 vehicles, 2 houses, numerous illegal weapons, and in excess of \$5,300 in cash.

From time to time, this has been very difficult: Officers' houses have been broken into in retaliation for arrests; threats have been made against

Thirteen percent of the population is over age 65, and this figure is projected to double as baby boomers approach their senior years. Most boomers will need help reading the newspaper as presbyopia enters the picture.


