AT A TIME WHEN the American economy is reeling, it seems to this writer that our leaders are missing an opportunity to help bolster the economy by acting to save the country's manufacturing industries.

In the last three or four decades, more attention was given to buying products made overseas, to stimulate the economy of second and third-world nations, at the expense and even loss of jobs and plants in our own country.

It has come to the point that you have to really shop in order to buy clothing that was produced in the U.S.A. More and more tags in the neck and waist of our garments are saying "Made in China, Japan, Mexico," or any number of other overseas markets.

With millions of Americans unemployed, I believe the time has come for the congress to take action to protect the interests of American plants of all descriptions.

Virtually every other country, even those with which we deal, has a hard and fast rule about not importing goods which will be a threat to whatever sector of the economy that the imported goods would adversely affect in their own country.

To a large extent, we blame labor unions for bringing down scores of plants and even entire industries in the U.S.

Even the movie industry is now deserting Hollywood and filming most movies abroad. Canada seems to be the biggest beneficiary of this current trend. We know this because our youngest son currently works in the field of film editing.

He has discovered that many film companies would just as soon take their entire business across the border, at the expense of American workers. Canada entices movie companies with low taxes and low production costs, but only allows the major stars and execs to work in the country. All the "underling" jobs are reserved for Canadian citizens, leaving a lot of well-trained film folks back home without any work.

Much of our food, especially produce, is now imported. Look at the tags on your local produce shelves. Much comes from Mexico and Central America. American companies have to maintain strict guidelines on everything they produce, which raises the farmers' production costs. What kind of guidelines are met by the foreign growers that we now support?

After World War II, America poured millions of dollars into the rebuilding of Japan, ravaged by the atomic bomb. Now, Japanese car companies have an unfair advantage competing with our American auto manufacturers because they pay their workers slave wages.

In order to offer much-needed jobs to Americans who are out of work, it behooves our government to do everything in its power to keep all kinds of plants open, from manufacturing to the food industry. If they don't, someday we will be importing everything we need. Who will determine the prices in our stores and markets when this happens? Three guesses.

A few years ago, the Free Trade Agreement was hailed as being the salvation of our American businesses, manufacturers, farmers and other trades. Seems like we're buying a lot more from Canada and Mexico, but I've seen no indication that our sales to these neighboring customers has kept pace with our imports.

Wal-Mart likes to advertise that they "buy American." Next time you're shopping at your favorite "Wally-World," check the labels in their clothing, and see if Wal-Mart really buys all of their merchandise from American plants, or if the large conglomerate just hit upon that idea because it sounds good in their commercials.

Friona & Lazbuddie Youngsters Take Championship Honors At Stock Show

The 56th Annual Parmer County Junior Livestock Show was held last week, January 22-25 at the Friona Community Center-Showbarn with FFA and 4-H youngsters from Friona, Farwell, Bovina and Lazbuddie competing for the top honors.

Judges for this year's show included: Billy Labrier, lambs and goats; Steve Kennedy, steers; and Dale Schaffner, barrows.

Mack Heald served as this year's overall show superintendent with JeDon Gallman as assistant superintendent. The Grand Champion Steer, exhibited by Brittany Berend of Friona, was purchased by ConAgra Beef Company. Lowe's-Friona bought the Grand Champion Lamb. Legends of the Game was the winning bidder on the Grand Champion Barrow and Farwell Buyer's Club was top bidder on the Grand Champion Goat.

Reserve Grand Champion animals were purchased by Parmer County Cattlemen, steer; Good Shepherds, lamb; Legends of the Game, barrow; and Lazbuddie Ag Boosters, goat.

Keith Hunt of Friona exhibited the 109 pound medium wool lamb that was named Breed Champion and Grand Champion. Suzanne Mason of Lazbuddie took Reserve Grand Champion honors with her 133 pound medium wool entry.

Other Breed Champions included: Hayes Jones of Friona, Finewool; Suzanne Mason of Lazbuddie, Finewool Cross; and Maegan Ingram of Friona, Southdown.

Reserve Breed Champions included: Hannah Carthel of Friona, Finewool; Caleb Monroe of Friona, Finewool Cross; and Jessie London of Friona, Southdown.

Lamb showmanship honors were presented as follows: seniors, Ty Williams and Steven Hunt, both of Friona; intermediates, Jordan Monroe and Molly Carthel, both of Friona; and juniors, Logan Mason of Lazbuddie and Tyler Cullison of Farwell.

The goat show followed the lamb judging. Matt Billingsley of Farwell presented the Grand Champion Goat. His 89 pound entry had won his class earlier in the show. The Reserve Grand Champion Goat was a 66 pound animal owned by Melanie Winders of Lazbuddie.

The 2003 Grand Champion Steer was exhibited by Brittany Berend of Friona, a 1265 pound Exotic Cross. The champion was followed by Jason Berend of Friona. His 1165 pound English steer received Reserve Grand Champion honors.

The Reserve Breed Champions were presented by Kayle Jesko of Lazbuddie, English; and Brittany Berend of Friona, Exotic Cross.

Steer showmanship honors were presented to seniors, R.J. Barrett of Friona and Cody Jamerson of Bovina; and juniors, Brittany Berend of Friona and Logan Mason of Lazbuddie.

The barrow show culminated the day's activities. Lazbuddie's Kayla Parham presented the Grand Champion Barrow. Her 235 pound Crossbred barrow was named Breed Champion earlier in the day. Farwell's Drew Johnson exhibited the Reserve Grand Champion Barrow, a 206 pound Hampshire, earlier named Breed Champion Hamp.

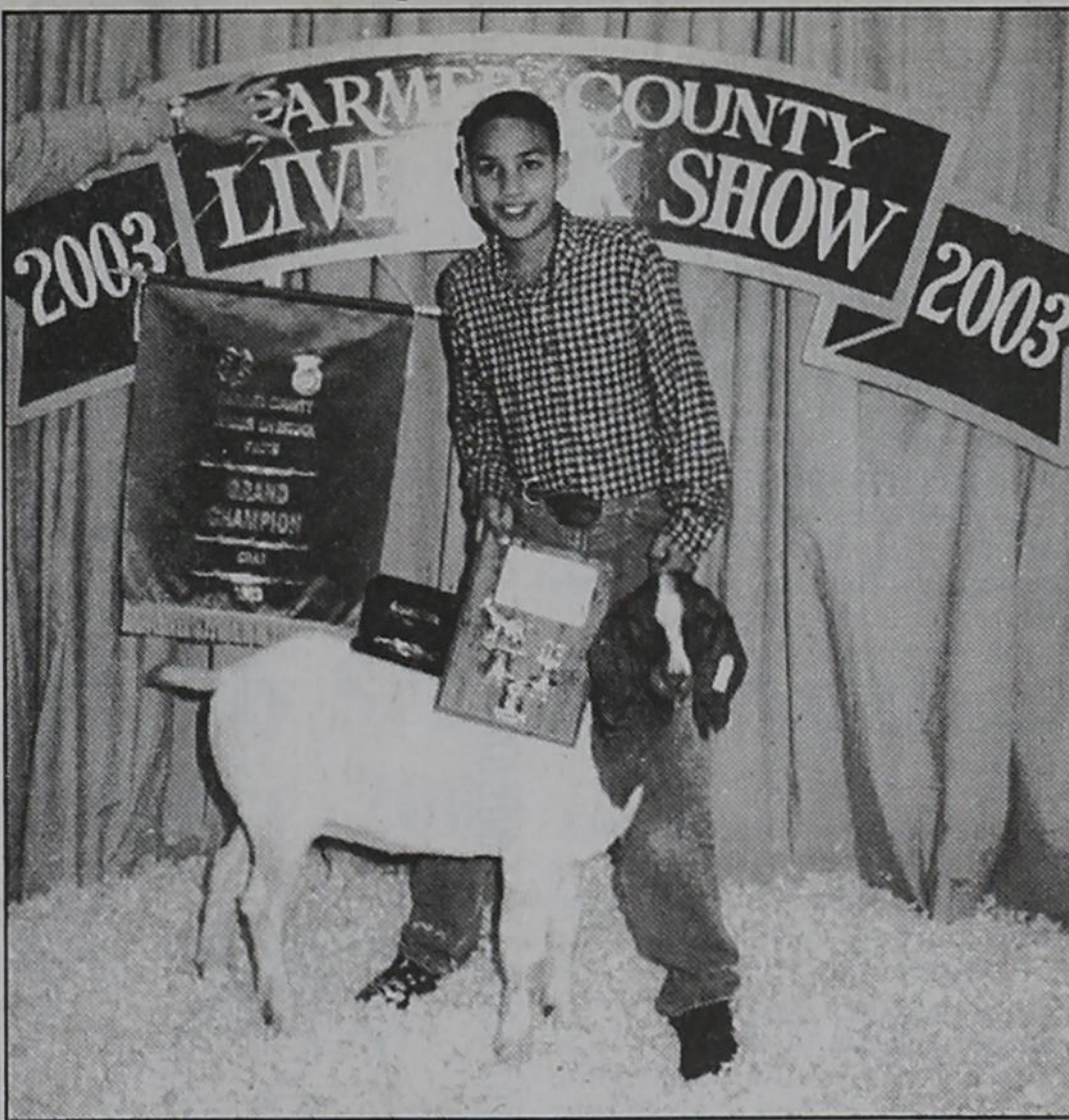

Other battalions will be activated to defend air bases in New Mexico and across the country. The war on terror caused many of the Air Force's security personnel to be shipped overseas.

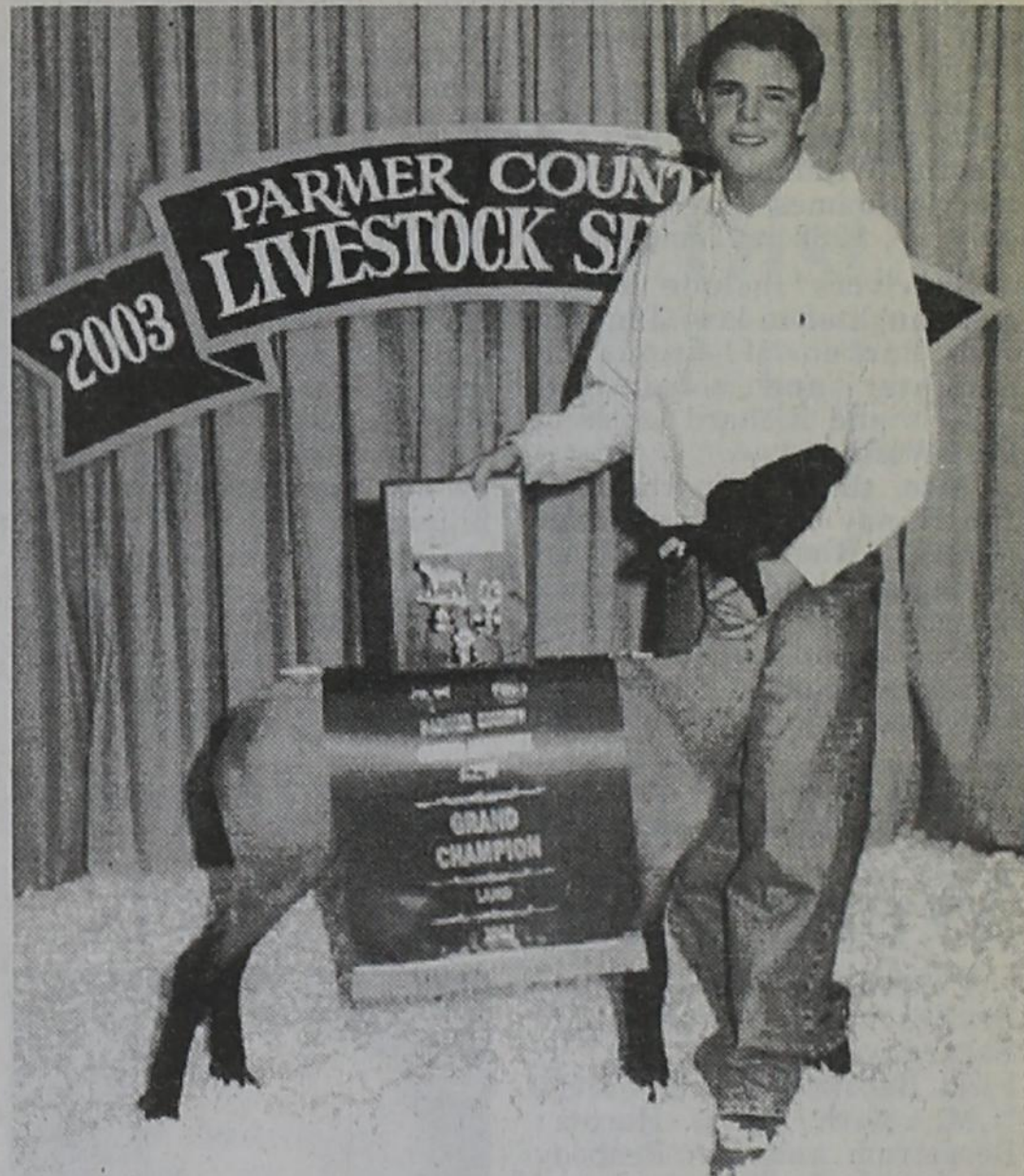
As a result, the Army National Guard is being utilized to provide security at 163 of the nation's Air Force bases in the U.S.

Burial was in Bovina Cemetery under the direction of Blackwell Funeral Home.

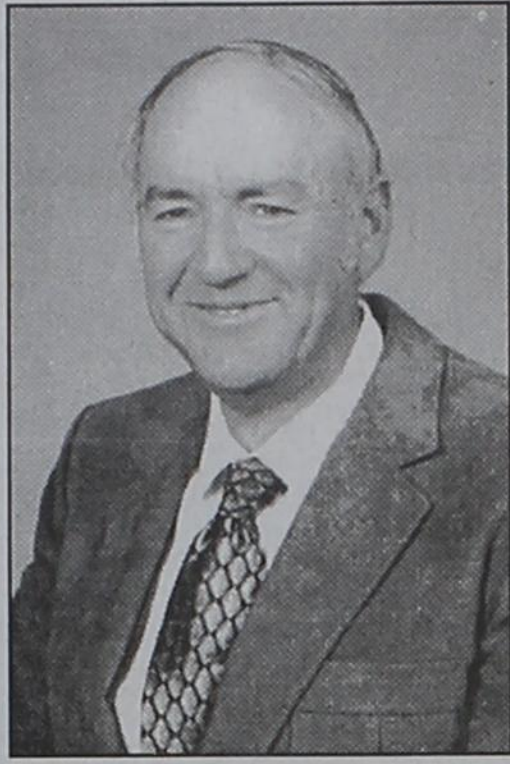
Garner died Friday, January 24, 2003 at BSA-West in Amarillo.

Friona Flashbacks

...from the files of The Friona Star

75 Yrs Ago - Feb. 3, 1928

Quite a number of our people representing the musical talent of our town journeyed to Amarillo Friday afternoon, where they broadcasted a musical program from Station WDAG. (Editor's note: This station was the forerunner of KGNC.) Among the number were Mr. and Mrs. T.J. Crawford and daughters, Mary Kathryn, Helen and Dorothy, Miss Virginia Lillard, Miss Harris, Prof. J.A. Conway, Prof. Armstrong and Miss McCary of the local faculty.

65 Yrs Ago - Feb. 4, 1938

"Smoky" Price reports that he has finally been prevailed upon to part with Artesia, a 11-gallon-a-day milk cow. Smoky has long claimed that she was the champion milk producing cow in this country, and as an indication of this claim, he narrates the fact that one time she fell into a large and deep well from which it looked impossible to lift her. Undismayed, Mr. Price descended into the well, attached a life-preserver to Artesia, and began milking her and soon had her safely floated to the top of the well and on solid ground again.

60 Yrs Ago - Jan. 31, 1943

In a low-scoring game Friday night, the Friona Squaws outscored the Lazbuddie girls, 13-7. High point player for Lazbuddie was Rink, with three points. The Squaws' high-point player was Massie with 11 points. McFarland also scored high for the Squaws; the Chiefs also downed the Lazbuddie Longhorns by a score of 33-25. High point man for Lazbuddie was Barnes with 10. Treider, Friona's star forward, had 17 points.

55 Yrs Ago - Jan. 30, 1948

Tim Magness, first saxophone player in the Friona Band, is the band's newly elected president and assistant director. Vice president and assistant directors are Betty Louise McLellan, trombonist, and Alta Mae Wilkins, French horn player. Secretary-treasurer and reporter is Joyce Ann Miller.

50 Yrs Ago - Jan. 29, 1953

The Friona diversified agriculture area has again scored a first with a potato processing plant under construction here this week. The facilities afforded by this shed will expedite potato growing locally, observers believe, ushering into the area a relatively new crop for this county, but one that has been successful in Deaf Smith County.

45 Yrs Ago - Jan. 30, 1958

David T. McReynolds joins the staff of The Friona Star next week in the Capacity of editor and advertising manager. He succeeds Leland Boyd, who is moving to Bovina to become publisher of the newspaper there.

About 30 were added to the temporary population of Friona this week. A construction crew that will lay about 23 miles of natural gas line moved into town, and more are to come, according to the foreman of the crew, L.L. Stewart of Pampa. The change will be made along the highway from Friona to six miles north of Muleshoe.

40 Yrs Ago - Jan. 31, 1963

Parmer County law enforcement officers apprehended a 20-year-old man Sunday in Muleshoe who confessed to nine break-ins in

Parmer County recently, the latest being at Lazbuddie Saturday night. Burton Fish, who has been living at Hub, was arrested in Muleshoe after attempting to cash in dimes which supposedly were taken from the Treider "66" Station in a break-in early Sunday morning. Fish admitted to the Treider break-in as well as one at Neel's Grocery at Hub, the West Hub Gin, and six break-ins in Bovina.

35 Yrs Ago - Feb. 1, 1968

Work has begun in the Western Addition on a 30-house project. Sides are already up on the first home, with preliminary work underway on two others. Charles Bates of Amarillo is the developer.

Robert E. (Gene) Frye, president of Missouri Beef Packers, was in Friona last week, and expressed pleasure at the progress of construction at MBP's Friona plant. "We're sticking with our April target date. I see no reason to change it at this point. Things are progressing nicely," Frye said.

30 Yrs Ago - Feb. 1, 1973

Around 10,000,000 pounds of cotton burs went up in smoke last weekend at Paco Feed Yard near Hub. High winds compounded the job of extinguishing the burs, and in the end were responsible for the loss of most of the company's burr supply.

Rex Minshew and Sharon Smith were honored Basketball King and Queen at Friona High School in a presentation between games here last Friday. They are senior members of the Chieftain and Squaw teams.

25 Yrs Ago - Jan. 29, 1978

A late Tuesday snow-storm dumped 3.5 inches of snow in the area, bringing the first beneficial moisture for the winter season. The

snow was a might on the dry side, however, as the melt amounted to .05 inches.

20 Yrs Ago - Jan. 30, 1983

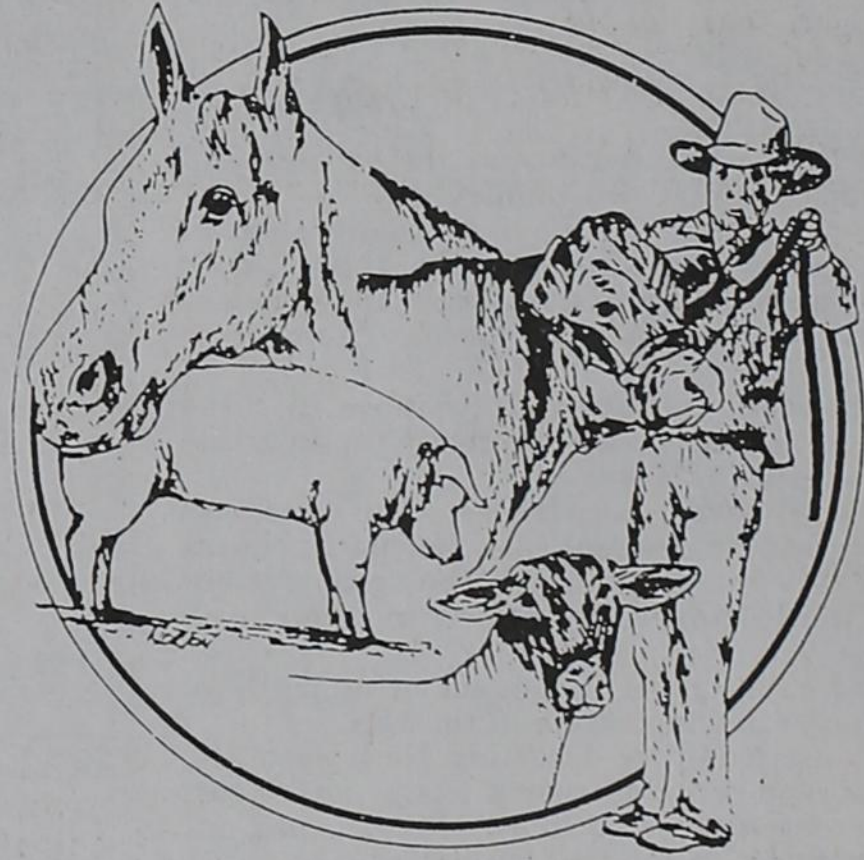

NOW PLAY FOR SEEDING

Squaws Gain Playoffs With Win Here Tues.

Although they started a bit on the tentative side, the Squaws finished with a flourish here Tuesday, downing Floydada, 55-40, and clinched a spot in the playoffs.

That scenario, combined with Olton's loss to Hale Center on Tuesday helped the team sew up a spot in post-season play.

Hale Center's win Tuesday helped salvage the disappointment of the Squaws' 54-52 overtime loss at Olton last Friday.

Friona shot considerably better in Tuesday's game here, hitting 24 of 42 shots from the field, 57 per cent, including six of 11 three-point shots, 55 per cent.

The only part of Friona's game that was sub-par was at the free throw line, where then hit only one of six, but that didn't matter much.

The Squaws started off a bit cold on Tuesday, falling behind 9-0 in the first quarter. However, Amy Murphree started hitting, and connected on three goals, one a three-pointer, getting Friona back to a 9-7 deficit.

Murphree slacked off in the second quarter, but Trisha Winebrinner made two three-point baskets in a row, plus a two-pointer, and Ashley Smiley nailed a pair from the field, and the Squaws took a 23-19 lead at the half.

Murphree started back with a bang in the third quarter, hitting two three-pointers and a pair from two-point range. VLesha Wilcox added a pair from the field, as Friona hiked its lead to 41-29.

Winebrinner sparked Friona's continued offensive attack with three baskets in the final quarter, and the Squaws nailed down their fifth district win and 15th for the season.

Murphree led the scoring with 21 and Winebrinner had 17.

The team's game at Olton was close all the way. Murphree hit five points in the first, and eight in the second, and the teams were

Friona tied, 11-all after one, and 23-all at the half.

Olton edged ahead in the third quarter, to take a 34-31 lead at the buzzer.

But Friona came back behind Murphree, Ashley Smiley and Winebrinner, to outscore the Lady Mustangs, 18-15 and force the O.T., when the teams were tied 49-all at the end of

regulation play.

Friona lost Murphree and Wilcox to fouls, and Olton's top scorer also fouled out. The 'Stangs went to the line six times in the OT, hitting three for the difference.

"We had our chances, but just couldn't get anything to fall. We sort of bailed them out with our fouls in the OT," said Coach North.

JV Squaws Win 2; Stand 7-1 In Dist.

Immunization Clinics Are Set For Feb.

Immunization clinics offering vaccines protecting against several childhood diseases are scheduled for February throughout several Panhandle communities.

Protection will be against polio, diphtheria, lock-jaw (tetanus), whooping cough (pertussis), measles, rubella, mumps, HIB (Haemophilus Influenzae Type B) and varicella (chicken pox).

All flu clinics are for high-risk individuals only, including people who are 65 years old or older, people with chronic illnesses, or people living with someone with a chronic illness. Costs are \$10 for flu vaccine and \$15 for pneumonia vaccine, for those without Medicare.

The Texas Department of Health is charging fees to help with the cost of keeping the clinic open. The amount of money charged will be based on family income and size, and the ability of the individual or family to pay, however, no one will be turned away if not able to pay.

The vaccinations will be administered at 616 Euclid in Friona, Friday, February 21, from 9:30-11:30 a.m. and 1-3:45 p.m.

Vaccinations will also be available at the Bovina EMS Building, Monday, February 10, from 10-11:45 a.m. and 1-3 p.m.

All times are subject to change or cancellation due to weather or scheduling conflicts.

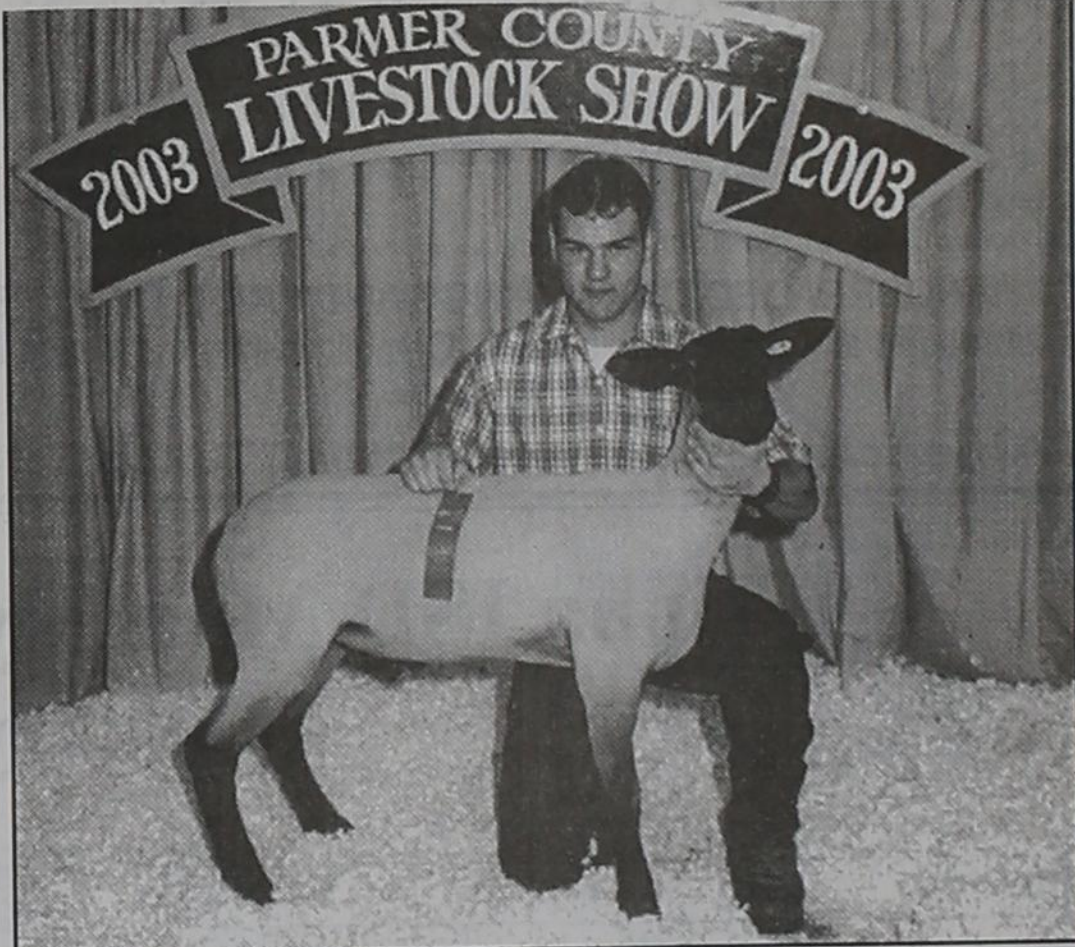

Rivas and Bandy led the scoring with ten points apiece.

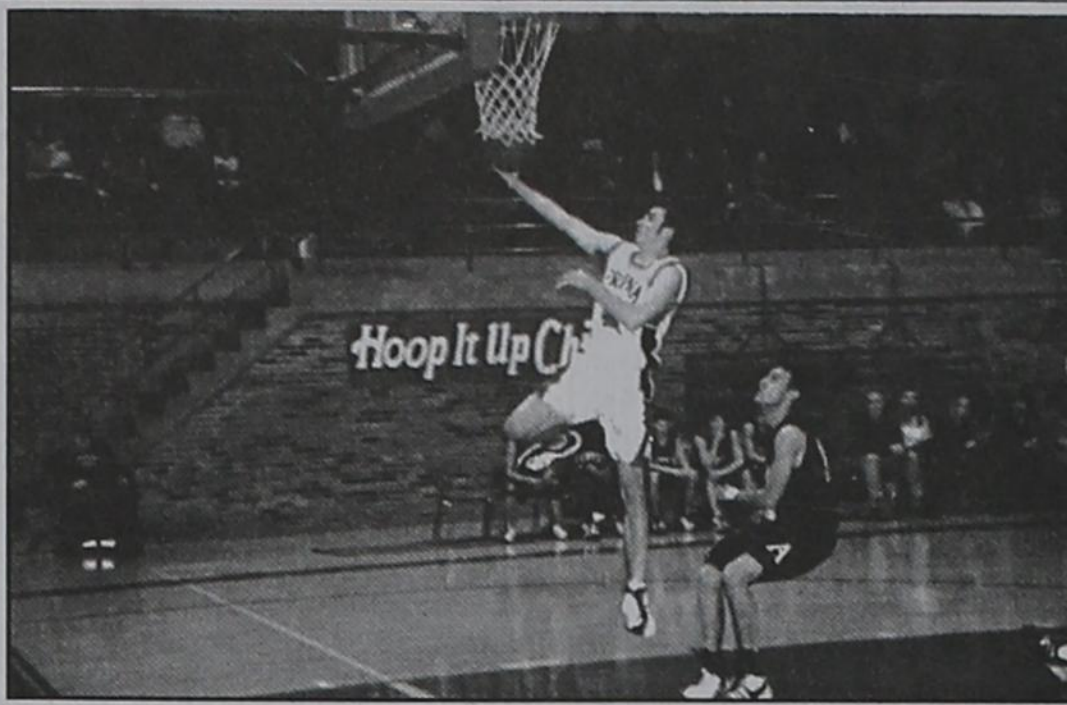

 ORDINANCE NO. 01-03
AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FRIONA, TEXAS, ADOPTING AND ENACTING A NEW CODE OF ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF CERTAIN ORDINANCES NOT INCLUDED THEREIN; PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR THE AMENDMENT OF SUCH CODE; AND PROVIDING WHEN SUCH CODE AND THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE.
 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FRIONA, TEXAS:

convicted of a general violation of any provision of the Code or any rule, ordinance, or police regulation of the City shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$2,000.00 for violations of all such rules, ordinances and police regulations that govern fire safety, zoning, or public health and sanitation, including dumping of refuse, and not exceeding \$500.00 for all other violations. Each act of violation and each day upon which any such violation shall occur shall constitute a separate offense. The penalty provided by this section, unless another penalty is expressly provided, shall apply to the amendment of any Code section, whether or not such penalty is reenacted in the amendatory ordinance. In addition to the penalty prescribed above, the City may pursue other remedies such as abatement of nuisances, injunctive relief and revocation of licenses or permits.
 Section 5. Additions or amendments to the Code when passed in such form as to indicate the intention of the City Council to make same a part of the Code shall be deemed to be incorporated into the Code, so that reference to the Code includes the additions and amendments.
 Section 6. Ordinances adopted after September 16, 2002, that amend or refer to ordinances that have been codified in the Code shall be construed as if they amend or refer to like provisions of the Code.
 Section 7. This ordinance and the Code adopted hereby shall become effective upon final passage of this ordinance.
 Section 1. That the Code of Ordinances of the City of Friona, Texas, consisting of Chapters 1 through 14, each inclusive, and Appendices, is hereby adopted and enacted which shall supersede all other general and permanent ordinances of the City passed on or before September 16, 2002.
 Section 2. All ordinances of a general and permanent nature enacted on or before September 16, 2002, and not included in the Code or recognized and continued in force by reference therein, are repealed.
 Section 3. The repeal provided for in Section 2 hereof shall not be construed to revive any ordinance or part thereof that has been repealed by a subsequent ordinance that is repealed by this ordinance.

YOUR EYES

Sterilize Your Contacts Case

Eye-care specialists always emphasize the importance of sterilizing contacts before use. Recent studies show that another aspect of cleaning is just as critical--the lens storage case. Even after sterilization, contact lenses may leave a residue called "acanthamoeba" in the eye case.

These protozoans, plentiful in soil, water and air, can affix themselves to the contacts and cause a potentially serious eye infection. Contact wearers can protect themselves from eye disease by disinfecting their contacts cases as well as their lenses.

One study tested three different types of lens solutions. It found that two cleansers, a multi-purpose solution and a one-step hydrogen peroxide solution, did not totally eliminate the cysts or the dormant form of the acanthamoeba on the contacts.

Contact wearers should disinfect their eye cases once a month by placing them in boiling water for ten minutes or microwaving them for several minutes. In addition, lens users should replace their cases regularly.

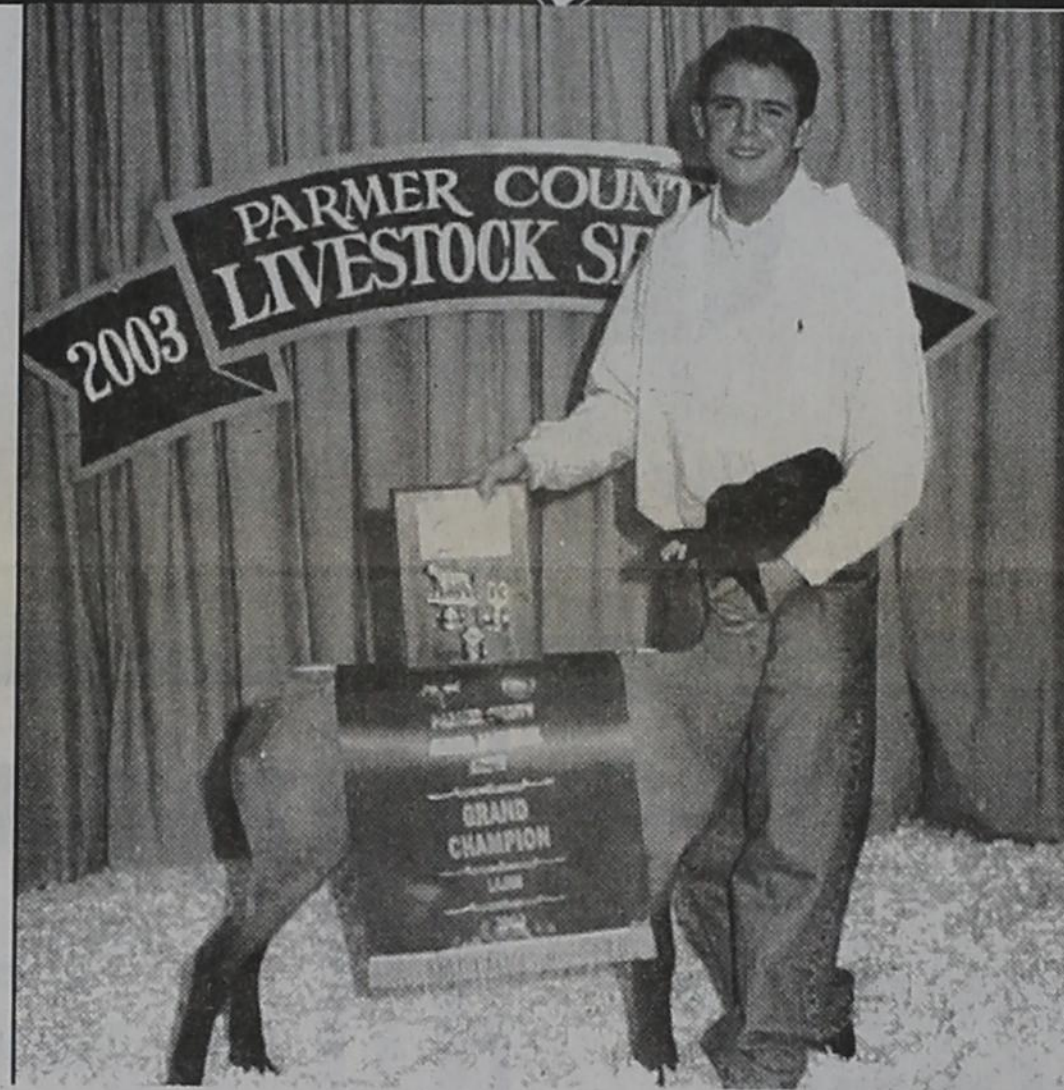
